Chiefs and Sheriffs,

The Oregon State Police has launched a project to comply with the data collection requirements of HB2355 which passed and became law in the 2017 legislative session. One component of this law directs OSP to create a system to allow all law enforcement agencies within the State to collect and report data elements from officer-initiated traffic and pedestrian stops into a centralized database.

HB2355 allows for a phased implementation based on agency size; agencies with more than 100 officers must begin collecting the data by July 1, 2018, agencies with 25 to 99 officers by July 1, 2019, and agencies with 1 to 24 officers by July 1, 2020.

OSP has hired an internal project team and contracted MTG Management Consultants, LLC, to write the project artifacts for the S.T.O.P. project including an RFP for the technology solution vendor. Your law enforcement agency has been selected to participate in business analysis work and requirements gathering which will be scheduled Oct 25, 26 or 27. We ask that you make available your Chief or Sheriff (or designee), Traffic or Patrol Division Commander, Chief Information Officer and a technical lead for the analysis work.

Agencies selected for these work sessions include:

- Gervais Police Department
- Hood River County Sheriff's Office
- Lane County Sheriff's Office
- Oregon City Police Department
- Oregon State Police
- Portland Police Bureau
- Washington County Sheriff's Office

This is a project that has significant time constraints. OSP's project team is working with MTG on work session requirements and will be in contact with you as soon as possible to schedule the work sessions.
