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State of Risk Management Report

Executive Summary

This report is submitted to the Oregon Legislature in accordance with Senate Bill 463 from the 2025 Legislative session. It directs the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to research, compile, prepare and deliver a report on the financial condition and stability of the Insurance Fund established under ORS 278.425. The contents of the report are to meet the specific requirements of sections (2) and (3) of the bill. This report will be provided no later than January 31st of each even numbered year.

DAS is part of the Executive branch of state government. Oregon Revised Statute 278 (ORS 278) provides DAS with the authority and responsibility to manage all risk management and insurance programs for all branches of state government. It is a full-service risk management program. DAS provides insurance coverage through both self-insurance and commercial policies. Other services include providing claim management for liability (tort) and state property damage claims, risk management, training, and consultation.

Structure and People

The program is led by the Risk Management division of the Department of Administrative Services (DAS RM). The division currently has 30 full-time employees (FTE) and provides its services in two teams.

The Risk Claims team addresses the state's liability (tort) claims, liability claims in litigation in collaboration with Oregon's Department of Justice and state property damage claims.

The Risk Consultation team manages the administration of the self-insurance policies and commercial policy purchases and renewals. They also manage agency consultations, contract risk transfer, training, questions, outreach, and the state's workers' compensation program.

Program Summary

The program oversees a wide variety of coverages. These include agency property, employee and agency liability (tort) coverages, and workers' compensation (WC).

The program uses a mix of commercial coverages and self-insurance to finance and manage risks. About 15% of the program's cost pays premiums for commercial policies and our administration fees to SAIF. The remainder covers the cost of the self-insurance coverage.

ORS 278.425 creates the state's Insurance Fund. It includes funding for the following three main coverage areas:

Liability (Tort) – Funding for Tort Claims per ORS 30.260-300. The state's tort program is self-insured. This means the state pays the costs of all liability claims and related expenses.

Property – Funding for state-owned property losses. The state's Property program is primarily self-insured. The self-insurance program covers losses up to the excess commercial policy retention of \$1.5 million for all perils except for Earthquake and Flood. The self-insured retention for Earthquake and Flood is \$4 million.

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DAS RM purchases excess commercial coverage in the event of more catastrophic losses. The excess commercial property program provides up to \$425 million in catastrophic coverage to the state's property.

Workers' Compensation (WC) –SAIF provides instate workers' compensation coverage. DAS RM works with SAIF and agencies to manage this policy, its claims and costs. DAS RM oversees the workers' compensation insurance needed for remote work in other states through other programs.

Insurance Fund Balance

ORS 278.435 indicates that the Insurance Fund is to operate on an actuarially sound basis. Traditionally, this has been interpreted to mean that cash and invested assets should equal at least 70% of liabilities. Here is a recent table of assets and liabilities for the Insurance Fund at recent biennial ends.

***Insurance Fund Liabilities are made up primarily of independent external actuarial opinions regarding amounts necessary to cover future claims and expenses for claims experienced through the valuation date.*

Assuming a funded ratio goal of 70%, the Insurance Fund is not currently actuarially sound. This is also punctuated by the algebraically equivalent trend in negative unencumbered balances shown in the table.

The high-level reasons for the worsening health of the Insurance Fund are twofold. First, the Insurance Fund has not been funded at levels recommended by independent actuaries. During the four biennia reflected in the above table, recommended contributions would have been at least \$684 million. During that time Legislatively Approved totals allocated by DAS RM to agencies totaled about \$538 million, a shortfall of at least \$146 million during those eight years.

The second reason for worsening health is a dramatic increase in payouts from the Insurance Fund. Total payouts from the Insurance Fund have increased from about \$134 million in the 2019-2021 biennium, to \$188 million in the 2021-2023 biennium, to \$330 million in the most recent biennium.

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Update as of December 31, 2025

On December 31, 2025, Cash and Invested Assets totaled \$63.1 million, and Liabilities were \$569.8 million—both higher than on June 30, 2025.

Asset and liability levels during the fiscal year do not predict year-end levels. Income for the Insurance Fund is received early in the fiscal year, while claims and expenses occur throughout. Liabilities are inflated because of an accounting entry that reflects unearned income.

Current projections (January 2026) suggest that, without major losses, assets and liabilities on June 30, 2026, will be like those on June 30, 2025.

Funds Advanced to the Insurance Fund

No monies have been advanced to the Insurance Fund from other funds in the State Treasury per ORS 278.435(5)-(7) in the last two years. Hence there are no outstanding liabilities related to such advances, which are loans from other sources

Actuarial and Audit Roles and the Risk Management Program

The Risk Management program benefits from two different groups of professionals who each bring valuable expertise. Independent outside actuaries study past and current claim data to estimate how much should be held in reserves for claims that are still open or not yet reported. They also provide funding recommendations that form the basis of the initial request for funds for each biennium. Their analysis gives management an informed view of long-term liabilities and supports planning and budgeting decisions.

Auditors do not review the financial strength or overall condition of the self-insured fund. The Secretary of State Audits Division has not audited the fund's financial statements. However, they audit certain material financial accounts as part of Oregon's state financial statements, including claim loss liability accounts. The latest audit procedures covered the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.

Together, these two perspectives strengthen the integrity of the program. The independent actuaries help ensure the reserve estimates and funding are based on sound analysis, while the auditors confirm that those amounts are accurately reflected in the financial reports.

Recently Closed Claims with Payments Exceeding \$1 Million

Senate Bill 463 requires that certain large claims be included in this report. Specifically, this report shall include a list of claims the Insurance Fund has closed during the previous two years (1/1/2024 to 12/31/2025) for which the amount paid exceeds \$1 million. Listed below are the claim numbers, agency, coverage type, loss date, report date, total paid and the primary cause. They are in claim number order.

The list includes 34 general liability claims, 2 employment liability claims, no workers' compensation claims, and 1 property coverage claim.

Agency Risk Charges

The Insurance Fund receives funding through legislatively approved budget amounts that become agency risk charge assessments. They are developed every biennium. They are allocated to all agencies covered by the Risk Management program. Risk charge development occurs over the 18 months before the beginning of a biennium.

These charges use a long-standing allocation formula. It assesses agencies based on past claim history and long-term future risk. The formula attempts to balance competing goals of predictability for budgeting purposes with responsibility for claim losses. Each agency receives their own assessments separated into property, liability, and WC.

Here are the risk charge assessments for the top 15 agencies for the current biennium, along with a comparison to the prior biennium.

Strategies and Actions

Several strategies are in place to help maintain solvency and improve the actuarial soundness of the Insurance Fund and its programs.

- DAS RM prepares projections for Insurance Fund assets and shares them with the State Chief Financial Office at least quarterly.
- DAS RM estimates cost impacts of proposed legislation, so policymakers have accurate financial information.
- DAS works with agencies to help reduce future claims where possible.

Recommendations for all agencies include:

- Engaging leadership in risk-reduction efforts.
- Establishing a Risk Coordinator or similar role responsible for creating a process for incident reporting, investigation, and prevention.
- Completing a gap analysis to identify major risk areas.
- Developing and following a risk-mitigation plan.
- Tracking leading and lagging indicators and providing regular reports to their Executive Team.
- Creating an internal audit process to ensure adherence to agency policies and procedures.
- Serving as the point of contact with DAS Risk Management on liability claims.
- Requiring driver training for all employees due to increased driving-related claims and citations.
- Strengthening contracts and grant risk-transfer practices, including indemnity and insurance requirements.

DAS RM also continues targeted consultations with larger agencies that have complex missions and the highest potential for losses. These include Oregon Department of Corrections, Department of Human Services, Oregon Department of Transportation, and Oregon Health Authority. These efforts involve detailed reviews of each agency's claim history and identification of strategies to reduce future risks.
