

## State Agency Sustainability Metrics - Executive Summary

### Oregon Department of Corrections

The Oregon Sustainability Board is tasked to help create a culture of sustainability in state agencies. As part of this process, agencies report on statewide sustainability metrics to deepen and broaden our understanding and actions towards that end. For efficient and comprehensive reporting in agency plan updates, the Board developed the following template for reporting on statewide metrics.
