ARTICLE 122.2C—UNIFORMS, PROTECTIVE CLOTHING, AND TOOLS (OSH)

Section 1. Protective clothing shall remain the property of the Agency and shall be 2 returned to the Agency upon termination of employment. Color, type, and quality of 3 protective clothing shall be determined by the Agency. Damage to protective clothing 4 5 judged by the Agency to need replacement will be replaced by the Agency. Protective clothing, or protective devices lost or damaged as a result of negligence of the employee 6 will be replaced by the employee. Protective clothing or protective devices may not be 7 used for personal reasons. Rain gear and protective footwear will be provided to Ground 8 Maintenance Workers 1 and 2, and Equipment Operators. Protective footwear will be 9 provided to all employees working in the Environmental Services Department, Vocational 10 Services (whose are permanently assigned to work in the greenhouse, woodshop 11 and on the landscape crew), Facilities Services Department, and Materials 12 Management Department in the following manner: Facilities Services employees will be 13 provided agency issued footwear. In lieu of agency issued footwear, a Facilities Services 14 employee can elect to receive up to a one-two hundred and fifty dollar (\$150200) 15 16 reimbursement per biennium for work boots that comply with OSHA standard 1910.136. Environmental Services, Vocational Services (whose are permanently assigned to 17 work in the greenhouse, woodshop and on the landscape crew), and Materials 18 19 Management employees will be provided agency issued footwear. In lieu of agency issued footwear, a Environmental Services, Vocational Services (whose are 20 permanently assigned to work in the greenhouse, woodshop and on the landscape 21 crew), and Materials Management employee can elect to receive up to one hundred and 22 **fifty** dollar (\$100-\$150) reimbursement per biennium for slip resistant shoes or boots. 23

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Section 2. The agency shall provide up to fifty dollars (\$50) seventy five (\$75) in 24 receipted reimbursement annually for prescription safety glasses for employees who are 25 required to wear safety glasses in their position. 26 **Section 3.** For employees working in the Food Services Department who, as a condition 27 of employment, are required to wear uniform clothing, shoes or boots of a distinctive 28 design or fashion, the Agency shall either provide said uniform clothing, shoes or boots, 29 or shall provide uniform reimbursement to a maximum of two-hundred dollars (\$200.00) 30 per year. Uniforms provided by the Agency shall remain the property of the Agency and 31 shall be returned to the Agency upon termination of employment. Damage to uniforms 32 provided by the Agency, when judged by the Agency to need replacement, will be 33 replaced by the Agency. Uniforms provided by the Agency that are lost or damaged as 34 a result of negligence of the employee will be replaced by the employee. 35 Section 5. For employees working in the Facilities Department performing 36 trades/maintenance work who, as a condition of employment, are required to wear 37 uniform clothing, of a distinctive design or fashion, the Agency shall provide said 38 39 uniform clothing. Uniforms provided by the Agency shall remain the property of the Agency and shall be returned to the Agency upon termination of employment. 40 Damage to uniforms provided by the Agency, when judged by the Agency to need 41 42 replacement, will be replaced by the Agency. Uniforms provided by the Agency that are lost or damaged as a result of negligence of the employee will be replaced 43 by the employee. 44 **Section-4 5.** Employees may submit a written request to their supervisor if they believe 45 that protective clothing or a device is necessary for their safety and health. The written 46

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request will specify the protective clothing or device that is being requested with an 47

explanation of the safety or health risk that the clothing or device will mitigate. The

supervisor will provide a written response to the request within fourteen (14) calendar

days. The response will either approve the request or provide reasoning of the denial of

the request for the protective clothing or device.

Rain gear and protective footwear will be issued to Ground Maintenance Workers and 55

Facilities Maintenance Specialists. In lieu of agency issued footwear, an employee can 56

elect to receive up to a one-two hundred and fifty dollar (\$150200) reimbursement per

biennium for work boots that comply with OSHA standard 1910.136.

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
