The rule applies to existing content and sets standards for all content created moving forward



Digital documents & files options

1

Remediate

Fix the file and repost or convert to webpage

2

Exempt

Files created before deadline & not used by public to apply for, access, or participate in services, programs, or activities

3

Archive

Files created before deadline that are kept for historical purposes
