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Key Updates

Review of HCAS Results

- Matthew Kitchen provided an overview of the current HCAS equity ratios:
 - Light-duty vehicles continue to underpay relative to their cost responsibility, with equity ratios hovering around 0.87.
 - Medium- and heavy-duty vehicles are overpaying relative to their costs, maintaining similar trends from the prior HCAS study.
 - The model reflects the latest updates to vehicle classification and cost allocation methodologies.
- Sean Wallace highlighted recent adjustments made to address prior discrepancies in fee and cost reporting, ensuring consistency across datasets.

Project Mix and Legislative Guidance

- Discussion centered on how shifts in project priorities impact cost responsibility:
 - Bob Russell noted that legislative mandates, such as House Bill 2017, set specific expenditure guidelines that influence project allocations.
 - Mazen Malik emphasized the need for detailed tracking of project mix changes over time to better understand their effects on equity ratios.
- The group reviewed slides detailing expenditure trends by work type, with significant focus on modernization projects and their heavier impact on light-duty vehicle cost responsibilities.
- Carl Riccadonna pointed out that federal and state mandates, including ADA compliance, also contribute to shifts in project funding priorities.

Final Report Preparation

- The team is targeting January 27, 2025, for circulating the final draft to SRT members, with comments due by January 29.
 - This timeline ensures sufficient time for review and minor revisions before submission to the Joint Committee on Transportation by January 31.
- Matthew Kitchen emphasized that any substantive issues must be identified promptly to avoid last-minute changes.

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Legislative Presentation Planning

- The presentation will emphasize the equity and transparency of the HCAS process:
 - Highlighting the alignment of cost responsibilities with actual expenditures.
 - Addressing anticipated questions on the impacts of electric vehicles and federal funding shifts.
- Daniel Porter suggested including a dedicated slide comparing revenue and expenditure impacts to provide clarity for legislators.

Next Steps

Final Report Submission

- ECONorthwest to finalize the draft report by January 27, incorporating all SRT feedback received during the review period.
- SRT members to provide comments and edits by January 29 to ensure readiness for submission.

Legislative Presentation

- ECONorthwest to prepare a slide deck outlining key findings, with a draft circulated to SRT members by January 21 for feedback.
- Final presentation to be refined based on input and delivered to the Joint Committee on Transportation at the end of January.

- **ECONorthwest**: Complete final report and presentation materials, ensuring clarity and alignment with legislative priorities.
- **SRT Members**: Review and provide input on both the report and presentation materials by designated deadlines.
