Angela Fasana presenting

- Early Childhood Education program
 - Early Head Start-Home based program serving prenatal to 3 years old.
 - Center based infant/Toddler classes. 12 weeks to three years old.
- After care
 - o 2pm-5:15pm
- 100 children served in programs, 70 on site.

- Immersion School Program-Chinook
 - o 2 preschool classrooms
 - Total of 22 children enrolled
 - o 3-5 years old

Budget

- Staffing
 - 53 employees (46 FT, 7 PT)
 - o 2023 retention rate at 93%
 - Classes and tuition reimbursement offered
 - Largest recruitment issue is hiring subs
 - Most subs are parents and times available that don't line up with the needs. After care in particular
 - Coordinators that run
 - Health and nutrition screening
 - Kitchen cook and staff
 - Bus transportation provided for children 2yrs and up
 - Family and community partnership programs
 - Policy council
 - Environmental monitoring
 - Eligibility Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment, Attendance (Data)
 - Social Emotional Learning Coach
 - Inclusion Specialist
- Budget
 - Approximately 4.5 million per year to operate the ECE
 - 3 Federal Grants-Support 44%
 - Head Start
 - Early Head Start
 - CCDF
 - 2 State Grants
 - OPK
 - Preschool Promise
 - Approximately 1.7 million of the program budget comes from Tribal Funding

 - o Hoping for a more thorough list of needs
 - o Is there a higher need than what we have asked for
 - Not an itemized breakdown
 - Ex: expansion of facilities cost, Water heater replacement cost, cost to add additional classrooms to serve more children
