

Family Child Care First Aid Kit Supply List

Program: _____

A family child care program must maintain, at a minimum, the following first aid supplies: in the home, in any vehicle used to transport children in care, and for group activities away from the center:

- ☐ Non-medicated adhesive bandages (assorted sizes);
 - ☐ Adhesive tape;
 - ☐ Sterile gauze pads (various sizes);
 - ☐ A sling, or a large triangular bandage;
 - ☐ Bottled water (for cleaning wounds or eyes);
 - ☐ Liquid handwashing soap or hand washing gel (hand sanitizer);
 - ☐ Sealed antiseptic towelettes or solution to be used as a wound cleaning agent;
 - ☐ Scissors;
 - ☐ Tweezers;
 - ☐ Disposable latex-free, powder-free gloves;
 - ☐ Plastic bags (for disposing of blood and other body fluids);
 - ☐ Mercury-free and glass-free thermometer;
 - ☐ Cold pack;
 - ☐ Chlorine bleach or other disinfectant for cleaning of blood and other bodily fluids;
 - ☐ Flexible rolled gauze; and
 - ☐ A chart or handbook of first aid instructions.
- ❖ A provider must ensure that the first aid supplies are readily available to staff and **kept inaccessible to children**.
 - ❖ A provider must maintain the first aid supplies in a clean and sanitary manner and replace them as needed, including expired items.
