

# Survey Results: Disposal and Recovery of Animal Mortality and Byproducts in Oregon

In June 2001, Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Solid Waste Program, surveyed all the municipal solid waste landfills in Oregon and the rendering<sup>1</sup> companies we could locate in Oregon to obtain information on the recovery and disposal of dead animals and animal byproducts. The survey was designed to help businesses that generate these products find resources for their recovery or disposal. This information is needed now because some rendering companies serving Oregon have closed or raised their prices recently, limiting the options for disposal of dead animals and animal byproducts.

Data from the survey is contained in tables 1 and 2 below, followed by the questions asked in the survey. DEQ staff mailed the survey to landfill operators and did a phone survey of rendering companies. At the end of this report is the name, address, and phone number of the landfills and companies listed in the tables.

Table headings are abbreviations for the following:

**Large?** = Do you accept large animals (such as horses, cows, llamas, elk) for recovery or disposal?

**Small?** = Do you accept small animals (domestic and small farm animals) for recovery or disposal?

**Limit?** = Do you have a weight or volume limit on the amount of dead animals you accept?

**How much?** = How much is the limit on the amount of dead animals you accept?

**Extra \$\$?** = How much is the extra fee for the recovery or disposal of dead animals?

**Byprod MPB** = Do you accept meat processing byproducts?

**Byprod ROG** = Do you accept restaurant grease & oils?

**Byprod Dairy** = Do you accept dairy products?

**Byprod Other** = Do you accept other animal byproducts? If so, what kinds?

**Refer to:** = If you do not accept dead animals and animal byproducts, to whom do you refer generators of these wastes?

**Amount handled** = An estimate of how much animal waste is handled by the landfill or company.

## Survey Results

Oregon has 33 landfills that accept municipal solid waste. Nine of them said they accept large dead animals, some reluctantly, and many have limits, restrictions, or special conditions (see the footnotes for the "Landfills" table). Nineteen landfills said they accept small dead animals. Again, some have limits, restrictions, or special conditions. Ten landfills accept at least one of the four types of animal byproducts listed in the survey. Short Mountain and Dry Creek landfills are the only landfills west of the Cascades that accept large dead animals.

We surveyed 17 rendering companies by phone. Nine companies said they accept or pick up large dead animals, and 13 said they accept at least one of the four types of animal byproducts listed in the survey. These companies service most areas of the state, although many of them transport dead animals for processing at a few rendering companies in Oregon, Washington, or Idaho. Three companies did not reply to the survey.

Disposal of dead livestock on farms includes options not listed in this summary. Contact your local OSU Extension Service or the Oregon Department of Agriculture for more information.

Our survey shows that resources are available in Oregon for disposal or recovery of dead animals and animal byproducts. However, the prices, volumes accepted, availability of pick-up service, and location of the resources may not meet all the current needs for disposal or recovery options for dead animals in Oregon.

<sup>1</sup> Rendering is the process of reducing, converting, or melting down fat by heating to produce products that can be used in foods or to make soap, candles, or lubricants.
