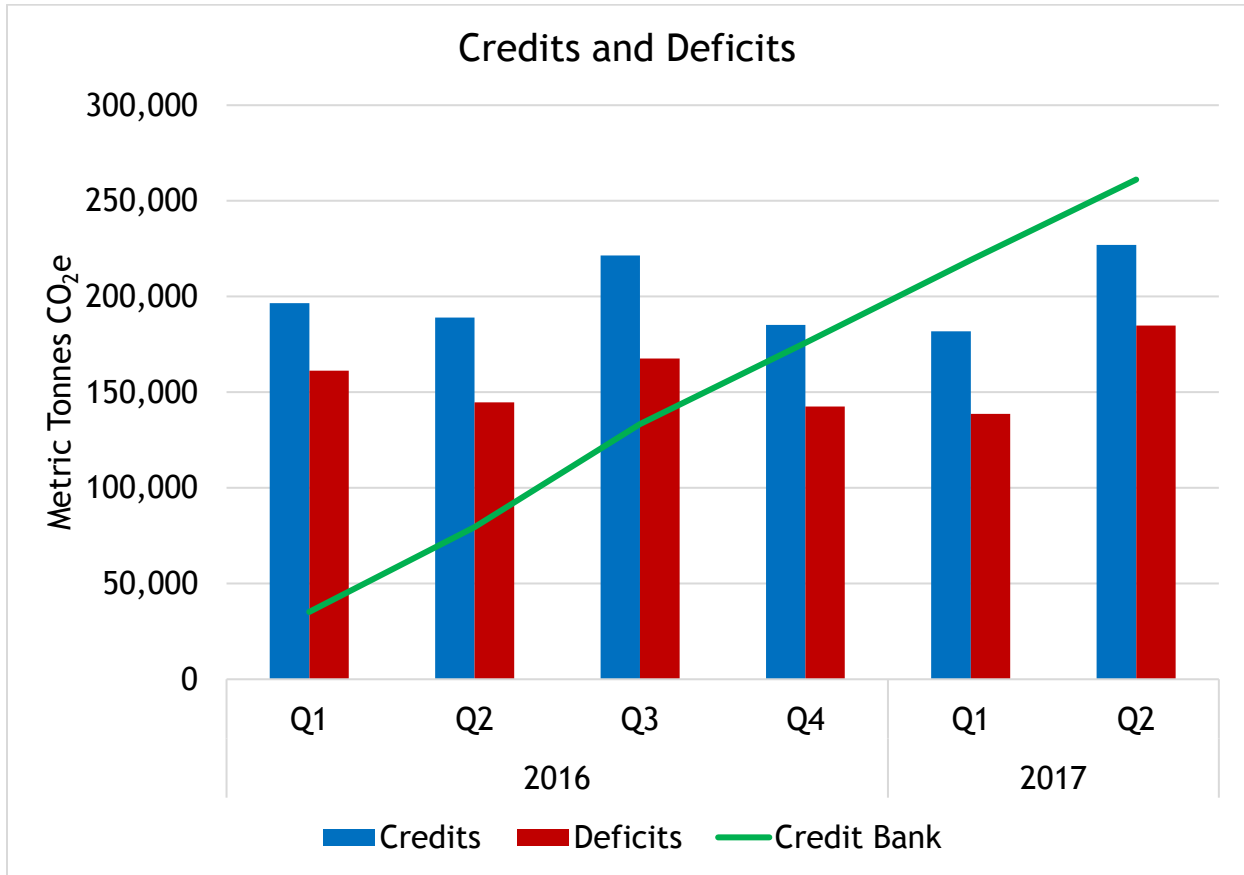




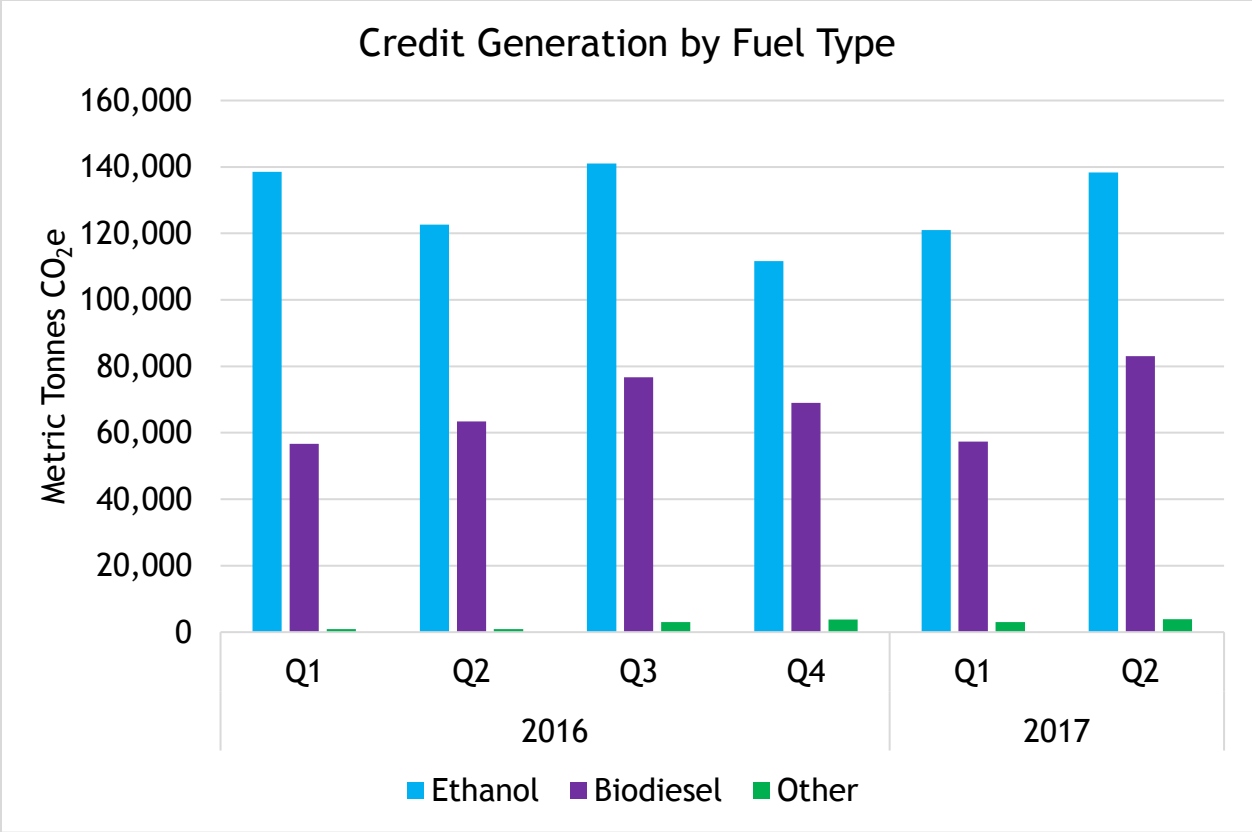

Clean Fuels Program
Second Quarter 2017 Data

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DEQ staff are pleased to issue the sixth quarterly data summary for the Clean Fuels Program. The aggregated quarterly data for the program is also posted on our website in an Excel spreadsheet.



The first graph shows the number of credits and deficits generated. Credits are generated by fuels that have a carbon intensity which falls below this year’s target, while deficits are generated by fuels whose carbon intensity is higher than this year’s target. In the second quarter of 2017, the market continued to generate more credits than deficits.



The second graph shows the breakdown of which fuels generated credits. The majority of credits came from Ethanol and Biodiesel which are blended into gasoline and diesel, respectively. The Other category includes alternative fuels such as Natural Gas, Electricity, Biogas and Propane.
