

NPDES Stormwater Discharge Permit Modification 1200-CN Construction Stormwater General Permit

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Action

Modification of National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Construction Stormwater General Permit No. 1200-CN.

Permit Writer

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Background

Construction activities that disturb at least one acre of land (or are part of a larger common plan of development that will disturb at least one acre) and may discharge to surface waters of the state are required to obtain coverage under DEQ's 1200-C Construction Stormwater Permit. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's stormwater regulations allow DEQ to designate a local jurisdiction's construction stormwater management program as a Qualified Local Program for construction sites that result in the disturbance of less than five acres. To be designated as a Qualified Local Program, the local jurisdiction's stormwater management requirements must be equivalent to the conditions of DEQ's 1200-C Construction Stormwater General Permit.

Public Notice

DEQ provided a public comment period from May 11 to June 15, 2018. No comments were received.

Modification

DEQ has modified the 1200-CN permit to include the following as approved Qualified Local Progrmas or 1200-CN Jurisdictions (as referred to in the permit):

City of Klmath Falls City of Keizer Marion County Oak Lodge Water Services District

For sites with less than five acres of soil disturbance, which are within the jurisdiction of a Qualified Local Program, the operator of the construction activity is automatically covered under the 1200-CN Construction Stormwater General Permit and does not need coverage under DEQ's 1200-C Construction Stormwater General Permit.
