# Air Curtain Incinerators: Authorized and Prohibited Materials

Type of Waste	Authorized Materials	Prohibited Materials
<b>Wood Waste</b>	<p>Wood waste is untreated wood and untreated wood products, including tree stumps (whole or chipped), trees, tree limbs (whole or chipped), bark, sawdust, chips, scraps, slabs, millings and shavings.</p> <p>Trees from orchards (fruit or nut) and from Christmas tree farms are authorized wood waste materials.</p>	<p>See Clean Lumber Prohibited Materials below.</p>
<b>Clean Lumber</b>	<p>Clean lumber means wood or wood products that have been cut or shaped, and include wet, air-dried and kiln-dried wood products.</p>	<p>Construction, renovation, or demolition wastes.</p> <p>Treated wood and treated wood products, including wood products that have been painted, pigment-stained, or pressure treated by compounds such as chromate copper arsenate, pentachlorophenol, and creosote, or manufactured wood products that contain adhesives or resins (e.g., plywood, particle board, flake board, and oriented strand board).</p>
<b>Yard Waste</b>	<p>Yard waste means grass, grass clippings, bushes, shrubs and clippings from bushes and shrubs. Only yard waste incidental to land clearing is allowed.</p> <p>Yard waste comes from residential, commercial/retail, institutional, or industrial sources as part of maintaining yards or other private or public lands. Shrubs and bushes from clearing forest service land are authorized materials.</p> <p>Yard waste that is not agricultural but is from clearing agricultural lands is an authorized material.</p>	<p>Agricultural waste, including waste from vineyards.</p>
