In 2018 the Oregon legislature, in Senate Bill (SB) 1541, per <u>ORS 468A.339</u>, granted DEQ the authority to conduct an area risk pilot study for assessing, and regulating, the cumulative health risks from the emissions of industrial air toxics. DEQ is in the first phase of this <u>CAO Cumulative Health Risk Pilot</u> and is seeking input from you for determining where the study should take place.

Community members are key sources of information for this pilot project therefore DEQ is hosting a listening session to receive feedback about additional consideration when choosing a pilot area beyond the requirements from the bill.
