DEQ has received and reviewed ENTEK International's (ENTEK) Monday November 25, 2019 letter, sent as a follow-up to the site visit DEQ staff attended at ENTEK in Lebanon, OR on Wednesday November 20, 2019. Upon review of the letter, and related discussions with ENTEK representatives, DEQ approves ENTEK's additional extension request to complete the compilation of TCE service components. DEQ made this request pursuant to the WLOTC-4992 dated Tuesday October 8, 2019. As requested, please provide the component list for all potential fugitive emission points at the facility by your requested date of Friday February 7, 2020.

In granting this extension, DEQ notes the progress made by ENTEK in satisfying the information request thus far by providing the requested CEMs data and Material Balance calculation methodologies outlined in the WLOTC-4992.
