Utility: Emerald People's Utility District (EPUD), Oregon

Reporting Year: 2025

Program Areas: Residential EV Charging, Level 2 Incentives, Public Charging, Future DCFC Planning

Emerald People's Utility District (EPUD) is a community-owned, not-for-profit utility serving Lane County. In 2025, EPUD continued expanding its electric transportation efforts through residential incentives, public charging support, and early planning for future fast-charging infrastructure. Our work focused on improving access to charging, supporting customer adoption, and preparing the grid for growing EV demand. In 2025, Emerald saw \$451,584 in revenue from selling of base credits.

2025 EPUD Clean Fuels Spending Updates:

Residential Level 2 Charger Incentive Program

EPUD continued offering \$200 rebates for Wi-Fi-enabled or ENERGY STAR certified Level 2 chargers.

- **Total Incentives Issued:** \$4,000

Hosted Public Charging at Local High Schools

EPUD maintained Level 2 chargers at four local high schools to support community access to charging.

- **Blink Network Service Fees (2025):** \$960
- These chargers serve students, staff, families, and visitors.

Anticipated Increase in Blink Fees: Beginning in 2026, all EPUD-hosted school chargers will transition off their five-year free service plans, resulting in higher annual Blink network service fees.

Charger Relocation and Site Optimization

EPUD relocated three Level 2 chargers from a school site that no longer required on-site charging to EPUD headquarters, where they now support employee charging and fleet electrification.

- **Removal and Reinstallation Costs:** \$2,760

Future DC Fast Charger Planning

EPUD continued evaluating the installation of a DC Fast Charger within its service area.

- Additional Clean Fuels Program revenue will be needed in future years to support capital and installation costs.
- 2025 work focused on site evaluation, community benefit analysis, and funding strategy.
