Clean Fuels Program Third Quarter 2016 Data

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DEQ staff are pleased to issue the third quarterly data summary for the Clean Fuels Program. DEQ has reviewed all of the third quarter data reports, but there may be changes to the data as DEQ continues to work with regulated parties on revisions to their initial reporting. The aggregated quarterly data for the program is also posted on our website in an Excel worksheet format.

The first graph shows the number of credits and deficits generated. Credits are generated by fuels whose carbon intensity falls below this year's target, while deficits are generated by fuels whose carbon intensity is higher than this year's target. In the third quarter, the market continued to generate more credits than deficits.

The second graph shows the breakdown of which fuels generated credits. The majority of credits came from ethanol and biodiesel that are blended into gasoline and diesel, respectively. The other category includes alternative fuels such as natural gas, electricity, biogas and propane.
