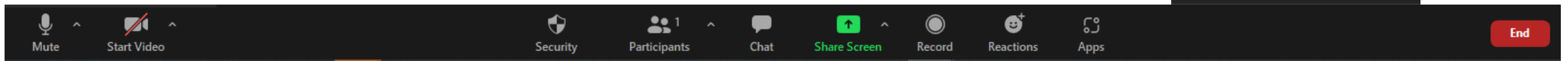

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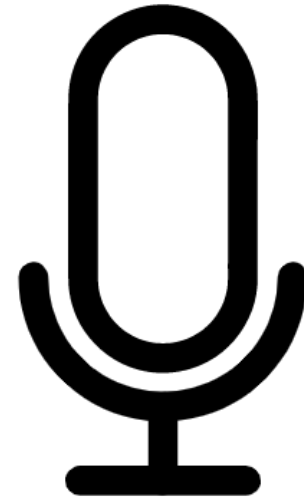

# Relational agreements

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What changed:

- Be curious, open, and be willing to disagree without being disagreeable.
- Be committed to building trust-based relationships.
- While intentions may be good, recognize impact of words and actions. Acknowledge when harmful and be willing to explore that.

What stayed the same:

- Take space/make space – if you are usually quiet challenge yourself to take more space, and if you usually talk a lot be mindful to make space for others to speak.
- Avoid jargon, acronyms, and industry language – use inclusive language that is accessible for people with varying inside knowledge.
- Speak from your own experience – use I statements rather than generalizations.

# Representation and community engagement

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- Our individual lived experiences and expertise as members of our diverse communities are valued and needed. Members commit to sharing this with DEQ and the committee.
- No minimum community engagement requirement for members. This will look different for each person or organization.
- For some it could be built within their work, organizational goals, or personal commitments and for some it could be within other engagements and through various interactions. Some have done outreach and engagement to community prior to their role as a member of this committee and can share those experiences, documents, and feedback as appropriate.



# What DEQ can provide

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- Participation at community events or meetings to share information on CCIs and hear community feedback.
- Surveys, social media content, written content, translations, and collaborative thinking around groups and/or individuals to connect with.
- Speakers to come to committee meetings to share knowledge on a specific topic (for example: carbon intensity of fuels, greenhouse gas reporting, environmental justice mapping efforts).

# Feedback and recommendations

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Members can provide as much or as little feedback on a specific topic.

If there is 70% or more of the committee present, meeting discussions will continue. For example, 7 members present from a committee of 10 individuals.

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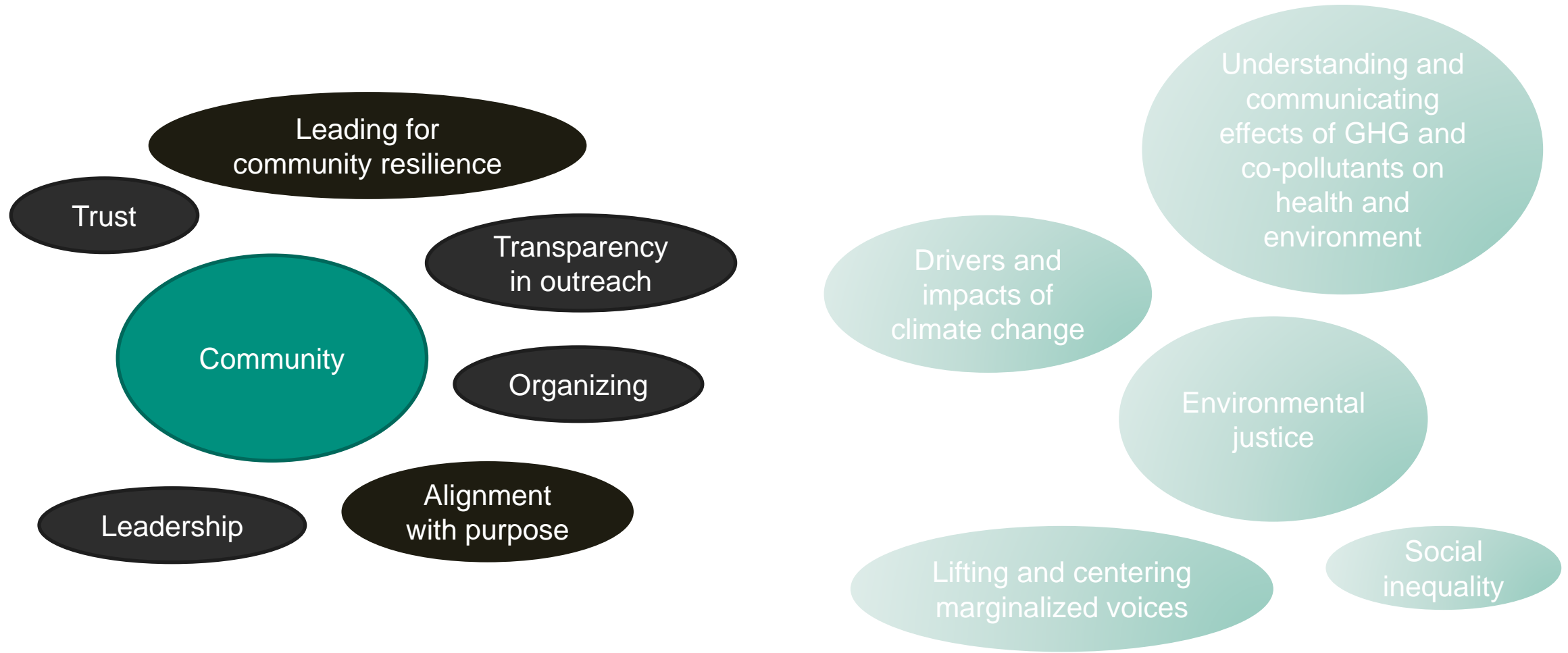

# Request for information summary

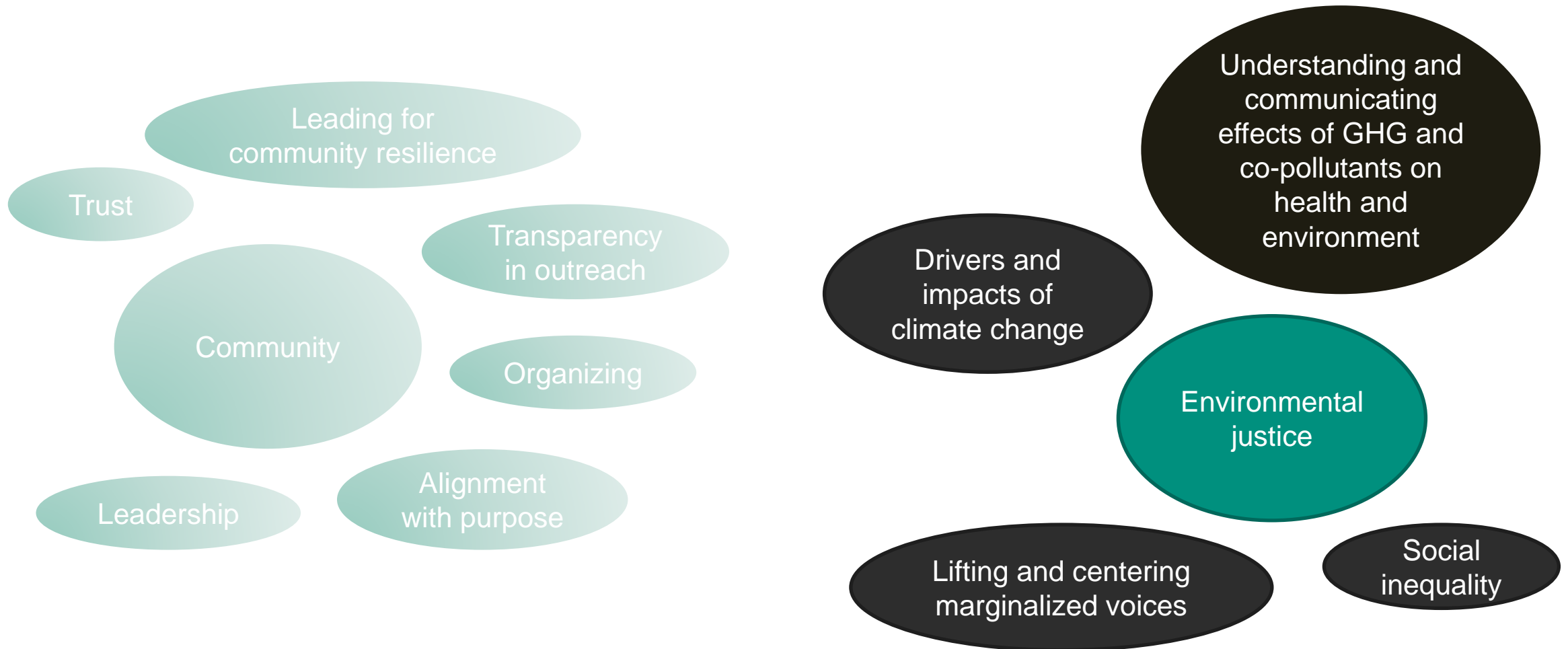
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- Purpose and generally what was learned

  - 2 non-profit, 1 company, 1 state agency

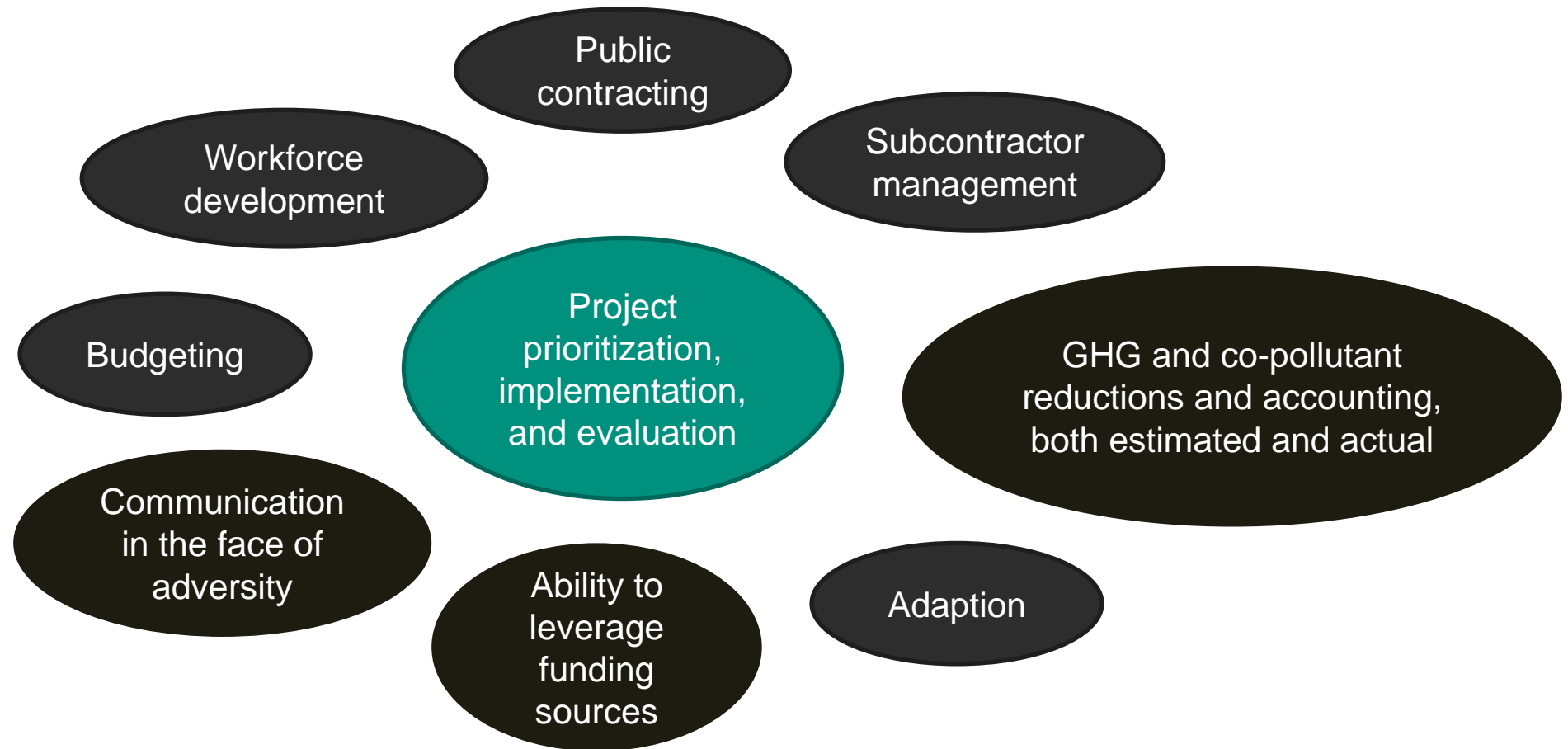

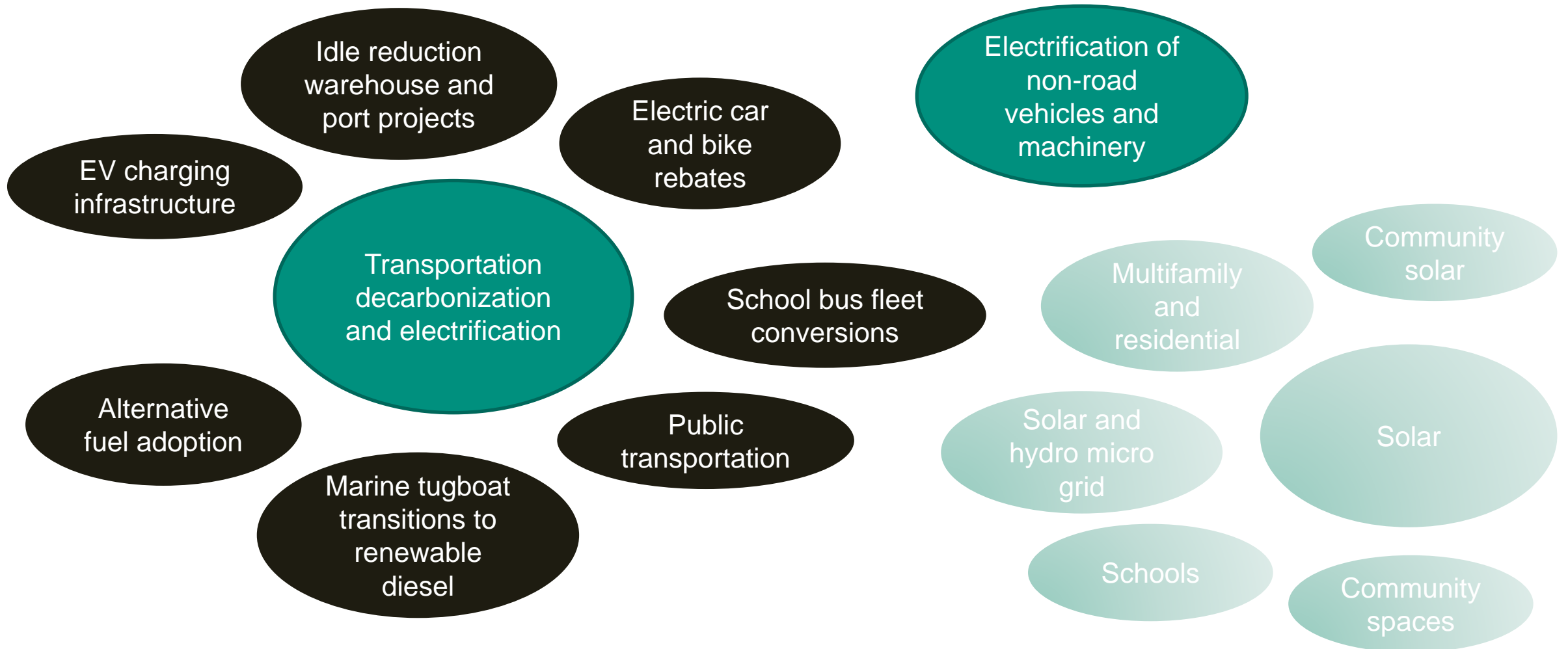
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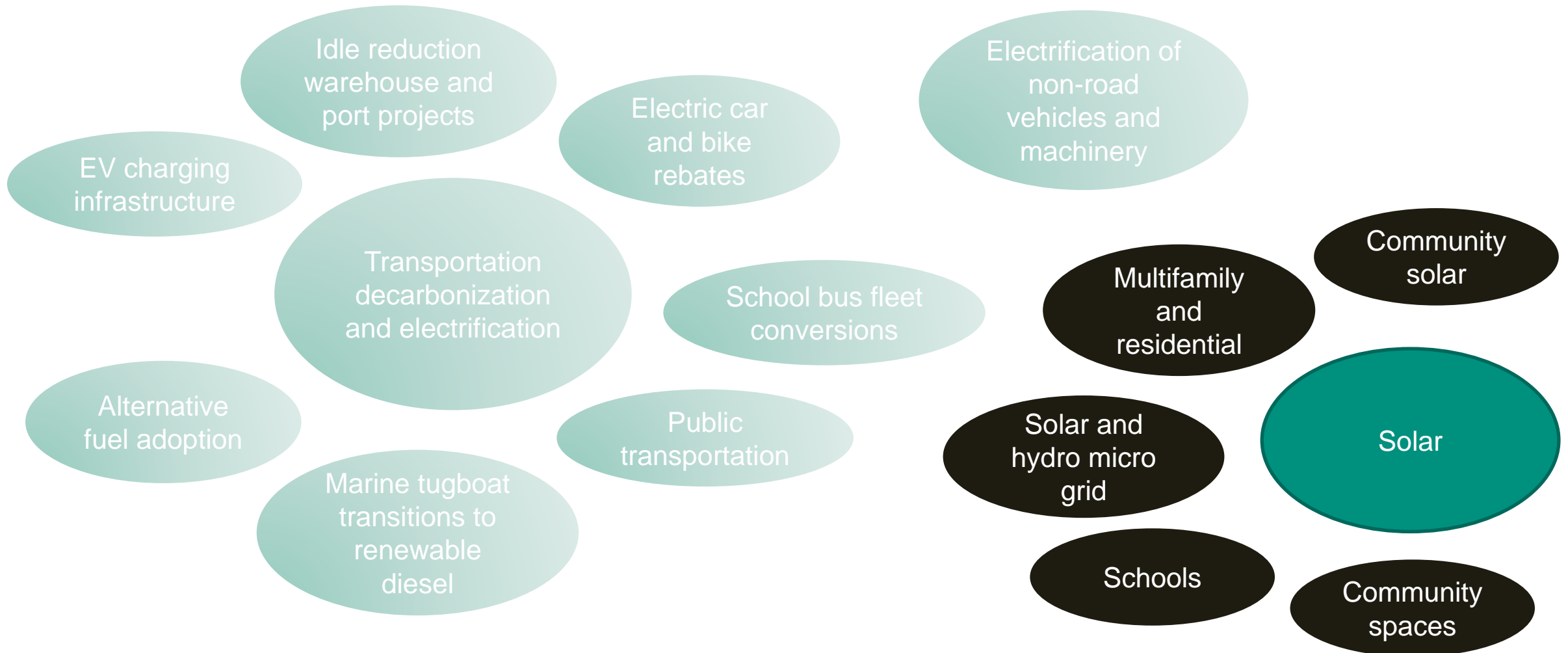


Q.2: What types of greenhouse gas emission reduction projects would you suggest being considered or prioritized for CCI throughout Oregon?

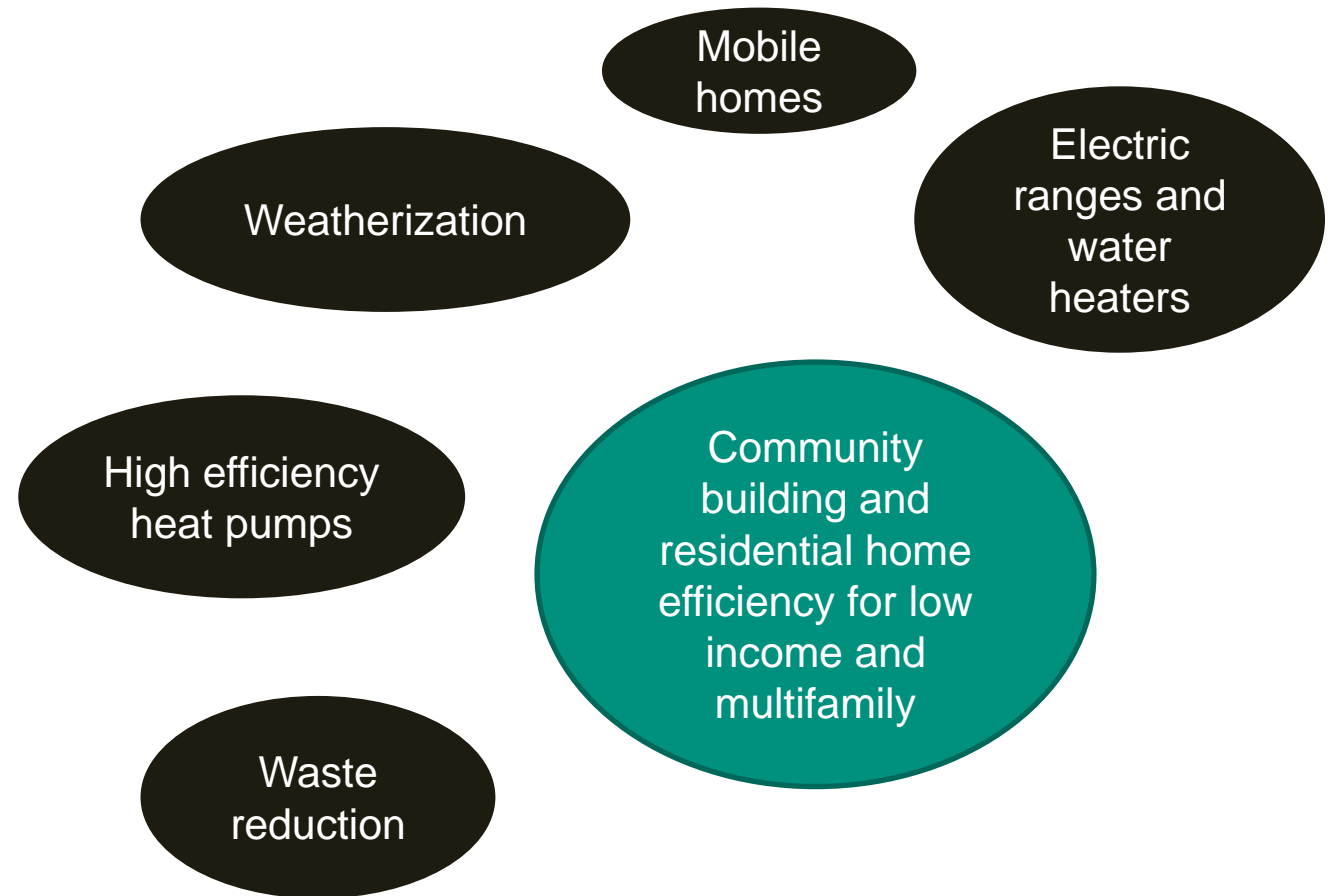




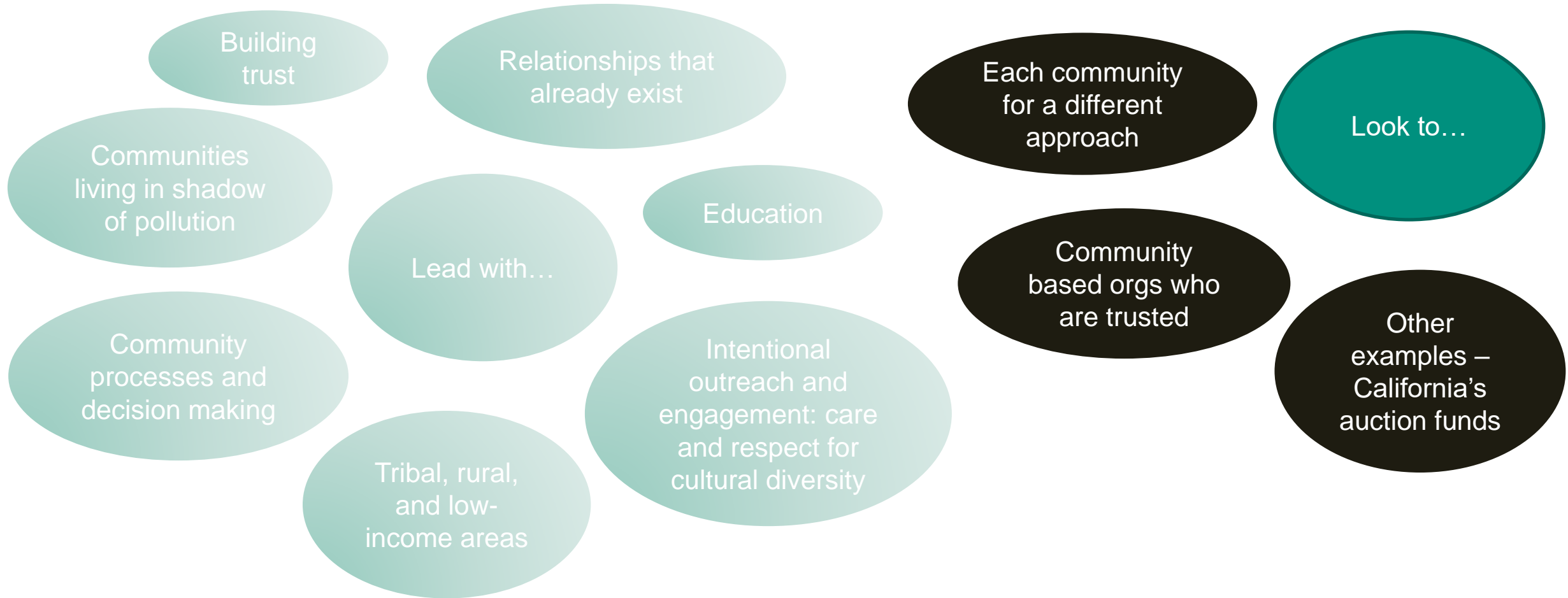
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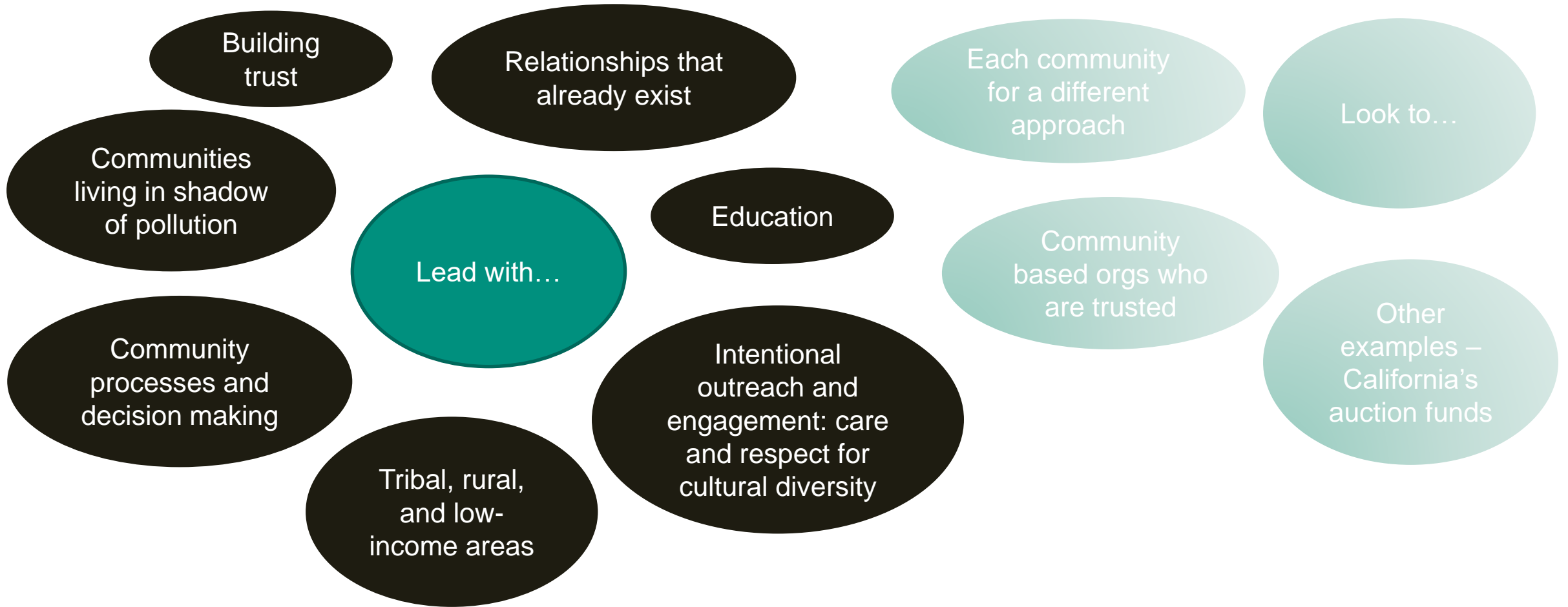
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# Q.4: How would you suggest engagement happen with environmental justice communities in project development and implementation?
