

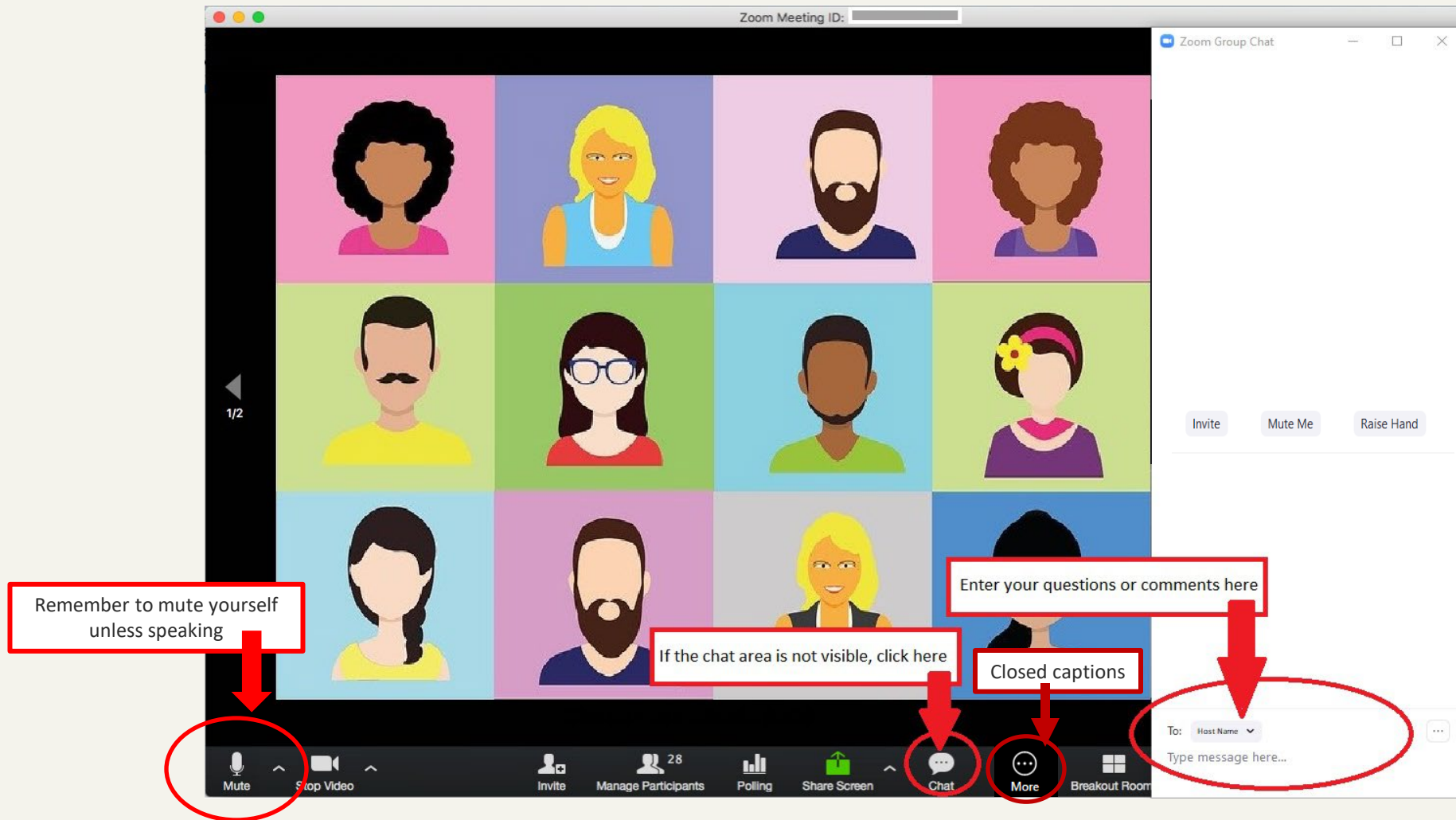

Program Overview

History and Year-to-Date

- 2009: legislature passed paint stewardship law
- 2010: pilot program began
- 2013: program became permanent
- Since 2010:
 - 16 years of paint stewardship in Oregon
 - Over 10 million gallons collected

Collection Volumes

Definition

A wasteshed is defined in Oregon law as being an area of the state that shares a common solid waste disposal system.

For most of Oregon, a wasteshed is an individual county with two exceptions: the Milton-Freewater and Metro wastesheds.



Collection Volumes Summary

- For each wasteshed, publish:
 - an estimate of the total volume of paint collected in each wasteshed as part of the program during the prior calendar year.
 - the portion of the total volume in gallons of paint collected under the program at each of the following:
 - Permanent collection sites located at a retailer
 - Permanent collection sites and collection events for the program located within the local solid waste collection infrastructure
 - Collection events promoted and paid for by a stewardship organization

2024	649,348	50	44	0.2	6
2025	651,088	51	43	.08	6

Collection Volumes Summary

- Roughly half of the amount collected (49%) came from the Metro wasteshed
- Deschutes - 11%
- Lane - 9%
- Marion - 7%
- Gilliam – 0.01%
- Milton-Freewater – 0.01%

- Collection network is stable
 - Achieved through sites and events
- Program finances slightly dipping due to increase costs
- Reuse continues be a small portion of processing
 - Promote the reuse of post-consumer architectural paint
- Progress toward goals

Program Updates

- Plan Amendment with proposed fee increase (under DEQ review)
 - Notifications through GovDelivery email notices
- Annual report (under DEQ review)
- Conditional approval of program goals
 - Goals were approved through April 2026
 - Continuance while DEQ reviews progress made towards goals
