



A Product Stewardship Plan for Covered Drugs from Households

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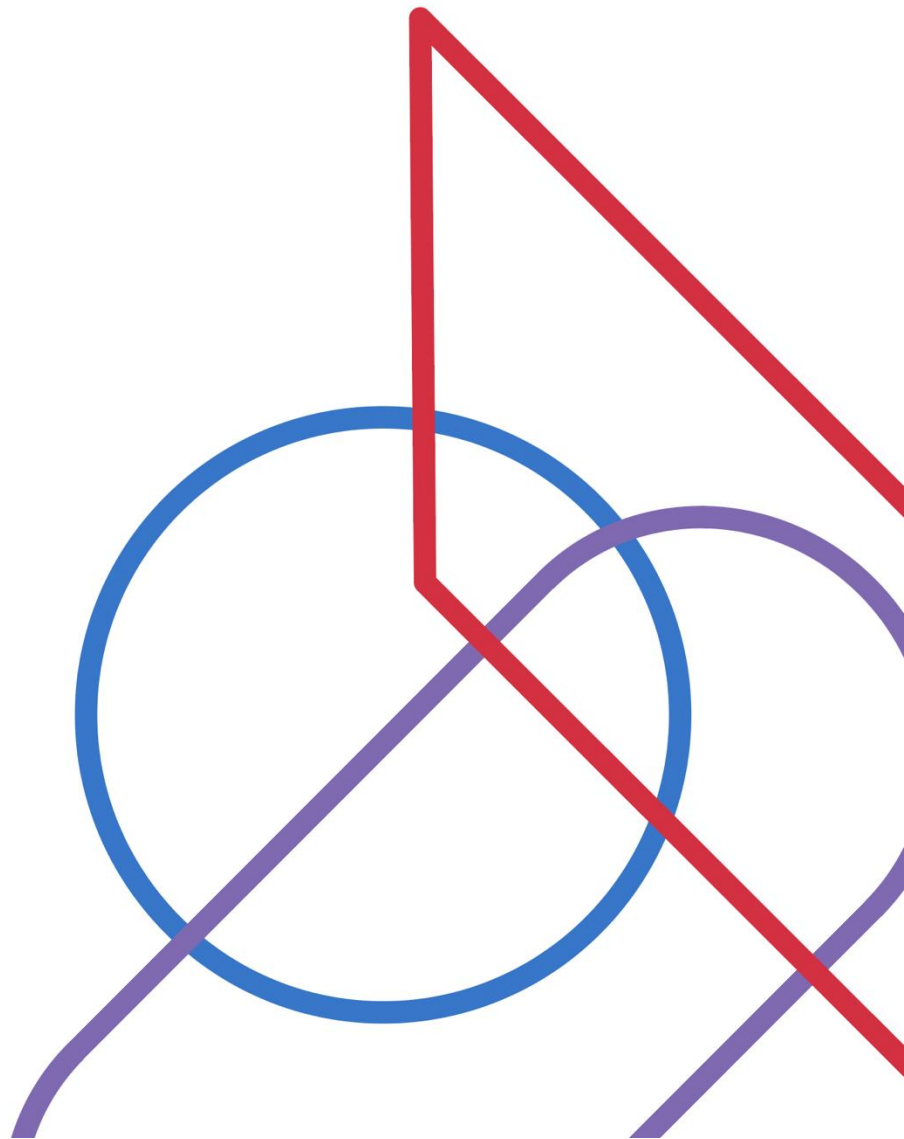


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Executive Summary

MED-Project USA (“MED-Project”) operates a Product Stewardship Plan for Covered Drugs from Households in the State of Oregon, under the Oregon Revised Statutes 459A.200 to 459A.266 (the “Law”), approved by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (the “Department”) on May 20, 2021 (“Approved Plan”) and last revised and approved on January 3, 2025. MED-Project has substantial, practical, on-the-ground experience implementing unwanted medicine take-back programs in jurisdictions across the country, including the State of Oregon. MED-Project has served the residents of the State since 2021 by collecting over 255,000 pounds of Covered Drugs. MED-Project’s comprehensive outreach and education program has generated over 45 million impressions to State residents.

I. Introduction

MED-Project submits this Updated Product Stewardship Plan for Covered Drugs from Households in the State of Oregon (“Plan”) on behalf of the Covered Manufacturers identified in Plan Appendix A and pursuant to the Oregon Revised Statutes 459A.200 to 459A.266 (the “Drug Take-Back Law” or the “Law”).

The Law requires Covered Manufacturers to establish and implement a Drug Take-Back Program that complies with the requirements of the Law independently, as part of a group of Covered Manufacturers, or through membership in a Drug Take-Back Organization. Appendix L contains a table that denotes how the Plan addresses each component of ORS 459A.200 to 459A.266 and the Department’s Guide for Oregon Drug Take-Back Programs. This Plan describes the implementation process, and the Department will be able to review the annual report to confirm the Plan is being implemented.

II. Definitions

This Plan uses and incorporates the definitions from ORS 459A.200 to 459A.266 and related rules. The definitions in this Section are for terms not defined in the Drug Take-Back Law. All defined terms are capitalized in the Plan.

Call Center is the call center operated by MED-Project for Covered Entities, which can be reached by callers at a toll-free telephone number. If there are multiple approved plans, the Call Center will become the jointly operated call center for Covered Entities, which can be reached by callers at a brand-neutral toll-free telephone number.

Carrier is a common or contract carrier used to transport Covered Drugs.

Coordinated Website means the neutrally branded website that is jointly operated by approved Program Operators at www.medtakebackoregon.org.

Collection Event means a one-day event supported by MED-Project with oversight by law enforcement at a location accessible to the public for the collection of Covered Drugs from Covered Entities.

DEA is the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration.

DEA Rule is the DEA Final Rule, “Disposal of Controlled Substances,” 79 Fed. Reg. 53,520, codified at 21 C.F.R. § 1300, 1301, 1304, 1305, 1307 and 1317 and adopted on September 9, 2014.

Department means the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality.

DOT is the U.S. Department of Transportation.

Help Desk means resources and support available to Authorized Collectors, Drop-Off Sites, and Mail-Back Distribution Locations provided through the Website, a call center, or oregon@med-project.org.

Historically Underserved Communities means groups of people across the State that are members of the same minority, lower-income, rural, and other historically underserved communities as defined in the Plan.

Inhaler Mail-Back Packages are pre-paid, pre-addressed mail-back packages provided by Vendor for the collection and disposal of inhalers.

Injector Mail-Back Packages are pre-paid, pre-addressed, United States Food and Drug Administration-cleared sharps container mail-back systems provided by Vendor for the collection of Pre-filled Injector Products.

Local Agency Distribution Center means a local or regional household hazardous waste collection center that offers Standard Mail-Back Packages for use by Covered Entities.

Mail-Back Distribution Location means a public, private, or not-for-profit facility, such as a town hall or library, that offers Mail-Back Packages for use by Covered Entities.

Mail-Back Packages are pre-paid, pre-addressed mail-back containers, envelopes, packages, or systems that include Standard Mail-Back Packages, Inhaler Mail-Back Packages, and Injector Mail-Back Packages provided by Vendor for the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs.

Plan is the State of Oregon drug take-back plan presented in this submittal, including as amended or supplemented.

Pre-filled Injector Products are manufactured pre-filled injector products containing Covered Drugs with a retractable needle, or a needle, that has not been exposed.

Program is the Drug Take-Back Program established by this Plan.

Rapid Response is a response provided by Vendor to an incident or other event at a Drop-Off Site requiring an urgent response. Rapid Response does not include emergencies that pose an immediate threat to the environment or health.

Secure Repository means a kiosk supported by MED-Project for the collection of Covered Drugs at a Drop-Off Site. Secure Repositories comply with all applicable laws, rules, and other legal requirements.

Specified Languages are English, and the most commonly spoken languages in the state, as identified by the Oregon Secretary of State under ORS 251.167, and additional languages as determined in consultation with local governments and Historically Underserved Communities.

Standard Mail-Back Packages are pre-paid, pre-addressed mail-back envelopes provided by Vendor for the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs, except for inhalers and Pre-filled Injector Products.

State means the State of Oregon.

Vendor is any vendor hired by MED-Project to provide goods or services under the Program.

Website is the branded website operated by MED-Project and located at www.med-project.org or www.medproject.org.

III. Financing

A. Program Costs

MED-Project USA (“MED-Project”), a Drug Take-Back Organization organized as a non-profit organization exempt from income tax under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, submits this Plan on behalf of the Covered Manufacturers identified in Appendix A and pursuant to ORS 459A.200 to 459A.266. Covered Manufacturers will pay all costs associated with the Program through MED-Project. Program costs will be apportioned among each Covered Manufacturer participating in the Program using a tiering system based on units sold. Costs of the Program are apportioned only among the Covered Manufacturers participating in the Program and not the full list of Covered Manufacturers subject to the Law. Annually, participating Covered Manufacturers identify that they are participating in the Oregon Drug Take-Back Program. MED-Project will provide the Department a list of participating Covered Manufacturers every 60 days. The participating Covered Manufacturers are invoiced for all Program costs and there is no source of funding for the Program outside of participating Covered Manufacturers. Upon request, MED-Project will provide the Department supporting information that participating Covered Manufacturers pay all costs associated with the Program, subject to applicable law, including ORS 459A.236(3). For clarity, MED-Project’s annual report will provide the budget that covers all Program costs that are paid for by Covered Manufacturers who have been or are currently participating in the Program.

Neither MED-Project nor any Authorized Collector will impose a charge against Covered Entities to recoup the costs of the Program.

To demonstrate compliance with ORS 459A.209(2)(f) and ORS 459A.230, MED-Project will submit a State of Oregon-specific audited financial statement based on the calendar year to the Department annually by May 1.

B. Program Budget

MED-Project’s Program budget covers a 12-month period of anticipated operations from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026. In preparing this budget, MED-Project has allocated revenues and expenses in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). The Program budget for total expenditures for this 12-month period is based on forecasts, projections, and other predictive statements that represented MED-Project’s assumptions and expectations in light of the information that was available at the time the Program budget was prepared. MED-Project’s Program budget is based on MED-Project’s knowledge of performance, industry trends, and other factors, and involves risks, variables, and uncertainties. MED-Project’s Program budget is determined from administrative costs, collection and disposal costs, and communications costs. As described in Plan § VI.G., MED-Project will evaluate public awareness which could lead to changes in outreach and education that would affect estimated communications budgets. MED-Project’s actual performance may differ from what is projected in the Program budget. No guarantee is implied as to the accuracy of the Program budget. MED-Project’s Program budget is set forth in Table 1.

C. Financial Health

The MED-Project Program is funded by their participating Covered Manufacturers, as described in Plan § III.A. MED-Project prepares the calendar year budget in advance of the year. After the budget has been finalized, including without limitation through MED-Project Board of Directors approval, participating Covered Manufacturers commit to participate and fund the Program. In addition, during the budget approval process a reserve target is also approved. The reserve fund which covers at least six months, is held by the Program Operator to cover any unanticipated costs as well as anything else that may arise that was not contemplated during the budget preparation. If actual expenditures exceed the budget and reserves, there is a mechanism in place to raise additional funds from participating Covered Manufacturers. In that event, participating Covered Manufacturers could be invoiced unanticipated costs during the current invoicing cycle. Companies participating in MED-Project's program are obligated to pay such costs, which are inclusive of costs for reserves and bad debt. [Appendix A](#) provides a list of the Covered Manufacturers participating in the Program.

- Contracted and employed personnel overhead costs.
- Legal fees.
- Local and state business licensing fees.
- Local, state, and federal taxes.
- Property costs, including rentals.
- Utilities, phone, and internet.
- General equipment and supplies.

² Collection and Disposal Costs take into account:

- Collection, transportation, and disposal of drugs. See Section VII for estimated collection goals associated with the collection and disposal costs.
- Purchase, maintenance, and replacement of Secure Repositories.
- Compensation of Authorized Collectors, if separate from personnel costs covered in the Administrative Costs above.
- Contracted and employed personnel costs associated with collection and disposal.
- Production, distribution, and postage of Mail-Back Packages.

³ Communication Costs take into account:

- Advertising.
- Marketing.
- Contracted and employed personnel costs associated with communication.
- Website creation and maintenance.
- Operation of a toll-free call center.

IV. Management

A. Experience Operating Drug Take-Back Programs

MED-Project USA is a 501(c)(3) non-profit, tax-exempt organization, along with its subsidiaries, that develops and implements household pharmaceutical product stewardship programs across the United States. MED-Project USA's affiliated companies first began operating a program for the collection and disposal of unwanted medicine in 2015 and are currently approved to operate 23 pharmaceutical product stewardship programs across seven states, serving over 92 million residents across the United States.

B. Management of Contracts

MED-Project procures and oversees Vendor services to implement Program logistics along with other selected capabilities. MED-Project has systems in place to establish, maintain, and monitor compliance with its agreements with Authorized Collectors and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs.^{4,5} MED-Project conducts reviews with selected Vendors to address trends and service levels. These systems enable MED-Project to keep its agreements current and avoid potential impacts based on contractual issues on the services provided to the Program.

The services described in the Plan to be provided by Vendors, Authorized Collectors, and others are set forth in contracts with those entities, unless noted otherwise. MED-Project retains legal responsibility to meet all of its obligations under the Plan and applicable laws and regulations. MED-Project recognizes that failure to meet its legal responsibilities under the Plan or ORS 459A.200 et seq., regardless of the cause for such failure, could result in enforcement under ORS 459A.239.

MED-Project maintains an account management team for building and maintaining relationships with Authorized Collectors and Potential Authorized Collectors, both at a corporate and individual level. This team also manages in-person and virtual meetings and presentations with decision-makers at Potential Authorized Collectors to encourage Program participation.

C. Proof of Liability Insurance

MED-Project currently maintains insurance policies, including liability insurance sufficient to cover activities to successfully implement the Program. MED-Project will provide certificates of insurance to the Department upon request.

D. Record-Keeping

MED-Project has systems in place to properly maintain its internal records, including the records required to meet its reporting obligations and to manage its Program. MED-Project's records include, among other things, information about MED-Project communications with Potential Authorized Collectors, participating Drop-Off Sites, collection and disposal of collected Covered Drugs, and Vendor management. MED-Project will also retain records of any audits or inspections of Vendors and Authorized Collectors. MED-Project will retain all records for at least three years or for the period of time required by applicable laws and regulations, whichever is longer, and for longer upon the Department's request. MED-Project will cooperate with requests it receives to audit its records under ORS 459A.236(3) and, in response to such

audit requests, will provide access to the requested records at the Department's headquarters office upon request.

MED-Project also requires that its Vendors and Authorized Collectors maintain certain records, including those required under the DEA Rule, Oregon Board of Pharmacy, and the Law.

E. Reporting

MED-Project will submit an annual report on the development, implementation, and operation of the Program. The annual report will cover a reporting period from July 1 to June 30 and will include the information required in ORS 459A.230. The annual report will include information about engagement with Historically Underserved Communities, including the date and nature of any engagement activities and a summary of any additional services or events proposed or provided for as a result of the engagement with Historically Underserved Communities. For additional services provided during the reporting period, MED-Project's annual report will include relevant metrics for the additional services, which will include the number of Mail-Back Packages provided to Mail-Back Distribution Locations, the weight collected through returned Mail-Back Packages distributed by each Mail-Back Distribution Location, the number of households receiving direct mailers sent per ZIP code, the amount of Covered Drugs collected through Drop-Off Sites, and changes to outreach and educational materials, including the provision of materials in the Specified Languages. MED-Project will provide in the Annual Report the total amount of drugs collected at each unique site in a manner that assists the Department in determining the rate of use of each Drop-Off Site. In addition to the Mail-Back Package annual reporting metrics described above, MED-Project's annual report will also include the number of Injector Mail-Back Packages requested by Drop-Off Sites through the Help Desk to be issued directly to Covered Entities by mail, and the total weight destroyed by this method. The MED-Project 2025/2026 annual report will be the final report to include information on the total number of Injector Mail-Back Packages supplied to each Drop-Off Site during the reporting period and the total weight destroyed by this method.

MED-Project will submit the annual report to the Department by November 1, after the end of each reporting period in a form and manner prescribed by the Department.

MED-Project will provide notice of changes and updates to the Plan as required under ORS 459A.209(5)-(6), 459A.212, and ORS 459A.209(7)(d). MED-Project will provide the Department with a list of participating Covered Manufacturers every 60 days.

F. Compliance Oversight of Service Providers

MED-Project will enter into agreements with all relevant entities participating in the Program before establishing Drop-Off Sites, establishing Mail-Back Distribution Locations, or scheduling Collection Events. MED-Project agreements require that Authorized Collectors and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Compliance with applicable laws encompasses safety and security for the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs. Program policies and procedures for complying with all applicable laws are further discussed in Plan § V.B.

MED-Project will audit Vendor disposal facilities through:

- Annual review of documentation used by Vendors.
- Periodic onsite audits of Vendor disposal facilities at a minimum every 3 to 5 years, and in the event an audit is not completed within 5 years MED-Project will notify the Department. MED-Project understands such an audit cadence aligns with common industry standards for disposal facilities.
- Annual review of processes and procedures for compliance with relevant regulatory requirements.

- Annual review of processes and procedures that provide for the secure collection and disposal of Covered Drugs.

MED-Project will cooperate and coordinate with the Department and the Oregon Board of Pharmacy in their inspection of Drop-Off Sites.

G. Compliance with Applicable Laws

The following sections provide an overview of applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements with which the Program is designed to comply.

1. DEA Controlled Substances Act and Implementing Regulations

Collection of controlled substances is generally limited to Schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substances that are lawfully possessed by an ultimate user. See DEA Rule 21 CFR §§ 1317.75(b); 1317.70(b). Schedule I controlled substances, controlled substances that are not lawfully possessed, and other illicit or dangerous substances will not be collected. Because these provisions of the DEA Rule limit collection of controlled substances to those lawfully possessed by an ultimate user or certain other persons, pharmacies are prohibited from disposing of their own inventory or stock through the Program. See *id.*; see also 21 CFR § 1317.05.

The DEA Rule provides that law enforcement agencies can continue to accept controlled substances for disposal however, the DEA Rule also provides that retail pharmacies, reverse distributors, hospitals/clinics with onsite pharmacies, narcotic treatment programs, and certain other entities, can modify their registration with the DEA to “collectors” and become authorized at their discretion on a voluntary basis to accept controlled substances.

The DEA Rule:

- Provides for the collection of controlled substances at Drop-Off Sites at law enforcement agencies, and registered retail pharmacies, hospitals or clinics with onsite pharmacies, narcotic treatment programs, and certain other entities.
- Provides for the use of mail-back programs to collect controlled substances.
- Establishes detailed collection, recordkeeping, security, and other measures for all approved collection methods.
- Provides that all collected pharmaceutical products be destroyed so that the products are rendered non-retrievable.

Controlled substances collected pursuant to the Program may be commingled with non-controlled substances at Drop-Off Sites and in Standard Mail-Back Packages per the DEA Rule. See 21 CFR §§ 1317.75(b); 1317.70(b).

a. DEA Registration Modification

Pursuant to DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1301.51(b), eligible registrants may modify their registrations to become authorized collectors by submitting a request to the DEA or online at www.DEAdiversion.usdoj.gov. This request must contain:

- The registrant’s name, address, and registration number (as printed on the registration certificate).
- The collection methods the registrant intends to conduct.
- A signature in accordance with DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1301.13(j).

MED-Project will consult with eligible registrants, as requested, regarding how to modify DEA registrations to become Authorized Collectors.

b. Mail-Back Services

Per DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.70(c), Standard Mail-Back Packages⁶ will be:

- Nondescript with no markings or information potentially indicating that they contain Covered Drugs, including controlled substances.
- Water and spill-proof, tamper-evident, tear-resistant, and sealable.
- Pre-addressed with and delivered to Vendor's registered address.
- Provided with a unique identifier enabling tracking.

When using Standard Mail-Back Packages, Covered Entities and persons lawfully entitled to dispose of a Covered Entity/decedent's property will not be required to provide any personally identifiable information. See 21 CFR § 1317.70(d).

Per 21 CFR § 1317.70(e), Vendor will only accept Standard Mail-Back Packages provided by Vendor or packages lawfully forwarded under DEA requirements. Within three business days of receipt, Vendor will notify the DEA if it receives mail-back packages likely containing controlled substances that Vendor did not make available or did not agree to receive per DEA requirements.

Per 21 CFR § 1317.70(f), when Standard Mail-Back Packages are received, only Vendor employees will handle the Standard Mail-Back Packages. Standard Mail-Back Packages will not be opened, x-rayed, analyzed, or otherwise penetrated upon receipt by Vendor.

If Vendor needs to store filled Standard Mail-Back Packages, they will follow all applicable security requirements of DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317, including securely storing Covered Drugs consistent with the requirements for Schedule II controlled substances.

All Covered Drugs will be destroyed promptly at the receiving facility or at a separate location with the approval of DEA as allowed by 21 CFR § 1317.70(a). Vendor will keep all records required under the DEA Rule, including those identified in 21 CFR § 1304.22(f).

c. Collection Events

Pursuant to DEA Rule 21 CFR §§ 1317.65(a), (b), at least one law enforcement officer will oversee collection at Collection Events. Law enforcement officers will maintain control and custody of all Covered Drugs from collection until the Covered Drugs are securely transferred, stored, or destroyed. Only ultimate users in lawful possession of controlled substances Schedules II-V and persons authorized to dispose of an ultimate user decedent's property may transfer these substances to law enforcement during the Collection Event. See DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.65(e). No other person shall handle controlled substances at Collection Events. Vendor may assist law enforcement in the collection of Covered Drugs at Collection Events. See Disposal of Controlled Substances, 79 Fed. Reg. 53520, 53539 (Sept. 9, 2014).

Vendor and law enforcement will maintain all applicable records of removal, storage, or destruction of the collected Covered Drugs in a manner consistent with the law enforcement agency's recordkeeping requirements for illicit controlled substances evidence. See DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.35. Any collected Covered Drugs will be stored to prevent the diversion of controlled substances and consistent with the law enforcement agency's standard procedures for storing illicit controlled substances.

2. United States Department of Transportation and United States Postal Service

Covered Drugs collected at a Drop-Off Site or Collection Event will be prepared for transport and transported in compliance with the applicable requirements under the DOT Hazardous Materials

⁶ Note that Inhaler Mail-Back Packages and Injector Mail-Back Packages are not used to collect controlled substances.

Regulations. Covered Drugs collected at a Drop-Off Site or Collection Event will be packaged and shipped in accordance with an applicable DOT Special Permit.

Covered Drugs collected via Standard Mail-Back Packages, Inhaler Mail-Back Packages, and Injector Mail-Back Packages will be packaged and mailed in compliance with applicable United States Postal Service (“USPS”) requirements.

3. Oregon Board of Pharmacy

The Oregon Board of Pharmacy has promulgated regulations allowing pharmacies in Oregon to become authorized collectors of Covered Drugs in conformance with the DEA Rule. In order to participate in a drug take-back program under OAR 855-041-1046(2), an Oregon pharmacy must notify the Oregon Board of Pharmacy in writing prior to initiating the program and must establish and enforce certain policies and procedures, including:

- Provision of secure location of the Secure Repository, which must be accessible to the public and cannot be placed behind the pharmacy counter; and
- Provision of adequate security measures, including proper installation and maintenance of Secure Repository, tracking of liners, and key accountability; and
- Personnel training and accountability.

As under the DEA Rule, pharmacy personnel are prohibited from counting, sorting, inventorying, or otherwise handling drugs collected. OAR 855-041-1046(3). Pharmacies are also prohibited from disposing of quarantined, recalled, or outdated drugs from pharmacy stock in a Secure Repository. OAR 855-041-1046(4). Pharmacies must maintain all records for 3 years. OAR 855-041-1046(8).

MED-Project requires pharmacies to comply with all applicable laws, including the requirements promulgated by the Oregon Board of Pharmacy. MED-Project will consult with participating pharmacies, as requested, on related topics, including the notifications required by the Oregon Board of Pharmacy, as well as the security measures that MED-Project provides, including proper installation and maintenance of Secure Repositories and tracking of inner liners. MED-Project will work with pharmacies to help pharmacies maintain key accountability and provide appropriate personnel training. For instance, MED-Project's Help Desk will support Authorized Collectors with step-by-step instructions explaining how to service Secure Repositories. See also Plan § V.A.2.a.

4. Oregon Waste-Related Programs

MED-Project, Vendor, and other entities participating in the Program shall comply with any applicable requirements in the State related to the management of solid, hazardous, or other waste. MED-Project will require Authorized Collectors and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs to comply with applicable State waste management requirements. MED-Project will monitor their compliance through various methods including reporting, inspection, or audits.

MED-Project will also require other participating entities to comply with State waste management requirements to the extent applicable.

H. Contact Information for Key Personnel

V. Operation

The following sections describe how the Program will meet the requirements for a collection network under ORS 459A.209, 459A.215, 459A.218, and 459A.221.

A. Collection System

MED-Project has established and will maintain a safe and secure system for collecting Covered Drugs through Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Services, along with Collection Events, as necessary, to supplement Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Services. See [Appendix B](#) for a list of Participating Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations.

1. Solicitation of Potential Authorized Collectors

Through the implementation of MED-Project's Approved Plan, MED-Project identified, solicited, and executed agreements with 237 Authorized Collectors at the time of this Plan submission. An additional three Potential Authorized Collectors have expressed interest in participating in the Program. See [Appendix D](#) for a list of Potential Authorized Collectors that have expressed interest in becoming an Authorized Collector for the Program.

MED-Project anticipates a potential decrease in the number of available authorized collectors due to a number of factors including brick-and-mortar pharmacy closures at a potentially accelerated rate over the coming years and financial pressures on pharmacy retailers leading to constraints on materials, staffing, and space. The changing pharmacy landscape aligns with trends in consumer behavior. Consumers are increasingly relying on online and mail-order pharmacies that are providing central fill, auto-fill, and online delivery services, just as they are increasingly relying on online purchases and at-home deliveries for many consumer products that they used to purchase in-person at brick-and-mortar stores. Residents are also increasingly familiar with and served by pharmacy-related mail-back services. See Section VI.H for details on how MED-Project will conduct outreach with pharmacies that offer online services.

MED-Project will continue to evaluate Potential Authorized Collectors that are eligible and are willing to execute an agreement to participate in the Program. MED-Project will provide convenient services in every county in Oregon as described in this paragraph and will continue to strive to meet the service convenience requirements ("SCR") in ORS 459A.209(2)(i) through a safe and secure system for collecting Covered Drugs through Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Services and may schedule Collection Events as necessary to supplement Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Services. MED-Project will maintain a network of at least 200 Drop-Off Sites while continuing to work towards the SCR in ORS 459A.209(2)(i). MED-Project has identified that 271 Drop-Off Sites across 241 Population Centers are needed to meet the SCR at ORS 459A.209(2)(i) as of September 2025. In the event that MED-Project is not able to reach the SCR in ORS 459A.209(2)(i), MED-Project will address areas not meeting the SCR through the use of additional services subject to the Department's approval. MED-Project will establish Mail-Back Distribution Locations as additional services in the Population Centers not meeting the SCR for Drop-Off Sites. If a Mail-Back Distribution Location cannot be established in a Population Center that does not meet SCR for Drop-Off Sites, MED-Project will provide direct mail to residential households of that Population Center. MED-Project will primarily establish Mail-Back Distribution Locations as additional services in Population Centers not meeting the SCR for Drop-Off Sites. Direct mail will not be relied on for more than 25 percent of Population Centers not meeting the SCR for Drop-Off Sites. MED-Project may also support Collection Events (where law enforcement agencies are willing to oversee the Collection Event). In addition to these additional services, as necessary pursuant to Section V.A.5, MED-Project will annually solicit participation from Local Agency Distribution Centers ("LADCs") to further support convenient and equitable access to dispose of Covered Drugs. These additional services will

provide convenient access where the SCR for Drop-Off Sites is not met, which will be demonstrated through information reported in the annual report.

Based upon the previous reporting period, MED-Project assessed the weight that Drop-Off Sites would collect on a per capita basis⁷ if the SCR was met, and not exceeded, in the 241 Population Centers by Drop-Off Sites ("Potential SCR Drop-Off Site Collection Weight"). MED-Project will annually update the Potential SCR Drop-Off Site Collection Weight based upon previous reporting period collection weights. On a per capita basis, Population Centers where collection services are not currently met by Drop-Off Sites account for approximately 20% of the Potential SCR Drop-Off Site Collection Weight ("Population Centers Not Served By Drop-Off Sites"). The current collection weight goal is approximately 125% of the Potential SCR Drop-Off Site Collection Weight because the current number of Drop-Off Sites exceeds the minimum number required in many of the Population Centers. As a result, MED-Project's collection weight goal more than accounts for the Population Centers Not Served By Drop-Off Sites. MED-Project will additionally support the Population Centers Not Served By Drop-Off Sites through the use of additional services as described above and in the request for a waiver or approval of additional services. MED-Project will annually assess collection services in each county, including the weight collected through additional services as described above, against the Potential SCR Drop-Off Site Collection Weight and adjust services in each county as appropriate.

In the annual report, MED-Project will report on the percent of total weight collected originating from Population Centers in rural areas ("Rural Population Centers"), in four tiers, where the population in the city or town located within a Population Center is (1) under 100,000, (2) under 50,000, (3) under 25,000, and (4) under 10,000 residents (with each of the four categories as a "Rural Population Center Tier") to describe the effectiveness of collection in these rural areas of the State. In each Additional Services Proposal, MED-Project will compare the percentage of the State population residing in Rural Population Centers with the percentage of total collected weight in the State originating from Rural Population Centers to evaluate the convenience and accessibility of its services in accordance with this Plan and the requirements of ORS 459A.218(3). Where a Rural Population Center Tier accounts for a smaller share of total collected weight in the State than its share of the State population, MED-Project will perform additional outreach designed to increase public awareness in rural areas and will describe these efforts and any related modifications in the next applicable annual report. In the event the methods used to foster public awareness require revisions, MED-Project will submit a change request in accordance with ORS 459A.212(1)(e) within 60 days of the annual report.

MED-Project will enter into agreements with any eligible Authorized Collector that is willing to participate as a Drop-Off Site. The following sections describe how MED-Project will solicit Potential Authorized Collectors for the Program.

a. Identifying, Soliciting, and Responding to Potential Authorized Collectors

MED-Project has a process for identifying, soliciting, and responding to Potential Authorized Collectors. MED-Project obtained lists of Potential Authorized Collectors from multiple sources, including the Oregon Board of Pharmacy, the Oregon Department of Public Safety, and the DEA. As required by ORS 459A.215, MED-Project solicited Potential Authorized Collectors before submitting the Plan. MED-Project solicited Potential Authorized Collectors in the State through an opportunity to participate letter. See [Appendix C](#) for a list of all Potential Authorized Collectors MED-Project has solicited. MED-Project will annually solicit available Potential Authorized Collectors who are not participating in a State approved plan in accordance with Plan § V.A.2.j. Additionally, MED-Project will annually solicit Potential Authorized

Collectors in areas that are not meeting the requirements of ORS 459A.209(2)(i) via phone or in-person and will document reasons beyond MED-Project's control as to why a Potential Authorized Collector is not participating in the Program.

MED-Project begins good faith negotiations with all interested Potential Authorized Collectors once the Potential Authorized Collector has expressed interest in participating in the Program. If there remain Potential Authorized Collectors that have not already joined a program, a Potential Authorized Collector can contact MED-Project for Program information by submitting a written expression of interest in participating in the Program by contacting the Help Desk or completing an online questionnaire. MED-Project will commence good faith negotiations by initiating a process that includes:

- Conducting an eligibility assessment;
- Providing a questionnaire to collect information required for an agreement if the Potential Authorized Collector is eligible to participate in the Program;
- Providing a draft agreement based on information provided in the returned questionnaire;
- Providing a draft written offer to participate stating that the Potential Authorized Collector has reviewed MED-Projects' draft agreement, identified no significant objections to the draft agreement, agreed to comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements, and agreed to participate in the Program without compensation;
- Receiving a signed offer to participate from the Potential Authorized Collector.

If a Potential Authorized Collector identifies objections to the MED-Project draft agreement, MED-Project will negotiate with that Authorized Collector to reach an agreement that will allow it to participate in the Program on terms consistent with the scope of the Drug Take-Back Law and Regulations. MED-Project will not exclude Potential Authorized Collectors from Program participation when agreement terms cannot be reached, unless the Potential Authorized Collector is unwilling to agree to terms regarding compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, other legal requirements or any other terms consistent with the scope of the Plan. MED-Project seeks to enter into agreements with any eligible Potential Authorized Collector that is willing to participate as a Drop-Off Site.

ORS 459A.215(1)(b) required Program Operators to "[e]nter into agreements with all willing authorized collectors [. . .]" before submitting a plan to the Department. See [Appendix B](#) providing a list of Authorized Collectors that were established by MED-Project before this Plan was submitted to the Department.

b. Authorized Collector Agreements

Agreements with Authorized Collectors require that the Authorized Collector comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements regarding the collection, handling, processing, and disposal of Covered Drugs. MED-Project will work with Authorized Collectors to ensure that they are registered collectors in accordance with the DEA Rule, that they provide any required notifications to the Oregon Board of Pharmacy if applicable, and that other regulatory requirements are met.

See Plan § V.B.3. for additional discussion of the elements of agreements with Authorized Collectors.

2. Drop-Off Sites

MED-Project seeks to provide convenient services across the State by establishing at least a Drop-Off Site that is open to the public in each county and Population Center, plus an additional Drop-Off Site for every 50,000 residents of an incorporated city or town within a Population Center. MED-Project has identified that 271 Drop-Off Sites across 241 Population Centers are needed to meet the SCR at ORS 459A.209(2)(i) as of September 2025. MED-Project will rely on the [annual estimate of the population of](#)

[cities and counties by Portland State University](#) as required by ORS 190.520(1)(a) to identify incorporated cities and towns and determine the number of residents in a Population Center.

Pursuant to ORS 459A.209(4), MED-Project seeks to locate Drop-Off Sites throughout each Population Center to provide reasonably convenient and equitable access to all residents of the Population Center. To meet this requirement, MED-Project will strive to locate Drop-Off Sites so that 90% of Covered Entities in the Population Center will live within a 20-minute drive of a Drop-Off Site in that Population Center.

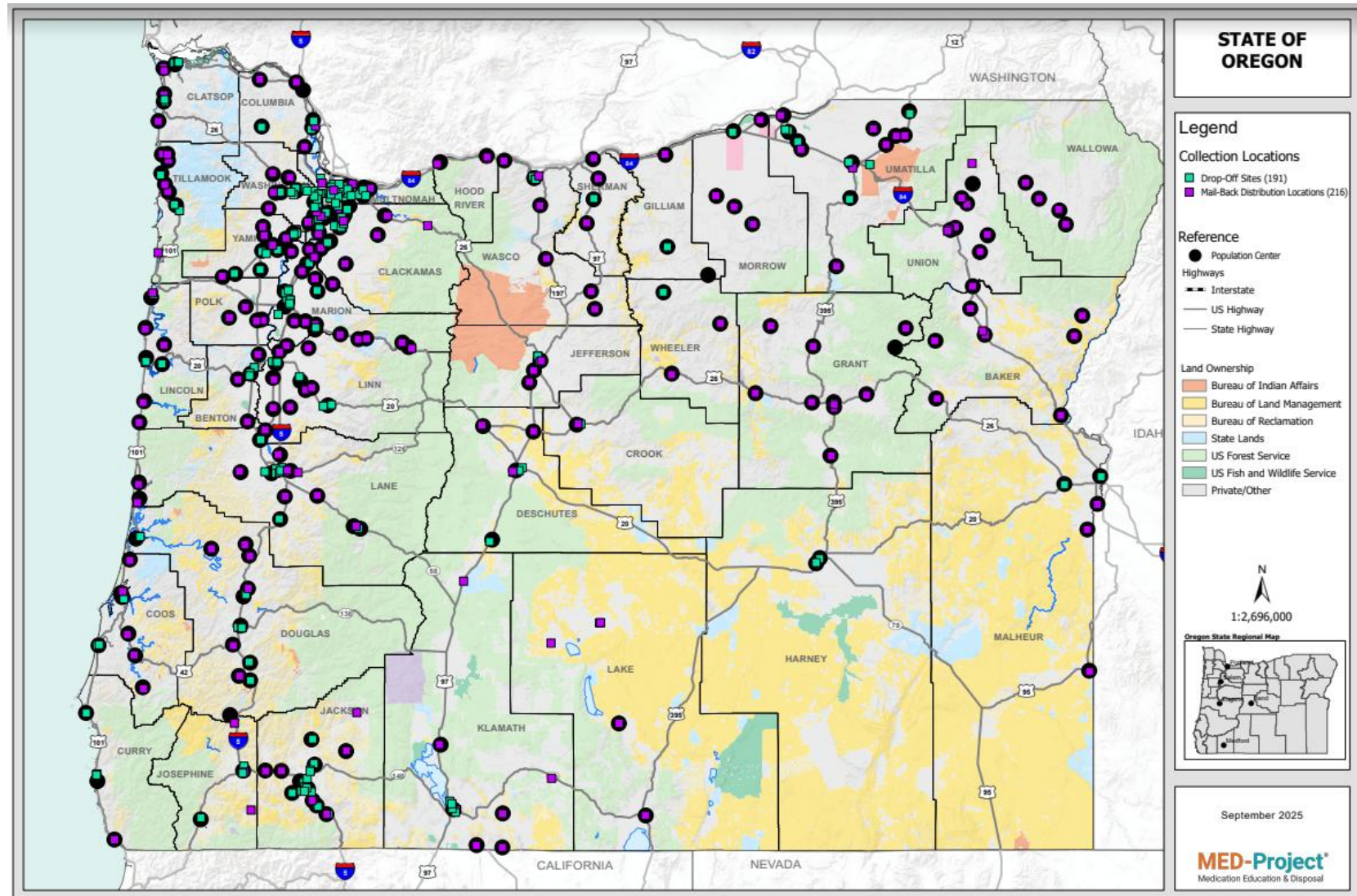


Figure 1: Oregon Population Center Map

Figure 1 provides a map showing all Population Centers in the State of Oregon. For each Population Center, Figure 1 shows, as of September 4, 2025, MED-Project's current Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations.

Consistent with OAR 340-098-0300, MED-Project recognizes that reasonably convenient and equitable access to all residents includes access for Historically Underserved Communities. MED-Project has analyzed demographic data and other information from the United States Census Bureau and the American Community Survey across the State to identify Historically Underserved Communities. MED-Project has met with third parties like Oregon's Kitchen Table to identify Historically Underserved Communities and engage with such communities to better understand whether the Program provides them reasonably convenient and equitable access. MED-Project has also met with Oregon Hospice & Palliative Care Association, Washington County Health & Human Services and consulted with Local Health Jurisdictions through which it received additional feedback on working with all the residents of Oregon including Historically Underserved Communities. MED-Project may also continue to rely on resources recommended by the Department, including the Oregon Health Authority's list of local public health authorities. MED-Project will use the listed characteristics below to identify Historically Underserved Communities and looks forward to input it receives through its collaborations with others.

- Households with income under 200% of the federal poverty level.
- Minority.
- People over the age of 65.
- Tribal communities.
- People living in rural communities, as identified by the Census Bureau.

To provide reasonably convenient and equitable access to Historically Underserved Communities, MED-Project will solicit feedback throughout Oregon by working with third parties to offer engagement opportunities, such as interviews and community conversations. These efforts will include outreach to local health jurisdictions, hospice programs, and selected community groups. Based on the feedback received, MED-Project will evaluate whether additional services are needed and will respond accordingly to the input gathered from Historically underserved Communities. Such additional activities may include:

- Soliciting additional drop-off sites identified by Historically Underserved Communities.
- Providing additional services like Mail-Back Distribution Locations to provide reasonably convenient and equitable access to Historically Underserved Communities.
- Advertising services in languages other than English spoken by Historically Underserved Communities.
- Conducting ongoing outreach to community-based organizations.
- Developing educational materials or outreach to specifically foster awareness of the Drug Take-Back Program in Historically Underserved Communities.

Through these efforts, MED-Project will solicit feedback from Historically Underserved Communities and adapt its Program, including, as appropriate, service offerings and outreach programming.

a. Safe and Secure Drop-Off Site Operations

All Secure Repositories in the Program will be securely placed and maintained inside an Authorized Collector's physical location in accordance with DEA Rule 21 CFR §§ 1317.75(d)(1) and 1317.35(a)(3). Secure Repositories at a retail pharmacy or hospital/clinic with an onsite pharmacy must be located in an area that is open to the public. MED-Project will verify through virtual monitoring and/or direct contact that the Drop-Off Sites are open and operational by monitoring Drop-Off Site operation status on a monthly basis. MED-Project, in a form and manner requested by the Department, will notify the Department of the status of Participating Drop-Off Sites monthly.

Additionally, MED-Project will provide for semi-annual inspections with the Drop-Off Sites. During the semi-annual inspection of each Secure Repository and otherwise as appropriate, MED-Project will:

- Review key aspects of the instructions at the Drop-Off Site;

- Review safety and security procedures;
- Verify Secure Repository signage is in a clear and visible location;
- Review Secure Repository maintenance and operations to ensure compliance with the Drug Take-Back Law;
- Review instructions and options for ordering additional liners, supplies, educational materials, and Injector Mail-Back Packages on behalf of Covered Entities for direct shipment to the Covered Entity, as needed;
- Review training materials available, including materials on monitoring and servicing Secure Repositories to avoid reaching capacity and supply replenishment ordering systems, as needed; and
- Provide reminders of the resources available through the Help Desk.

MED-Project will conduct additional follow-up with specific Secure Repositories as needed, to ensure compliance with ORS 459A.218.

Upon executing an agreement with the Authorized Collector and once a Participating Authorized Collector has agreed to an installation schedule, MED-Project will provide for the delivery of the Secure Repository for installation at no cost to the Authorized Collector, as required under 459A.233. MED-Project will conduct a pre-installation site visit at each Drop-Off Site, provide guidance and materials upon installation, and conduct follow up outreach to the Drop-Off Site after installation to provide support and guidance. As part of this engagement, MED-Project will provide the Authorized Collector with access to training materials, including information on the proper handling of the Secure Repository inner liners, compliant operation of the Secure Repository, step-by-step instructions for the proper preparation, removal, packaging, and shipping of the inner liner, and related template forms. MED-Project will also instruct Authorized Collectors on how to monitor and self-assess their Secure Repositories to identify, among other issues, any maintenance concerns and whether the Secure Repository is at capacity. These materials will be provided through the Help Desk, along with additional resources like printed instruction materials. MED-Project will install the Secure Repository unless requested otherwise by the Drop-Off Site.

Secure Repositories will accept all Covered Drugs from Covered Entities, except as described in Plan § V.A.2.i. MED-Project will remove the signage from each Secure Repository that prohibits Covered Entities from depositing Pre-filled Injector Products and update with signage indicating acceptance of Pre-filled Injector Products. See Appendix E. Additionally, Drop-Off Sites may order Injector Mail-Back Packages on behalf of Covered Entities via the Help Desk for delivery to the Covered Entity by mail, as needed. MED-Project will provide Drop-Off Sites with signage for the public on how to obtain Injector Mail-Back Packages. See Appendix H.

At retail pharmacies, Secure Repositories will be placed in the immediate proximity of a designated area where controlled substances are stored and at which an employee is present (*e.g.*, can be seen from the counter), pursuant to DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.75(d)(2). At hospitals or clinics with an onsite pharmacy, Secure Repositories will be placed in an area regularly monitored by employees but not near areas of the facility where urgent or emergency care is provided. DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.75(d)(2)(i). At narcotic treatment facilities, Secure Repositories will be placed in a room that does not contain any other controlled substances and is securely locked with controlled access. See DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.75(d)(2)(ii).

Drop-Off Site and Authorized Collector employees, Vendor, and Carrier will manage Covered Drugs in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.

Authorized Collector employees will follow DEA requirements for servicing Secure Repositories. Per these requirements:

- Authorized Collector employee(s) shall hold the two keys to unlock the Secure Repository.

- Vendor and Authorized Collectors participating in the Plan shall keep all records required under the DEA Rule and Oregon Board of Pharmacy regulations.
- Inner liners provided for the Secure Repository shall be opaque to prevent visual recognition of the contents.

Each inner liner and box provided by Vendor will be pre-paid and pre-addressed for transport and disposal.

When servicing a Secure Repository, Authorized Collector employee(s) will:

- Check the Secure Repository for any damage.
- Unlock the Secure Repository and immediately remove and seal the inner liner following procedures meeting all DEA requirements.
- Replace the inner liner and box with a replenishment inner liner and box provided by Vendor.
- Match the unique identifier of the inner liner to the tracking number on the shipping label.
- Package the inner liner for transport.
- Prepare the materials for shipment and perform applicable pre-transportation functions to comply with the DOT Hazardous Materials Regulations and any applicable requirements under the Oregon Department of Transportation.
- Schedule a pick-up from the Carrier to be completed within two business days or offer the package holding the sealed inner liner for pick-up by routine Carrier service at the Drop-Off Site.

Authorized Collector employee(s) will maintain control of the inner liner at all times. The Drop-Off Site will store the inner liner in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements until Carrier pick-up.

b. Secure Repository and Inner Liner Specifications

Pursuant to DEA Rule 21 CFR §§ 1317.75(e) and (f), Secure Repositories will:

- Be securely fastened to a permanent structure.
- Be securely locked, substantially constructed containers with a permanent outer container and removable inner liner.
- Include a small opening in the outer container that allows contents to be added to the inner liner but does not allow removal of the inner liner's contents.
- Prominently display a sign indicating that only Schedule II-V controlled and non-controlled substances are acceptable to be placed in the Secure Repository.
- Have the small opening in the outer container that can be locked or made inaccessible to the public when a Drop-Off Site employee is not present. DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.75(f).

The proposed design of the Secure Repository for a pharmacy or narcotic treatment program satisfies these requirements through heavy gauge steel and multiple locking mechanisms, including:

- A locking mechanism on the drop-slot.
- A tamper-resistant drop-slot.
- Commercial hinges.

The locking mechanism on the drop-slot will prevent Secure Repository overflow once the Drop-Off Site locks the container upon reaching its maximum level. When MED-Project installs a Secure Repository and periodically thereafter, MED-Project trains Drop-Off Site staff to monitor the Secure Repository to prevent overflow. MED-Project provides temporary signage to be placed on the Secure Repository when it is locked; the temporary signage will tell Covered Entities how to find other Drop-Off Sites or request a Mail-Back Package while the Secure Repository is locked. MED-Project will also offer Drop-Off Sites the opportunity to register and request written materials that provide information about the Program and the

Website and Call Center so that Covered Entities are aware of the Program and understand how to look up locations of Drop-Off Sites and/or request Mail-Back Packages.

MED-Project Secure Repositories will come with signage required under the DEA Rule⁸. MED-Project will include signage on the Secure Repository that will allow Covered Entities to provide feedback and report issues, such as whether a Secure Repository is out of service.

Under DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.60(a), Secure Repository inner liners will:

- Be waterproof, tamper-evident, and tear-resistant.
- Be removable and sealable immediately upon removal without emptying or touching Secure Repository contents.
- Make the contents of the inner liner not viewable from the outside when sealed.
- Clearly indicate the size of the inner liner.
- Bear a permanent, unique identifier for tracking purposes.

The inner liners will have a capacity range of 30 to 40 gallons and will meet any requirements under a DOT Special Permit.

While the DEA Rule does not require law enforcement agency Secure Repositories to meet these same requirements, MED-Project will offer these Secure Repositories and inner liners to law enforcement agencies.

c. Secure Repository Collection System Standards

21 CFR § 1317.75(g) provides that pharmacy and narcotic treatment program Secure Repository inner liner installation or removal shall be performed “by or under the supervision of at least two employees of the authorized collector.” 21 CFR § 1317.60 limits inner liner access to employees of the collector and requires two employees to seal the inner liner upon its removal from the permanent outer container.

The pharmacy and narcotic treatment program Secure Repository sealed inner liner must not be opened, x-rayed, analyzed, or otherwise penetrated. See DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.60(c). 21 CFR § 1317.75(c) prohibits the counting, sorting, inventorying, or individual handling of any substances deposited into a Secure Repository. The Authorized Collector will document the secure storage of the packaged inner liner onsite in accordance with 21 CFR § 1304.22(f)(2)(iv) before a common carrier picks it up.

Authorized Collectors participating in the Program shall keep all records required under the DEA Rule, including those required under 21 CFR §§ 1304 and 1317.35. At Drop-Off Sites that are law enforcement agencies, Vendor and the law enforcement agency shall keep any records of removal, storage, or destruction of the collected Covered Drugs in a manner consistent with the law enforcement agency’s recordkeeping requirements for illicit controlled substances evidence per DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317.35. Upon request from the Department, MED-Project will work with Vendors to make relevant records available.

The law enforcement agency shall store Covered Drugs in a manner to prevent the diversion of controlled substances consistent with its standard procedures for storing illicit controlled substances. Collected Covered Drugs shall be transferred to the disposal facility in a manner to prevent the diversion of Covered

⁸ Specifically, as required under 21 CFR § 1317.75(e)(4), all Secure Repositories will prominently display a sign stating that: “Only Schedule II-V controlled and non-controlled substances that are lawfully possessed by the ultimate user are acceptable to be placed in the kiosk. Schedule I controlled substances, illicit or dangerous substances, and any controlled substances not lawfully possessed by the ultimate user may not be placed in the kiosk.”

Drugs and consistent with the law enforcement agency's standard procedures for transferring illicit controlled substances.

d. Secure Repository Service Schedule

MED-Project provides for the collection, transportation, and disposal of Covered Drugs at no cost to Authorized Collectors. Authorized Collector's employee(s) will prepare an inner liner for shipment following instructions provided by Vendor in accordance with DEA regulations. Authorized Collector employee(s) will seal the full inner liner for packaging and transport and will schedule pick-up by Carrier at a time of their choosing or offer the packaged inner liner during a regular Carrier pick-up. Under DEA regulations, the pharmacy and narcotic treatment program Authorized Collector employees will document each phase of the process. See 21 CFR § 1304.22(f)(2). The Authorized Collector employee(s) will then place an empty inner liner in the Secure Repository upon its removal and activate a transportation order to pick up the sealed and packaged full inner liner. The Authorized Collector will receive replenishment inner liners and boxes automatically. This replenishment system stocks the Authorized Collector with spare inner liners and boxes before exhausting onsite supplies. MED-Project and Vendor monitor the inner liner management activity through Vendor and Carrier's transportation tracking system. The Authorized Collectors may securely store the packaged inner liner prior to Carrier pick-up depending on pick-up timing and Authorized Collector preferences. MED-Project also provides for monitoring Drop-Off Site collection frequency through inspections. See Plan Section V.A.2.a.

Once Carrier picks up the packaged inner liner, the packaged inner liner is tracked by the Carrier's tracking system until it is scanned for receipt by the reverse distributor Vendor, weighed, and destroyed.

e. Service Procedures for Secure Repositories That Are Full Prior to Service

MED-Project will manage a Help Desk available through the Website, Call Center, and oregon@med-project.org. Authorized Collectors will participate in a process designed to make an inventory of replenishment inner liners and boxes available onsite. Authorized Collectors will automatically receive replenishment inner liners and boxes based on historical usage when two replenishment inner liners and boxes remain onsite. An Authorized Collector can order additional inner liners and boxes through a system designed to fulfill orders within two to three business days. MED-Project can work with an Authorized Collector to adjust the number and frequency of replenishment inner liners and boxes. MED-Project will manage requests for additional inner liners and boxes through the Help Desk.

f. Maintenance and Cleaning of Secure Repositories

When servicing a Secure Repository, Authorized Collector employees will inspect the Secure Repository for any needed maintenance, including cleaning. The Authorized Collector employees will submit any maintenance requests through the Help Desk. MED-Project will provide for the inspection of Secure Repositories on a semi-annual basis to monitor for general wear and tear and clean the Secure Repository as necessary to maintain proper function.

Maintenance requests can be placed through the Help Desk. MED-Project will assess maintenance requests and initiate a response via a system designed to respond within one business day. Most maintenance requests will be resolved within 2 business days. Minor maintenance issues that can be resolved onsite by the initial visit by a technician will be resolved within 5 business days.

g. Additional Collections or Other Secure Repository Issues

Authorized Collectors needing to order additional inner liners and boxes can do so through the Help Desk. For further discussion of how MED-Project's Program anticipates and addresses Drop-Off Site service needs, including the need for inner liners and boxes, see Plan § V.A.2.e. above. Authorized Collectors will be able to log into the Website, confirm their site information, and have access to instructional materials, including written instructions, downloadable forms, and/or video instruction guides.

Authorized Collectors will also be able to request step-by-step instructions for servicing a Secure Repository by contacting the Help Desk. Requests received from Authorized Collectors will be returned as soon as practicable and in no longer than one business day. Covered Entities can report if a Secure Repository is unavailable through the Help Desk. MED-Project will initiate a response via a system designed to respond to reported issues within one business day and will promptly verify Secure Repositories are open and available to the public. MED-Project will monitor and maintain records of Secure Repository availability.

See Plan §§ V.A.2.e., V.A.2.f., and V.A.2.k. for discussion of how MED-Project and its Vendors respond to unplanned events, maintenance requests, or other Secure Repository issues.

h. Secure Repository Signage

Secure Repository signage will prominently display a toll-free telephone number and the Coordinated Website for the Program so members of the public can report a full or damaged kiosk, inquire about the Program, or provide feedback to MED-Project about the Program. [Appendix E](#) provides sample images of the MED-Project Secure Repository and Secure Repository signage.

i. Drop-Off Sites at Long-Term Care Facilities

For Secure Repositories hosted at long-term care facilities, their agreements with MED-Project may need to vary from what is described elsewhere in the Plan in order to comply with all applicable laws. For instance, agreements governing the placement of a Secure Repository at a long-term care facility will require that Secure Repositories be available for use only to individuals who reside or have resided at those facilities, as required under ORS 459A.218(2)(f).

j. Maintenance of the Drop-Off Site Network

To maintain a network of Drop-Off Sites, MED-Project will periodically solicit all available Potential Authorized Collectors no less than annually in alignment with the reporting year. MED-Project will solicit newly available Potential Authorized Collectors upon becoming aware of such Potential Authorized Collectors. MED-Project will evaluate the need for additional Drop-Off Sites based on population growth annually as provided by Portland State University's [annual estimate of population of cities and counties](#). As described in Plan § VI.B., MED-Project will conduct ongoing outreach to Historically Underserved Communities, and, as part of that outreach, MED-Project will solicit feedback on the convenience of the Program.

Potential Authorized Collectors will also be able to learn more about participating in the Program and express interest in participating by visiting the Website or calling the Help Desk.

k. Unplanned Security Events

An unplanned major security event may necessitate service at a Drop-Off Site. An unplanned major security event, such as a flood, earthquake, or fire, may jeopardize the security characteristics of the Secure Repository as well as the structural integrity of the Drop-Off Site. Such events may require the involvement of law enforcement, fire, or other emergency service personnel. Drop-Off Site employees will be directed to call 911 in situations posing an immediate threat to the environment or health. Once the area is safe for access, MED-Project will notify the Vendor to assess and, as appropriate, dispatch rapid responders to secure the Secure Repository and remove its contents. MED-Project will report such unplanned major security events to the Department within 10 business days of learning of the event including possible temporary suspension of services and any disagreement between the Authorized Collector and the Program Operator about the response to an unplanned major security event.

Vendor maintains a network of rapid responders that can be contacted in the case of an incident or other event requiring a Rapid Response. Rapid responders will bring all necessary equipment to manage the specific needs of the Drop-Off Site requiring a Rapid Response.

Along with unplanned major security event preparedness, Vendor provides timely responses to events that may cause an inconvenience to the Drop-Off Site. In situations requiring Rapid Response that do not require the involvement of emergency service personnel, such as a Secure Repository that is leaking or giving off an odor, the Drop-Off Site will place a service request through the Help Desk.

MED-Project will include in the annual report a description of any Authorized Collector requests for a Rapid Response that were not provided to the Authorized Collector.

MED-Project will update any changes to Authorized Collectors information on the Website, Coordinated Website and Call Center reflecting Drop-Off Site status, such as hours of operation, each business day.

I. Waivers or Approval of Additional Services and Events

In counties where there are not enough Drop-Off Sites to meet the convenient service requirement in ORS 459A.209(2)(i) due to a lack of Potential Authorized Collectors available or willingness to participate in the Program, MED-Project will seek to obtain concurrence for additional services, including Mail-Back Services, LADCs, direct mailings, and Collection Events, from the affected local government. In a Population Center where the convenient service requirement in ORS 459A.209 is not met, MED-Project will also seek to obtain concurrence for additional services, including Mail-Back Services, LADCs and Collection Events, from the appropriate local governments in the affected Population Center. Where, for example, there are limited opportunities for establishing a Mail-Back Distribution Location, LADCs, or Collection Event or where Mail-Back Distribution Locations or Collection Events are not easily accessible to community members, MED-Project may also promote the availability of Mail-Back Services or distribute Standard Mail-Back Packages directly to all Covered Entities.

For the counties and Population Centers described above, MED-Project will take the following steps:

- **Solicitation of Potential Authorized Collectors:** As described in Plan § V.A.1.a, MED-Project will undertake good faith efforts to solicit Potential Authorized Collectors and enter into agreements with them. MED-Project will document those efforts and any reasons a Drop-Off Site cannot be established or maintained, including any conditions for participation on which MED-Project and the Potential Authorized Collector could not agree. MED-Project will continue to solicit Potential Authorized Collectors in the affected county or Population Center on at least an annual basis.
- **Consultation with Local Governments and Historically Underserved Communities:** MED-Project will assess how the proposed services and, as applicable, Collection Events will provide reasonably convenient access to all residents in the affected county or Population Center. To do so, MED-Project will reach out to appropriate local government representatives to assess the needs of the local community and evaluate how the proposed services address those needs. MED-Project will also reach out to organizations representing and working with Historically Underserved Communities to engage those communities and solicit feedback on the proposed services. MED-Project will work with Oregon's Kitchen Table to facilitate its work with Historically Underserved Communities.
- **Concurrence on Proposed Services:** MED-Project will work with the appropriate local government representatives in the affected county or Population Center to obtain their concurrence on the proposed services. If no such concurrence is obtained, MED-Project will document why MED-Project could not obtain such concurrence.

MED-Project will request a waiver or approval of additional services in the counties and Population Centers described above. MED-Project's request will include a description and timeline for implementation of proposed services and demonstrate:

- **Status of Solicitation of Potential Authorized Collectors:** Good faith efforts to solicit and enter into agreements with Potential Authorized Collectors in the affected county or Population Center, such as through outreach to identify, contact, and engage with Potential Authorized Collectors.
- **Description of Areas without Drop-Off Sites:** Why a Drop-Off Site cannot be established or maintained in the affected county or Population Center, including an explanation of any conditions for participation on which MED-Project and a Potential Authorized Collector could not agree.
- **Explanation of Reasonably Convenient and Equitable Access:** How the proposed services and, as applicable, Collection Events will provide reasonably convenient and equitable access to all residents in the affected county or Population Center, and planned or ongoing engagement with minority, lower-income, rural and other historically underserved communities to help ensure this. MED-Project will include a timeline for such engagement and provide updates to the Department on the outcomes of any planned engagement with Historically Underserved Communities. MED-Project will also summarize such engagement in its annual report.
- **Consultation with Local Governments:** Concurrence by the appropriate local governments in the affected county or Population Center with the proposed services and, as applicable, Collection Events, or an explanation of why MED-Project could not obtain such concurrence.
- **Ongoing Activities and Next Steps:** Commitment to solicit Potential Authorized Collectors for the affected county or Population Center on at least an annual basis.

3. Mail-Back Services

MED-Project will provide three types of Mail-Back Packages, including Standard Mail-Back Packages, Inhaler Mail-Back Packages, and Injector Mail-Back Packages, at no cost to Covered Entities and in-home hospice providers. All Mail-Back Packages will have inserts that provide:

- Multilingual instructions for using the Mail-Back Package.
- A description of the types of Covered Drugs that may go into the Mail-Back Package.
- Instructions for returning the Mail-Back Package.
- Information about other options for disposing of Covered Drugs through the Program.

Appendix F provides sample mockups of the Mail-Back Package inserts.

a. Access to Mail-Back Services

MED-Project will receive requests for Mail-Back Packages from Covered Entities through the Coordinated Website and Call Center. Covered Entity requests for Mail-Back Packages through the Call Center can be taken by an agent without requiring the Covered Entity to visit the Website. Covered Entities are able to request the number of Mail-Back Packages sufficient to support the volume of unwanted or expired Covered Drugs a resident is seeking to dispose of.

In areas of the State where Mail-Back Distribution Locations are available, Covered Entities will be able to obtain Mail-Back Packages at a physical location where Mail-Back Packages are provided. The addresses of Mail-Back Distribution Locations are provided on the Website and Coordinated Website.

A General Delivery service to order Mail-Back Packages is available to residents of Oregon when a permanent address is not available. The General Delivery service will deliver the Mail-Back Packages to the nearest U.S. Post Office that is participating as a General Delivery site.

MED-Project will also provide Mail-Back Packages to in-home hospice service providers upon request for use by the hospice services patient. In-home hospice service providers will be able to request Mail-Back

Packages through the Help Desk. In-home hospice facilities that require bulk shipments of Mail-Back Packages can become a Mail-Back Distribution Location.

b. Mail-Back Package Request Fulfillment

Requests for Mail-Back Packages from Covered Entities and in-home hospice service providers will be processed through MED-Project's fulfillment system. Covered Entities and in-home hospice facilities will receive a message on the Website confirming an order was placed. Covered Entities and in-home hospice service providers can contact MED-Project through the Website or the Help Desk to resolve any issues with orders. Mail-Back Packages will be shipped to Covered Entities and in-home hospice service providers within five to ten business days of their request.

Covered Entities will be directed to follow the instructions provided with the Mail-Back Package and place their Covered Drugs in the Mail-Back Package. Returned Mail-Back Packages will be sent to an approved facility and handled in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Each Mail-Back Package will have a unique identifier for tracking.

Upon arriving at a disposal facility, Mail-Back Packages will be scanned for receipt verification, weighed, and then destroyed. Any storage of filled Standard Mail-Back Packages by Vendor will comply with the applicable security requirements of DEA Rule 21 CFR § 1317. All Mail-Back Packages will be destroyed promptly.

c. Mail-Back Services Promotion to Covered Entities and In-Home Hospice Service Providers

MED-Project will promote Mail-Back Services through media outreach and written materials. More information about how MED-Project will inform Covered Entities and in-home hospice service providers about the availability of Mail-Back Services is provided in Plan § VI.D.

d. Mail-Back Packages

Appendix G provides sample images of the Mail-Back Packages.

e. Mail-Back Distribution Locations

MED-Project may establish Mail-Back Distribution Locations as additional services in counties or Population Centers where there are not enough Drop-Off Sites to meet the convenient service requirement. Mail-Back Distribution Locations will be in staffed public, private, and/or not-for-profit facilities, which may include libraries, town halls, fire stations, or law enforcement agencies, and will distribute Mail-Back Packages to Covered Entities. In the event a Mail-Back Distribution Location does not have the Mail-Back Package requested by a Covered Entity, the Mail-Back Distribution Location can order the Mail-Back Package needed or can direct the Covered Entity to MED-Project materials on how to order the Mail-Back Package needed. Appendix B provides a list of Participating Mail-Back Distribution Locations as of September 4, 2025. MED-Project will notify the Department within 30 days of any changes to the list of Participating Mail-Back Distribution Locations. MED-Project, in a form and manner requested by the Department, will notify the Department of the status of participating Mail-Back Distribution Locations monthly.

Mail-Back Distribution Locations will be offered signage indicating that the site offers Mail-Back Packages, as well as written materials with more information about MED-Project's Program offerings, like brochures. See Appendix H. The Mail-Back Packages themselves will include instructional materials for using and returning the Mail-Back Package. See Appendix E.

The fulfillment system will be designed to provide reminders to Mail-Back Distribution Locations to help maintain inventory. Mail-Back Distribution Locations may request Mail-Back Packages through the Help Desk in addition to ordering additional signage, promotional materials, or the Standard Mail-Back

Package display. See [Appendix H](#) for samples of promotional materials. Requests for Mail-Back Packages will be managed by a fulfillment system designed to ship requested Mail-Back Packages within 2 to 3 business days of a request. MED-Project will monitor requests from Mail-Back Distribution Locations to understand usage and the inventory of Mail-Back Packages at these locations. The fulfillment system will be designed to monitor services and provide reminders to Mail-Back Distribution Locations to help maintain inventory that satisfies the volume of requests at the site. MED-Project will monitor for excessive requests that could indicate that Mail-Back Packages are being distributed in a way that is inconsistent with the Program.

MED-Project will provide for annual reviews with the Mail-Back Distribution Locations. These reviews could be conducted through an in-person review, phone review, or through forms filled out by the Mail-Back Distribution Location. During the annual review of each Mail-Back Distribution Location and otherwise as appropriate, MED-Project will:

- Review key aspects of the instructions at the Mail-Back Distribution Location;
- Verify that Mail-Back Packages are being distributed;
- Assess the status of inventory of Mail-Back Packages at the site;
- Assess if additional educational materials are needed and review instructions for ordering additional Mail-Back Packages, supplies, educational materials, and Standard Mail-Back Package displays;
- Provide reminders of the resources available through the Help Desk.

MED-Project will conduct additional follow-up with specific Mail-Back Distribution Locations as necessary.

MED-Project will provide Standard Mail-Back Packages, Inhaler Mail-Back Packages, and Injector Mail-Back Packages as requested by the Mail-Back Distribution Location. MED-Project's Help Desk will allow Mail-Back Distribution Locations to request Mail-Back Packages in bulk. Mail-Back Distribution Locations are not restricted in the number of Mail-Back Packages that can be distributed to a single Covered Entity sufficient to support the volume of unwanted or expired Covered Drugs a resident is seeking to dispose of.

4. Covered Drug Collection Events

MED-Project may support Collection Events as additional services in Population Centers where MED-Project cannot establish the Drop-Off Sites needed to meet the convenient service requirement. Collection Events will be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements and will be overseen by federal, state, tribal, or local law enforcement. See Plan § IV.G.1.c.

a. Scheduling and Conducting Collection Events

In addition to obtaining concurrence from the appropriate local government in an affected area to schedule a Collection Event and approval from the Department for additional services, MED-Project will contract with local law enforcement to oversee Collection Events. These contracts will provide for the collection, transportation, and disposal of Covered Drugs from Collection Events and include requirements for participating law enforcement.

Collection Events will be staffed in compliance with DEA requirements and as requested by local law enforcement. Any material that is not a Covered Drug or does not meet legal requirements will be rejected.

Covered Drugs will be packaged in inner liners, matched to the unique inner liner identifier on the shipping labels, and the inner liners prepared for shipment in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Collected material will be weighed following the completion of

each Collection Event. MED-Project will cover the costs of these services as well as transportation of sealed inner liners on behalf of and under the oversight of local law enforcement.

Sealed inner liners will remain under the control and custody of law enforcement until a pick-up is scheduled from the law enforcement agency facility to take place within a few business days of the Collection Event.

b. Coordination with Local Solid Waste Management Officials

Once MED-Project has concurrence from the appropriate local government in an affected area to schedule Collection Events, MED-Project will contact the solid waste management officials with jurisdiction over the impacted area to coordinate on the frequency and location of Collection Events to be scheduled. MED-Project will make reasonable efforts to accommodate the frequency and location of Collection Events identified by the local solid waste management officials.

c. Notification of Collection Events

Once MED-Project has coordinated the frequency and location of Collection Events with local solid waste management officials, MED-Project will provide the Department the following information at least 60 days prior to the proposed date for the Collection Event or as soon as practicable, and no less than 15 days prior to the date of a scheduled Collection Event:

- Date of scheduled event.
- Contact information of local solid waste management officials with which Program Operator will coordinate event.
- Contact information of local law enforcement that will oversee the event.
- Vendor to be used at the Collection Event.

d. Collection Event Promotion

MED-Project will promote Collection Events through media outreach and written materials. More information about how MED-Project will inform Covered Entities about the availability of Collection Events is provided in Plan § VI.D.

5. Local Agency Distribution Centers

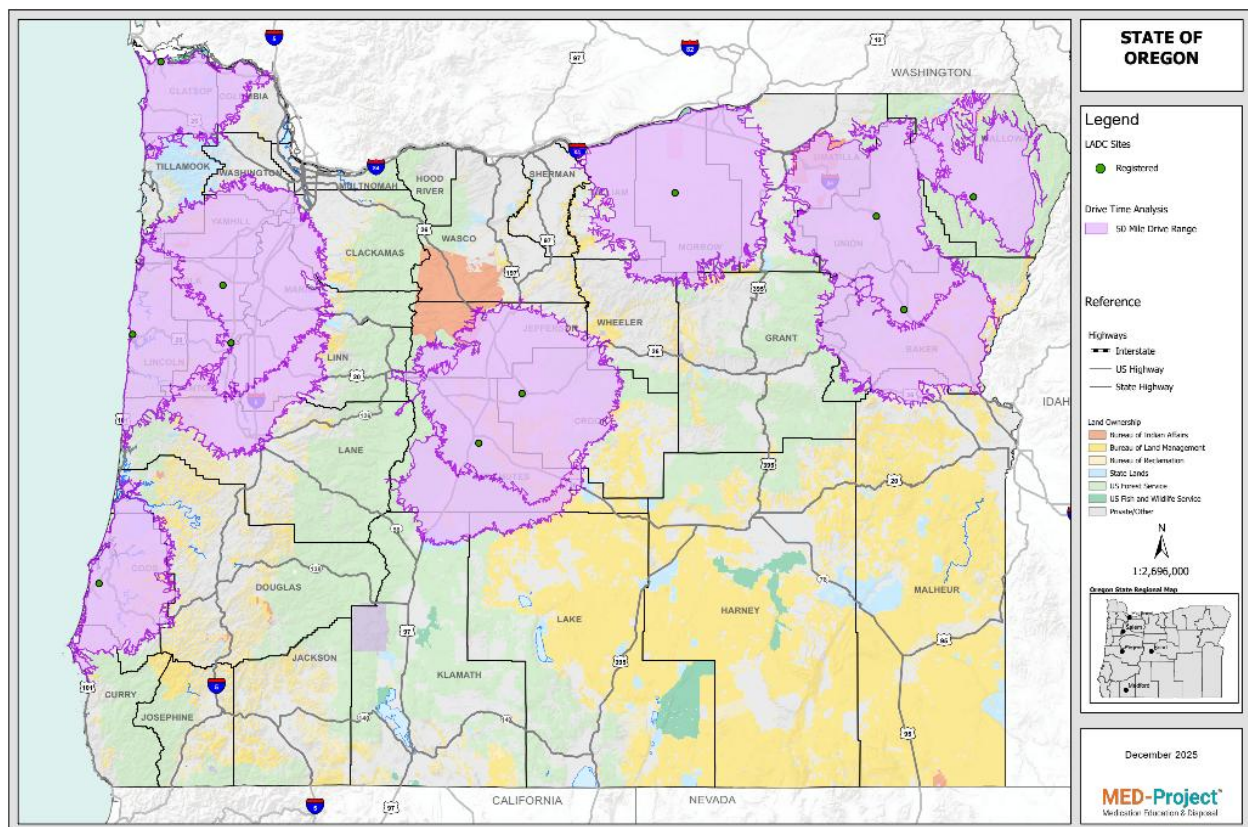
MED-Project will establish Local Agency Distribution Centers (“LADCs”) as additional services in Population Centers where MED-Project cannot establish the Drop-Off Sites needed to meet the SCR. MED-Project believes that having a participating LADC in areas that cannot establish the Drop-Off Sites needed to meet the SCR would be equivalent to Drop-Off Sites in that area as residents already readily utilize these centralized household hazardous waste collection sites for a variety of unwanted or expired household hazardous materials.

MED-Project will use the information listed on the Department of Environmental Quality Household Hazardous Waste website at <https://www.oregon.gov/deq/hazards-and-cleanup/hw/pages/hhw-by-county.aspx> to notify LADCs in the State of the opportunity to participate in the Program and will document the reasons that are beyond MED-Project’s control if a LADC is not participating in the Program.

MED-Project will supply participating LADCs with as many Standard Mail-Back Packages as needed to support the volume of unwanted or expired Covered Drugs a resident is seeking to dispose of. Additionally, MED-Project will provide participating LADCs with Standard Mail-Back Packages for community events and/or informational materials about other Program services, as requested by the participating LADC.

As December 17, 2025, 11 LADCs, of those that have been contacted, have registered to participate in the Program including:

MED-Project will annually report the participation status of LADCs in the Program to the Department.

B. Policies, Procedures, and Management Practices

The following sections describe the policies, procedures, and practices MED-Project will require to ensure that service providers will responsibly manage Covered Drugs in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.

3. Policies and Procedures

The following sections describe the policies and procedures maintained for the Program. The relevant policies and procedures are codified in or required under MED-Project's agreements with its Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs under the Program, Authorized Collectors, Mail-Back Distribution Locations, and law enforcement agencies supporting Collection Events. MED-Project contracts for Vendors, Authorized Collectors, Mail-Back Distribution Locations and Collection Events contain requirements for compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements. Below is a brief summary of some of the elements of those agreements to demonstrate how MED-Project maintains the required policies and procedures.

MED-Project contracts for Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs collected under the Program require that Vendor:

- Follow all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.
- Maintain all professional and governmental permits, licenses, consents, authorizations and certifications required by applicable laws for the performance of Program services.
- Provide Program services in a timely, professional, and commercially diligent manner according to generally accepted industry and professional standards.
- Provide certification that all applicable employee trainings are complete.
- Comply with industry-standard safety and security procedures.
- Immediately notify MED-Project of any action, suit, or proceeding before or by any court or governmental authority that could materially affect Vendor ability to provide Program services.
- Obtain written pre-approval before changing transporters or disposal facilities.
- Use commercially reasonable measures to prevent theft or diversion of Covered Drugs.
- Report safety, security, or other procedural deviations.
- Maintain comprehensive information security programs and notify MED-Project in the event of a data breach.
- Maintain complete and accurate records, such as books, documents, and accounting procedures, and practices. MED-Project may audit such records.

- Provide written reports related to Program services.

Agreements with Authorized Collectors require that the Authorized Collector:

- Comply with all applicable laws regarding the collection, handling, processing, and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Possess all required authorizations to enter into an agreement for Program services.
- Identify a responsible manager and provide qualified staff.
- Have qualified staff unlock and lock the Secure Repository.
- Complete documentation under all applicable laws for Secure Repository delivery, installation, or removal and for Covered Drug collection, storage, transportation, or disposal.
- Securely maintain any documentation required under the Program and provide such documentation to MED-Project upon request.
- Make the Secure Repository available to the public during business hours unless there is a safety, security, service, maintenance, or other condition requiring the Authorized Collector to lock the Secure Repository.
- Promptly notify MED-Project of any service or maintenance concerns, as needed.
- Collect and store Covered Drugs and cause the transportation and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Establish and implement procedures limiting access to Secure Repository keys to qualified staff.
- Lock the Secure Repository and cooperate with MED-Project for Secure Repository removal upon termination of the agreement, as needed.
- Report any theft, unexplained loss, or diversion of Covered Drugs, safety or security problem, or environmental incident.

Agreements with Mail-Back Distribution Locations require that the Mail-Back Distribution Location:

- Distribute Mail-Back Packages to Covered Entities in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements.
- Make Mail-Back Packages available to Covered Entities free of charge.
- Request additional Mail-Back Packages according to the process provided in the agreement.
- Dispose of commercial waste by means other than Mail-Back Packages.
- Store Mail-Back Packages in a secure area.
- Store Mail-Back Packages to avoid damage or package compromise.
- Store and distribute Mail-Back Packages without modifying or removing package labels.
- Distribute Mail-Back Packages without collecting personal information from Covered Entities.
- Distribute Mail-Back Packages without handling, collecting, or storing Mail-Back Packages containing Covered Drugs from Covered Entities or shipping Mail-Back Packages on behalf of Covered Entities.
- Complete documentation under all applicable laws and required by MED-Project for distributing Mail-Back Packages.
- Securely maintain any documentation required under the Program and provide such documentation to MED-Project upon request.

Agreements for Collection Events require that law enforcement:

- Maintain compliance with all applicable laws regarding the collection, handling, processing, and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Possess all required authorization to enter into an agreement for Program services.
- Collect and store Covered Drugs and cause the transportation and disposal of Covered Drugs.
- Report any theft, unexplained loss, or diversion of Covered Drugs, safety or security problem, or environmental incident.
- Securely maintain any documentation required under the Program and provide such documentation to MED-Project upon request.

a. Handling and Disposal of Covered Drugs

MED-Project will enter into agreements with all relevant entities participating in the Program before establishing Drop-Off Sites, Mail-Back Distribution Locations, or scheduling Collection Events. Agreements with Authorized Collectors and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs require that all persons handling or disposing of Covered Drugs report any safety and security problems to MED-Project and comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other legal requirements, including those related to safety and security. These requirements shall be followed by persons handling Covered Drugs collected under the Program.

Each Mail-Back Package and inner liner shipping box provided under the Program will have a unique identifier enabling tracking. MED-Project's Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs monitor the related tracking data and report to MED-Project. More information about MED-Project agreements is provided in Plan § V.B.3.

b. Tracking and Reporting Safety and Security Problems

MED-Project has an incident management system that requires evaluation of incidents for potential safety and security events, including identification of potential reportable events. MED-Project agreements require Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs to report safety or security events within no more than 24 hours or as soon as practicable. MED-Project will report such unplanned major security events, including possible temporary suspension of services and any disagreement between the Authorized Collector and the Program Operator about the response to an unplanned major security event, to the Department within 10 business days of learning of the event. Whenever a potential reportable event has occurred, MED-Project and/or Vendor undertake a root cause analysis to identify and implement corrective actions. A summary of occurrences of any safety or security problems, along with corrective actions, including changes to any policies and procedures, will be included in the annual report.

c. Protecting Patient Information

Instructions at Drop-Off Sites will inform Covered Entities that they should completely cross out, remove, or otherwise make unreadable all personally identifiable information on Covered Drug containers and packaging before depositing them in the Secure Repository. In cases where people follow the instructions, there will be no personally identifiable information.

In addition to Secure Repository signage, MED-Project Program promotional materials will encourage Covered Entities to protect their information by ensuring that identifiable information is not present before depositing Covered Drug containers and packaging into Secure Repositories. Examples of MED-Project Secure Repository signage are available in [Appendix E](#).

As added protection, the inner liners for the Secure Repository will be opaque rather than clear, in compliance with the DEA Rule. The same opaque inner liners are used during Collection Events. Mail-Back Packages provided under the Program are also opaque. This will prevent anyone from seeing any information on the Covered Drug containers and packaging collected at Drop-Off Sites or Collection Events or placed in Mail-Back Packages.

As described elsewhere in the Plan, Covered Drugs collected in Secure Repositories, at Collection Events, and in Standard Mail-Back Packages cannot be x-rayed, analyzed, or otherwise penetrated under the DEA Rule and Oregon Board of Pharmacy regulations. Authorized Collectors and Vendors involved in the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs must comply with those requirements under their agreements with MED-Project and their reporting obligations.

d. Information Provided by Vendors

MED-Project requires its Vendors involved with collection and disposal services to track information required for the annual report and to report that information to MED-Project at regular periods and upon request. Additionally, MED-Project's agreements with its Vendors involved with collection and disposal services require that the Vendors maintain complete and accurate records, such as books, documents, and accounting procedures, and practices. The agreements also allow MED-Project to audit such records during normal business hours after providing notice.

In its annual report, MED-Project will provide the information required under ORS 459A.230 based, in part, on the information it receives from its Vendors. MED-Project will also cooperate with audit requests it receives under ORS 459A.236(3) and, in response to such audit requests, will provide access to the requested records at the Department's headquarters office upon request.

e. Oregon Board of Pharmacy Rule

The Oregon Board of Pharmacy promulgated OAR 855-041-1046, which allows pharmacies to become authorized collectors of unused pharmaceuticals in conformance with the DEA Rule. In addition to the requirements of the DEA Rule, an Oregon pharmacy must:

- Notify the Oregon Board of Pharmacy in writing prior to initiating the program.
- Dispose of no quarantined, recalled, or outdated drugs from pharmacy stock in a Secure Repository.
- Maintain disposal records for a minimum of 3 years.

In order to participate as an Authorized Collector, all pharmacies must comply with the requirements of OAR 855-041-1046, other Oregon Board of Pharmacy regulations, and all other state and federal laws and rules governing the keeping of Covered Drugs. These requirements are incorporated into MED-Project's agreements with Authorized Collectors.

MED-Project will consult with participating pharmacies, as requested, regarding how to provide the required notifications to the Oregon Board of Pharmacy.

VI. Education and Outreach

MED-Project's education and outreach program will include multiple and varied elements designed to promote the Program and educate Covered Entities who are residents aged 18 and over about the safe and secure collection of Covered Drugs under the Program. In compliance with ORS 459A.227, the system of promotion will be designed to:

- Emphasize the importance of taking medicine as prescribed by health care providers.
- Promote the safe and secure storage of medication and disposal of Covered Drugs through the Drug Take-Back Program.
- Discourage the disposal of Covered Drugs in the garbage or sewer system.
- Publicize the locations of Drop-Off Sites, Mail-Back Distribution Locations, information about LADCs, and dates and locations of scheduled Collection Events, if applicable.
- Provide information explaining how to dispose of Covered Drugs at Drop-Off Sites and Collection Events, and how to access and utilize Mail-Back Packages.
- Disseminate information on the inherent risks of improperly storing medications or disposing of opioids, opiates, or other Covered Drugs.

A. Outreach Tools, Timing, and Frequency

Pursuant with ORS 459A.227, MED-Project will conduct public education efforts and promotion strategies utilizing a combination of the tools described below.

1. Signage

Secure Repositories are affixed with standard signage that provides clear, consistent instructions on how Covered Entities can dispose of Covered Drugs at Drop-Off Sites. The standard signage on all Secure Repositories provides consistent instructions, helping Covered Entities understand how to dispose of Covered Drugs through the Program. In addition, written signage advertising the availability of Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Packages is available to all Drop-Off Sites. All signage includes the Coordinated Website address and toll-free Call Center number, where Covered Entities can access more information or provide feedback about the Program.

2. Display Signage

MED-Project will provide display signage promoting the Program and directing Covered Entities to the Coordinated Website and Call Center for more information about the Program. [Appendix H](#) provides sample images of display signage.

3. Social Media

MED-Project will utilize various social media platforms to effectively reach Covered Entities who are residents aged 18 and over and raise awareness of the Program. Posts will feature relevant, informative content that aligns with messaging used across other media channels.

Paid social media activity can significantly increase access to more residents, allowing MED-Project to target a larger audience than with organic social media content. Examples of paid social media include

boosting stories, posts, reels, or other effective social content.

Icons with links to MED-Project's social media pages are prominently displayed on the MED-Project landing page.

4. Press Releases

MED-Project may issue press releases, as needed, to reach media outlets throughout the State and promote participation in the Drug Take-Back Program or support scheduled Collection Events. These communications will also be posted on the Website. In addition, MED-Project may develop and provide press release templates for use by Authorized Collectors, community agencies, and government agencies.

5. Media Outreach

MED-Project will employ media activities to promote the Program and educate the public by:

- Driving awareness among the target audience.
- Utilizing various marketing channels.
- Delivering consistent, clear messaging.

Offline channels may be incorporated, as necessary, to further enhance resident awareness. The ultimate media mix and distribution strategy will be determined through a media planning process and may be adjusted or optimized.

As reported in the survey conducted in July 2024 for awareness of among Oregon residents, 74% are aware of Secure Repositories located at pharmacies, 63% are aware of local Collection Events and 60% are aware of Secure Repositories located at police stations. In accordance with ORS 459A.209(2)(g) and to strive to sustain levels of awareness, MED-Project will conduct outreach designed to reach 75% of Covered Entities who are residents aged 18 and over. MED-Project will focus outreach activities on digital tactics that offer scalability, targeting capabilities, and a direct path from interaction (e.g., clicking on a paid ad to Program information, such as finding a location or requesting a Mail-Back Package). By utilizing digital advertising, MED-Project can reach a broad audience across desktop, mobile web, in-app platforms, and tablets. MED-Project may also incorporate audio advertisements, including radio spots and digital audio ads on streaming services and podcasts. Audio advertising can offer a wide reach as well as targeting capabilities including demographics, affinities, contextual relevance, geography and behavioral data to reach audiences. With the growing popularity of digital audio platforms, audio advertisements can reach a large and diverse audience across different devices, including smartphones, tablets, computers, and smart speakers.

MED-Project has access to local and national media planning expertise, as well as industry-standard tools to guide campaign planning and effectiveness. Reach and frequency will be calculated based on guidance from industry associations and benchmarks. Media outreach will direct Covered Entities who are residents aged 18 and over to the Coordinated Website and Call Center for additional information. MED-Project's media outreach may continue to include the MED-Project branded toll-free telephone number and Website to the extent that the media outreach covers multiple states where MED-Project operates a program, and MED-Project's branded toll-free telephone number and website will route Covered Entities to the Coordinated Website and Call Center.

To measure public awareness, MED-Project will use biennial surveys and feedback collected through the community feedback form available on the Website. Based on the results, MED-Project may alter outreach and education programs, as appropriate, to work towards the goal of fostering full public awareness. See Plan Section VI.G.

From time to time, MED-Project may conduct additional targeted campaigns to further enrich the outreach program based on consultation with appropriate local governments. MED-Project will conduct additional targeted outreach to Historically Underserved Communities through engagement with statewide organizations using specialized media targeted to Historically Underserved Communities. See Plan § VI.B.

B. Historically Underserved Communities

MED-Project will conduct enhanced outreach and education activities targeting Historically Underserved Communities. As described in Plan § V.A.2, MED-Project will work with third parties like Oregon's Kitchen Table to identify and conduct outreach to Historically Underserved Communities. MED-Project may also work with its media Vendors to identify specialized media outlets that serve Historically Underserved Communities, with select campaign outreach targeted to Historically Underserved Communities through those outlets.

In addition, MED-Project will continue discussions with organizations across the State representing Historically Underserved Communities to offer opportunities to learn more about the Program and to solicit feedback on the Program, including feedback on the convenience of the Program, as described in Plan § V.A.2. Based on feedback from Historically Underserved Communities, MED-Project may:

- Provide outreach materials and advertise additional services in languages other than English spoken by the Historically Underserved Community.
- Provide written materials to additional locations as identified by representatives of the Historically Underserved Communities including interested Oregon Tribes.
- Conduct ongoing outreach to community-based organizations.
- Engage culturally specific media.

C. Online and Written Materials

MED-Project will provide online and written materials to pharmacies promoting the Program and directing Covered Entities to the Coordinated Website and Call Center for more information. MED-Project's online and written materials promote the Program and provide public outreach and education about the safe and secure collection of Covered Drugs. Materials use plain language and clear, explanatory images to promote and explain the Program to Covered Entities, including Covered Entities with limited English proficiency. Downloadable versions of the materials are available on the Website which provides materials in more than 100 languages via a translation tool. Printed versions, available in English and Spanish, are available for use by pharmacies and hospitals or clinics with onsite pharmacies. Printed materials contain a QR code directing Covered Entities to the Website. Authorized Collectors and Mail-Back Distribution Locations can obtain educational and outreach materials, order additional Mail-Back Packages, and communicate questions, feedback, concerns, or issues through the MED-Project Help Desk.

D. Communication Tools and Implementation Methods

MED-Project will promote the Program, including the availability of Drop-Off Sites, Mail-Back Services, and Collection Events, through media outreach and promotional materials. More information about Program promotion is provided in Plan § VI.A. MED-Project media outreach and promotional materials

will direct Covered Entities to the Website and Call Center for specific information about MED-Project services, unless otherwise noted in Plan § VI.A. MED-Project will communicate program information to in-home hospice care providers, as identified via the Oregon Hospice & Palliative Care Association, of the opportunity to request Mail-Back Packages for use by the hospice services patient.

1. MED-Project Website

MED-Project will continue to maintain a Website designed to promote Program participation, including providing information for Covered Entities about Drop-Off Site locations and hours of operation, Mail-Back Services, and Collection Events.

The Website is mobile-responsive, accessible on commonly used devices and browsers, and presents information in multiple formats, including video, audio, text, explanatory graphics, and printable materials. In addition, the site offers translation into over 100 languages via a translation tool.

Website content includes instructions for safe handling and proper disposal of Covered Drugs, the locations of Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations, and the dates and locations of scheduled Collection Events, if applicable. The Website also contains a web form for Covered Entities to request Mail-Back Packages, easy access to public service announcements, Frequently Asked Questions, printable educational materials, and links to MED-Project's social media pages.

2. MED-Project Call Center

MED-Project will continue to maintain a Call Center as an additional resource for Covered Entities. The Call Center provides information about the Program, including the locations of Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations, information about LADCs, and the dates and locations of scheduled Collection Events, if applicable. Covered Entities can also request Mail-Back Packages and access instructions for safe handling and proper disposal of Covered Drugs.

The toll-free telephone number is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with an interactive voice response system that allows Covered Entities to continue the automated recording in English or Spanish. The Call Center also provides translation services upon request with the assistance of a human representative, with translators available to provide language options suited to local demographics. The 711 teletype service is also available for individuals with hearing or speech impairments.

E. Readily Recognizable and Consistent Secure Repository Design

Since 2015, MED-Project and its subsidiaries have worked with pharmacies, law enforcement agencies, vendors, regulators, and others across jurisdictions to develop a readily recognizable and consistent design for secure repositories and to develop clear, standardized instructions on how to use those repositories. MED-Project has worked to make its designs and instructions readily recognizable and understandable to all Covered Entities, including those with limited English proficiency. MED-Project continues to accept and consider feedback from Authorized Collectors, community members, and others on the design and consistency of its Secure Repositories and on the clarity of its standardized instructions. Based on that feedback, MED-Project revises its designs and instructions as appropriate. In Oregon, Authorized Collectors can provide feedback on MED-Project's Program, including on the design of Secure Repositories and on its instructions for their use, through the Help Desk. Covered Entities and others can provide feedback on the same topics through the Call Center and Website. MED-Project will

receive that feedback and revise its designs and instructions as needed, while maintaining continued compliance with all applicable laws, rules, and other legal requirements.

F. Toll-Free Telephone Number and Single Website Coordination

MED-Project will continue to coordinate with other Program Operators to enable Covered Entities to easily identify, understand, and access the services provided by all Drug Take-Back Programs per ORS 459A.227(3) by providing a neutrally branded single toll-free telephone number and Coordinated Website with a neutrally branded landing page. MED-Project will continue to utilize the Oregon approved common mark for all statewide Drug Take-Back Programs on kiosks, the Coordinated Website, and on MED-Project brochures. Any Covered Entities that access MED-Project's branded Website or toll-free telephone number will be routed to the neutrally branded Coordinated Website and Call Center. In addition, the neutrally branded Coordinated Website address and Call Center phone number are included in online and written materials, posters and Drop-Off Site signage, as appropriate. Information about how MED-Project will promote the Coordinated Website and Call Center is provided in Plan § VI.D.

1. Single Coordinated Website

MED-Project will continue to coordinate with other approved Program Operator(s) to maintain a neutrally branded Coordinated Website. The Coordinated Website displays all approved Program Operator Collection Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations using information provided by each approved Program Operator. MED-Project will verify that the MED-Project Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations are open and operational by monitoring Drop-Off Site operation status on a monthly basis, and will update the Coordinated Website as needed. The Coordinated Website features the Oregon approved common mark, the single toll-free telephone number, information about what the Drug Take-Back Program accepts and does not accept, information on how to order Mail-Back Packages, and a way to contact the Program Operators about the Drug Take-Back Program.

2. Single Coordinated Toll-Free Number

MED-Project will continue to coordinate with other approved Program Operator(s) to maintain a single toll-free telephone number, (844) 4-TAKE-BACK. This neutrally branded, single toll-free number serves as a combined call center directory, distributing calls equally among the approved Program Operators. The single toll-free telephone number is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year. Callers to the single toll-free telephone number can access information about the statewide Drug Take-Back Program including the location of Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations, and Covered Entities can request prepaid, preaddressed Mail-Back Packages.

G. Developing and Conducting the Biennial Survey

MED-Project will continue to conduct a biennial survey of Covered Entities who are residents aged 18 and over and pharmacists and health care providers who interact with Covered Entities. MED-Project will submit proposed survey questions to the Department for preapproval. With the proposed questions, MED-Project will also include a plan with additional details about the survey and method of delivery, sample sizes, margins of error and confidence intervals, timeline and methodology, to ensure an accurate representation of different demographic and geographic groups in Oregon. MED-Project will initiate the survey after receiving Department preapproval. A timeline is as follows:

Milestone 1: MED-Project to submit survey questions/plan to the Department 90 days prior to initiation.

Milestone 2: Approved survey in field.

Milestone 3: Results posted on the Website 90 days after survey end date.

Survey results will be included in the following year's annual report. The survey will meet the requirements established in ORS 459A.227(2)(b).

MED-Project will propose survey questions designed to evaluate Program education and outreach activities as well as to understand if current services are convenient and align with how Covered Drugs are purchased. Proposed questions will seek to determine information like the following:

- Public awareness and usage of the Drug Take-Back Program.
- Extent to which drop-off sites, mail-back services, and collection events are convenient and easy to use.
- Knowledge of, and attitudes toward the risks posed by improperly storing medications and improperly discarding or abandoning Covered Drugs.
- The effectiveness of different messaging methods and platforms in raising awareness of the Drug Take-Back Program.

MED-Project will use the survey results to improve Program effectiveness in the following areas:

- Outreach and services to Covered Entities who are residents aged 18 and over, including Historically Underserved Communities, through various communication tools and platforms.
- Educational materials to Covered Entities and pharmacists and health care providers who interact with Covered Entities.

MED-Project will use the survey results to evaluate progress toward fostering full public awareness under ORS 459A.209(2)(g). Based on findings from the biennial survey, as well as other methods used to evaluate awareness, MED-Project may alter outreach and education programs, as appropriate, to work towards the goal of fostering full public awareness.

MED-Project will determine the scope and scale of changes to outreach and education programs based on the level of public awareness revealed by the biennial survey and other information. If results show that public awareness is below 50% across the State, MED-Project will implement additional changes to its outreach and education programs. These changes may include the addition or expansion of outreach methods, including changes to the reach and frequency of campaigns.

H. Distribution of Promotional Materials

MED-Project will provide written promotional materials regarding the safe and secure collection of Covered Drugs to pharmacies, hospitals, or clinics with onsite pharmacies and other interested parties so they can provide these materials to Covered Entities as required by ORS 459A.227(4). MED-Project will make additional printed materials available, upon request, through the Help Desk. Materials are also available for download on the Website in over 100 languages via a translation tool.

MED-Project will initially contact eligible LADCs to provide education and outreach regarding the Program, as necessary pursuant to Section V.A.5, and will conduct follow-up outreach with participating LADCs on at least an annual basis. Follow-up outreach with participating LADCs will include providing informational materials, as requested by the participating LADC, about other Program services.

To adjust to the changing pharmacy landscape, MED-Project will work with pharmacies that offer online services through non-resident licensed pharmacies and will provide outreach to support such non-resident pharmacy location awareness and access to program materials including information around safe disposal and how Covered Entities access the Program services. Annually, MED-Project will identify licensed non-resident pharmacies through the Oregon State Board of Pharmacy, notify licensed non-

resident pharmacies about the Program, and monitor their participation in the Program. As of September 2025, the Oregon Board of Pharmacy lists over 800 licensed out-of-state pharmacies.

VII. Goals

MED-Project's goals regarding the amount of Covered Drugs collected under Program and with respect to fostering full public awareness of the Program are provided in Table 5.

MED-Project will assess its achievement of the goals described above each year and will report on the results in its annual report. MED-Project has defined its goals to rely on objective metrics that can be readily measured and reported. MED-Project Vendors will report to MED-Project on the weight of Covered Drugs collected. MED-Project will review the results of its biennial survey, its achievement of program goals, and other information determined to be relevant, to update its goals and modify collection or education and outreach operations as necessary to provide for an effective program. If MED-Project does not meet the collection goal, MED-Project will evaluate and implement additional services, which will be addressed through an Additional Services Proposal, subject to approval by the Department. MED-Project will report and address education and outreach operations in the annual report. If MED-Project does not meet its awareness goals, as measured by the most recent biennial survey, MED-Project will evaluate and implement additional changes to its outreach and education programs, which will be addressed through the annual report, subject to the approval of the Department.

VIII. Closure Plan

A. Financial Assurance

As described in Plan § III.A., MED-Project programs are funded by their Participating Covered Manufacturers. Program budgets are approved in advance of the fiscal year they cover, and Participating Covered Manufacturers commit to fund each operating year in the prior year after the budget has been finalized. In Oregon, in addition to MED-Project's Program advance budget approval and Covered Manufacturers funding commitment, MED-Project will maintain sufficient cash balance and reserves so that MED-Project has sufficient funding to operate for at least six more months and cover the costs of uninstalling and decontaminating Secure Repositories at Drop-Off Sites. MED-Project will hold 50 percent of the annual operating budget in reserve.

B. Closure Plan

If MED-Project decides to dissolve or cease operation of the Program, MED-Project will notify the Department and participating Covered Manufacturers by email of its intent to close the Program at least six months prior to Program closure. MED-Project will maintain sufficient cash balance and reserves so that it can operate the Program for six months after providing such a notification to the Department. With cash balance and reserves, MED-Project will continue to provide for the collection and disposal of Covered Drugs via Drop-Off Sites, Mail-Back Services, and Collection Events, as previously planned, to provide convenience to Covered Entities, and will maintain its Call Center, Website, and Help Desk to reflect the available services. MED-Project will maintain its contracts as needed to provide the services described and will maintain and evaluate opportunities to transfer its contracts and operations before final dissolution or cessation of the Program. MED-Project will provide for staff and insurance and will continue to work with Drop-Off Sites to implement operational requirements during the six-month closure period until all Covered Drugs collected through Secure Repositories, inner liners, Mail-Back Packages or Collection Events are safely and securely disposed of. MED-Project will work with Drop-Off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Locations to remove, destroy, or decommission MED-Project Secure Repositories and materials inventory. MED-Project will inform the public about Program closure and will provide educational materials and resources to direct the public to other drug take-back services that may be available after Program closure. After final dissolution, MED-Project will submit a final annual Program report to the Department that includes information on the final disposition of Collected Drugs.

IX. Coordination

Terms of coordination between Program Operators were approved by the Department on June 23, 2021. The terms of coordination include providing a state common mark, single-toll free number and the Coordinated Website that a Covered Entity may use to contact Program Operators about the Drug Take-Back Programs and to acquire information about the location of Drop-Off Sites and the collection processes of the Drug Take-Back Programs as required by 459A.22(3). Each program is responsible for meeting the Drug Take-Back Law's requirements and cannot delegate that responsibility to another program. MED-Project will seek the Department's approval for changes to the Plan that require approval under ORS 459A.212(1) and, upon request, will provide to the Department any information about such an agreement, including a copy of the agreement.

In the event that MED-Project coordinates services jointly with another program, MED-Project will coordinate those services by including in an agreement with the other Drug Take-Back Program that the Program relies on to provide any service under the Plan requirements that all services provided to the Program pursuant to that agreement will comply with the terms of the other Drug Take-Back Program's plan and all applicable federal and State laws and regulations, including the Drug Take-Back Law.

MED-Project will notify the Department of the terms of such coordination no later than 60 days after approval of multiple program plans, unless the terms involve changes to the methods used to foster public awareness of the proposed Drug Take-Back Program, in which case MED-Project will seek Department approval per ORS 459A.212. MED-Project will also seek Department approval per ORS 459A.212 if changes to the terms of coordination in the future involve changes involving methods used to foster public awareness of the proposed Drug Take-Back Program.

X. Implementation Timeline

The Oregon Drug Take-Back Program was implemented through the Product Stewardship Plan for Covered Drugs from Households approved by the Department on May 20, 2021. MED-Project will continue to submit an annual report as required by ORS 459A.230, that reports on the activity and goals as required by the Plan and Oregon Drug Take-Back Law. The following items listed in the table below will require additional time from approval of this Updated Plan to implement.

Medication Drop Box

Medication drop boxes are installed at nearby locations such as pharmacies and law enforcement offices for residents to simply drop off their expired or unwanted household medication for safe, free, and convenient disposal.

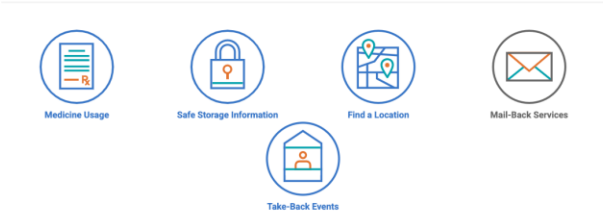

Then, store it securely, and dispose of it safely, to prevent accidental ingestion or misuse by others, including children and pets.

MED-Project programs and services make it safe, free, and convenient for you to dispose of medication.

Use as Directed

Use medication as directed. If there are specific instructions on the label, package, or package insert, please follow those instructions. If you have any questions, ask your health care providers.

Store Securely

Follow storage instructions as provided on medicine labels and the information accompanying the medicine. Keep medications in a secure location, safely away from people or pets.

Dispose Safely

Check your medicine cabinet and remove all expired and unwanted medication. If you do not know if a drug is still safe, check with your pharmacist. Count medication to keep track of amounts. Drop off or mail back expired or unwanted medications for safe disposal.

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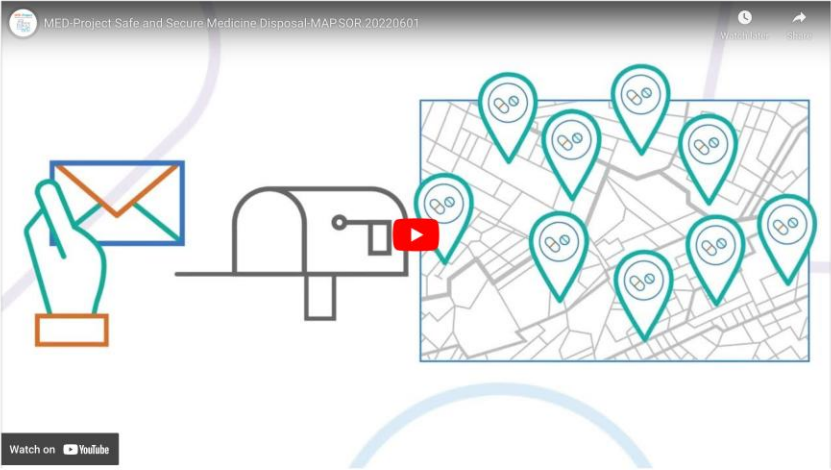
