

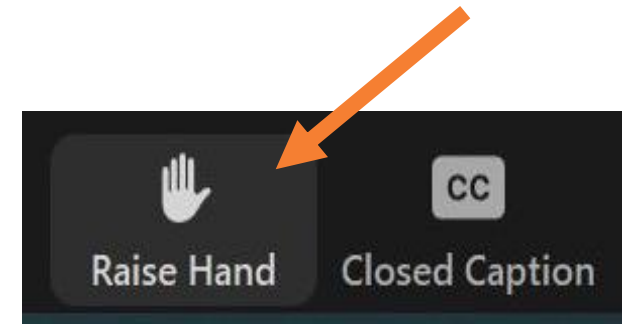

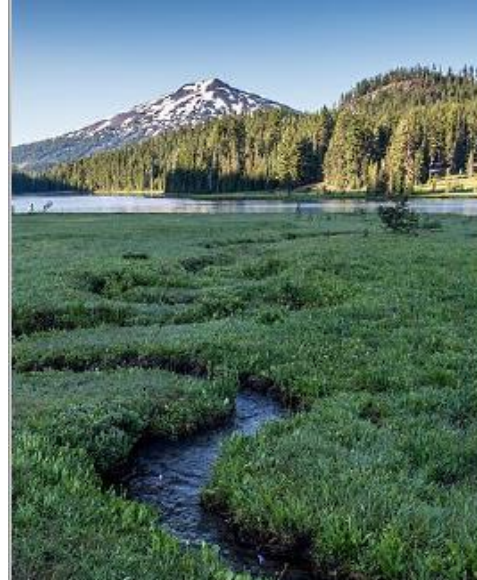

- Members appointed by DEQ Director with meetings convened by DEQ staff

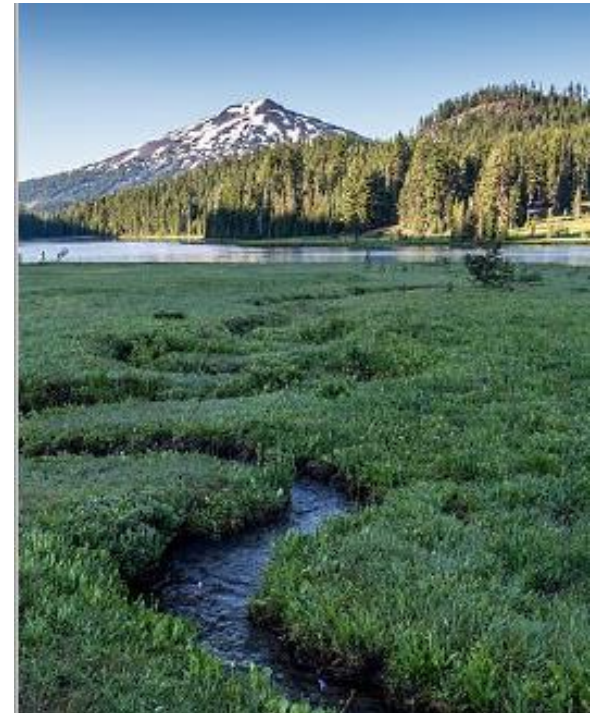

Committee Charter - Roles

The Act requires that DEQ appoint a program advisory committee to consult with stewardship organizations operating mattress stewardship programs and advise DEQ regarding:

- The review and approval of any mattress stewardship plan submitted to DEQ
- The review and approval of any amendment to a plan submitted to DEQ
- The review of annual reports submitted by a stewardship organization to DEQ

- Committee member discussion in meeting
- The public and committee members can give written public comment on the proposed plan
 - Helps inform and advise DEQ on its review of a program plan

Mattress Stewardship Act – overview

- SB 1576 - signed into law in 2022
- Creates a statewide system for collection and management of discarded mattresses
- Follows a consumer-funded product stewardship model
- Producers, renovators, retailers must register with stewardship organization

Mattress Stewardship Act – overview

- Stewardship organization will develop and implement a program, under a plan approved by DEQ
- After plan approval, stewardship organization must implement within 7 months
- DEQ will provide oversight and enforcement

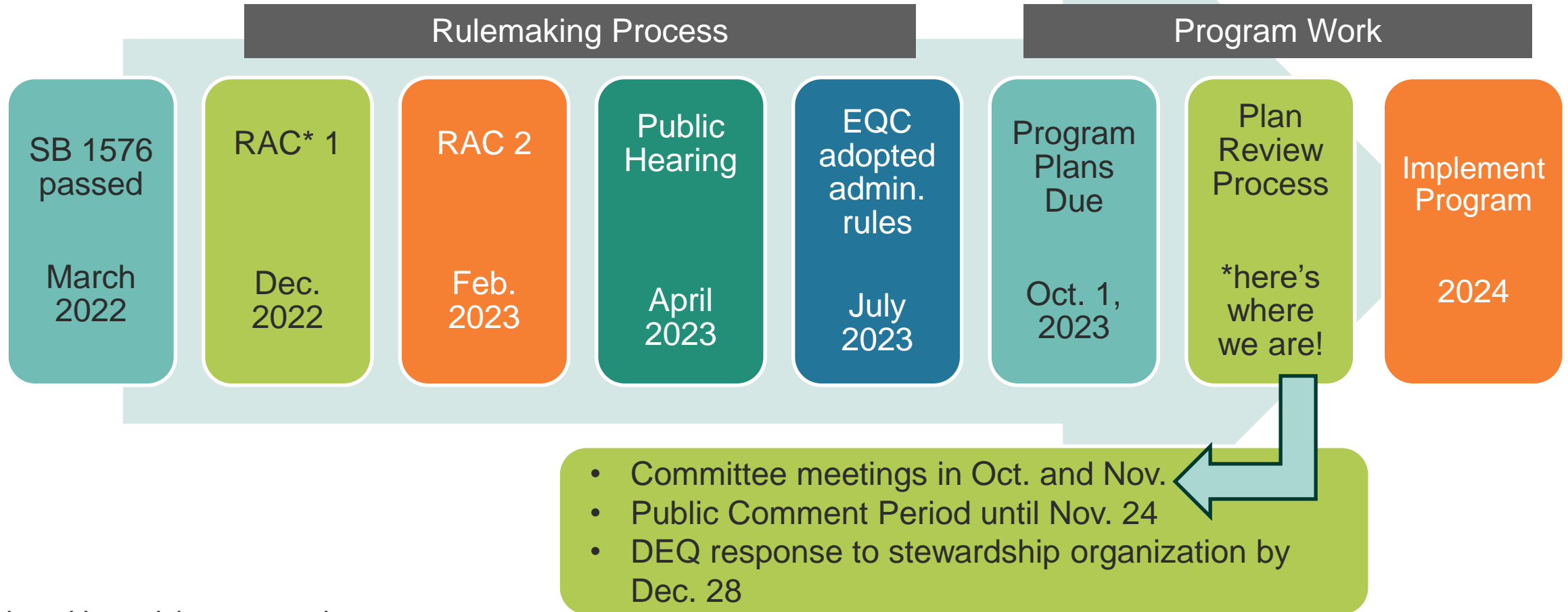


Product Stewardship

An environmental management strategy in which all parties involved in the design, production, sale and use of a product take responsibility for minimizing the product's environmental impact throughout all stages of the product's life.

Program Plan Requirements

A plan describes how a stewardship organization will implement a mattress stewardship program for Oregon.

Items required in a program plan come from:

- Statute
- Administrative Rule

Program Plan Requirements

Levels of Detail

- Statute establishes requirements
 - set by Legislature
- Administrative rules are more specific
 - adopted by Environmental Quality Commission
- Program plans include operational details
 - approved by DEQ

Requirements

- Implementation Timeline
- Program Operations
- Collection
- *Performance Goals*
- Program Administration
- Budget
- Assessment Fee
- Illegal Dumping
- Public Education
- *Closure Plan*
- Coordination
- Program Changes

Requirements

Areas of focus

- Env. Sound management practices
- Convenience / collection network
- Education
- Performance goals (not due in initial plan)
- Budget / assessment fee
- Illegal dumping
- Other items from your perspective/expertise
