
























Responses to Select Comments

- Comments on specific materials
- Can local governments collect a material if it isn't on the uniform statewide collection list?
- When and how will social equity be considered?
- Can PROs be required to support/fund reuse?
- Who will determine if a material is collected on-route or at depots?

Shorter vs. Longer Acceptance Lists

Two general concerns with longer lists:

- 1. Not all materials are suitable to recycle (discuss individual materials later)
- 2. Longer lists are inherently more confusing and lead to more contamination (discuss this now)
- Longer lists may confuse the public, thereby increasing contamination . . .
- ... but longer lists accept more materials, thereby *decreasing* what is contamination (by definition)

Shorter vs. Longer Acceptance Lists

Question: Do you recommend a shorter or longer list, and why?


Additional considerations include:

- 1. Desire to avoid subsequent removals (delisting)
- 2. Desire to avoid unnecessary changes
- 3. Higher costs may be offset by higher benefits
- 4. Design for conditions in 2025, not 2017

Ranking of Individual Materials (top 15)

(Council member interest)

- 1. PET thermoform packaging
- 2. Block white expanded polystyrene*
- 3. Nursery packaging
- 4. Large format plastic packaging
- 5. Glass
- 6. Pressurized canisters
- 7. HDPE package handles, PE/PP lids
- 8. Plastic bottles and jugs
- 9. Clear plastic cups
- 10. Scrap metal
- 11. Plastic tubs
- 12. Polycoated and aseptic cartons, paper cups
- 13. Polyethylene film
- 14. Aerosol cans
- 15. Paper "cans"*
