



Plastic Pollution and Recycling Modernization Act

- Senate Bill 582, 2021
- Shared responsibility
- New responsibilities for local governments, MRFs and producers
- Comprehensive reform and modernization
- New opportunities for local governments and service providers

OVERSIGHT AND INTEGRATION

RMA: Needs Assessment

- Required by law (ORS 459A.890(8))
- Gauges interest in expanding recycling collection
- Will be conducted periodically every few years

- Completing the survey is voluntary
- The survey is separate from the RMA requirements
- To be eligible for the first round of funding, local governments must complete the survey indicating interest

Completing the Survey

- The survey can be submitted at any point before April 14
- You can resubmit if your answers change
- Local Governments are strongly encouraged to work with their service provider(s) to complete the survey.
- A Local Government must submit its own survey. A survey submitted by a service provider does <u>not</u> qualify for funding eligibility.

Completing the Survey: Instructions for Counties

- Counties are asked to complete a survey on behalf of the county and on behalf of unincorporated areas.
- To complete the survey on behalf of multiple areas:
 - 1. Identify the new or expanded recycling services needed in each area.

Areas A and B only want to open a new depot

Areas C, D, and E only want to expand curbside recycling

Area F wants to open a new depot & expand curbside recycling







PRO develops a program plan


DEQ reviews & approves the plan
