

2019 Report Narrative

Title IV-B2 Family Preservation and Family Support Services funds are administered by the Oregon Early Learning Division. Title IV-B2 funds support the provision of community-based family support services in four goal areas: Early Childhood Development/Early Learning; Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention; Adolescent Risk Factors; and Child Poverty.

In Fiscal Year 2018-2019, funding to Healthy Families Oregon was used to support parents in cultivating and strengthening a nurturing, positive relationship with their baby and to promote healthy child growth and development. Through home visits, parents were educated and offered tools, resources, and supports that promote stable, attached families. Early Learning Hubs and direct service providers spent Title IV-B2 funds on parent engagement and classes and home visiting programs for parents of infants.

The Early Learning Division will continue to use these funds to support services designed to improve parenting skills; provide structured activities to parents and children to strengthen the parent-child relationship; transportation, information and referral services; and early developmental screening of children.
