The Central Oregon Employment First team has done a great job with this type of outreach, and they have <u>examples</u> of how they have promoted local success stories.
- Use the I Work We Succeed logo in materials related to integrated jobs for people with I/DD in Oregon. The logo is available both in color and black and white for download on our <u>website</u>.
- Request brochures and posters and spread them widely! Regional posters and brochures can be ordered using the publication number by <a href="DHS">DHS</a>
  Publications, or local employment providers and nonprofits providing integrated employment services can request copies by emailing <a href="employment.first@state.or.us">employment.first@state.or.us</a>. You can also download the posters and brochures on the <a href="brand toolkit web page">brand toolkit web page</a>. There is also a <a href="downloadable insert">downloadable insert</a> for the brochure for Employment First teams to include local contact information.
