**RE: Long-Term Care Ombudsman (LTCO) will resume visits**

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The Long-Term Care Ombudsman's Office (LTCO) has partnered with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) in ensuring LTCO volunteers receive training related to personal protective equipment, infection control and other precautions needed for them to enter long-term care facilities in their role as resident advocates. The Ombudsman's office is an essential link to resident care and advocacy and the Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS) supports this transition as these essential visits are scheduled to resume.

Starting Monday January 4, 2021 LTCO volunteers shall be allowed access to residents in Oregon's long-term care settings in all counties with the exception of those that are shown as being an extreme risk per the Governor's framework.
