RE: Indoor visitation prohibition expanded to nine Oregon counties from Nov. 11-25

Governor Kate Brown [announced](#) that four additional counties must follow measures to pause social activities, including [prohibiting indoor visitation](#) at all long-term care facilities, to help stop the rapid spread of COVID-19. These measures will be in place from Nov. 11 through Nov. 25, 2020, and apply in the following counties:

- Baker
- Clackamas
- Jackson
- Malheur
- Marion
- Multnomah
- Umatilla
- Union
- Washington

The two-week prohibition is being instituted in counties with a case rate above 200 cases per 100,000 people over a two-week period, or more than 60 cases over a two-week period for counties with less than 30,000. Clackamas and Washington Counties were added due to their case rates being just under the threshold and both counties registering significant daily case counts in the past several days.

Facilities in the above nine counties must comply with Governor Brown's order. Please note that this policy change does not affect [compassionate care visitation](#) or the [limited outdoor visitation policy](#).
