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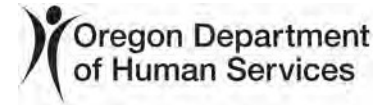

SUBJECT: Quality Measurement Program Changes for 2022

Change one: Facilities will need to answer this question for 2022 Quality Metrics Reporting: *Did your facility track antipsychotic medications prescribed for nonstandard uses in some way during 2022, yes or no?* This is the same reporting that was required of facilities for 2020 and 2021. Previous guidance instructed providers that no data entry would be needed for metric four regarding nonstandard use of antipsychotic medications.

Change two: The Residential Quality Metrics Program has changed the timeframe for facilities to input their quality metrics data for 2022. The new data entry window for 2022 data is **March 1 through March 31, 2023**. Previously, facilities had been instructed to enter their data into the quality metrics application January 1 through January 31, 2023.

Change three: The department is adding additional live webinar sessions to support Quality Measurement Program reporting. The next upcoming webinars are as follows:
