All long-term care professionals are encouraged to attend and hear from presenters from Empira who will bring evidence-based quality improvement fall prevention best practices and solutions to attendees. This full day event features dynamic and interactive opportunities to learn practical and real-world strategies for nursing facility, assisted living, residential care, in-home care, and other long-term care professionals to apply when trying to reduce risk and injury related to resident falls and develop interventions through the use of thoughtful root cause analysis and problem solving.

The Empira Program agenda starts with practice foundations and uses case studies to support learning and practice application. The day will include a panel discussion to address falls from the public policy, adult protective services, emergency services and provider perspectives.

Learning objectives include:
