Subject: RSV Information and Vaccine/Booster Doses for Flu and
COVID-19

As we enter respiratory season in Oregon, the APD Population Health Quality Improvement Section and our Oregon Health Authority partners have provided information on Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) and guidance on flu vaccine and COVID-19 booster doses.

KEY POINTS ABOUT RSV IN OREGON

- RSV is a seasonal respiratory illness.
- The people most at risk of severe illness from RSV are older adults and children under 2.
- RSV causes cold-like symptoms, including a runny nose, coughing, sneezing, a fever and a decrease in appetite.
- There is no vaccine for RSV.
- The flu and COVID-19 vaccines will not protect someone from RSV
- You can protect yourself and those around you by covering your coughs and sneezes, washing your hands often, disinfecting common areas touched often, and staying away from others when you are sick, if possible.

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- Governor Kate Brown issued an emergency declaration in response to a surge of pediatric cases and hospitalizations of respiratory viruses, including RSV, on Monday, 11/14/22.

COVID-19 BOOSTER AND FLU VACCINE DOSES:

If you are having issues obtaining COVID-19 booster or flu vaccine doses for your residents, we recommend you pursue these options below in the following order:

- 1) **Contact your Long-term Care Pharmacy.** If you have a Long-term Care Pharmacy that you typically work or contract with to provide services to your residents, reach out to your contact at that Pharmacy. Your LTC Pharmacy should be providing this service for you

- 2) **Contact a nearby Retail Pharmacy.** If your Long-term Care Pharmacy is unavailable or you do not typically work with one, you can find vaccination opportunities at Retail Pharmacies. You can use the [CDC's vaccine finder](#) tool to find a nearby pharmacy and the types of vaccinations those pharmacies are providing. If you need vaccinators to come on-site to your facility, call the pharmacy to ask if they will provide this service. Many pharmacies have offered to do so in the past, although there may be additional costs for your facility for this service.

- 3) **Contact your Local Public Health Authority (LPHA)-** If you are unable to get assistance from a nearby Retail pharmacy, please contact the LPHA for your county listed below.
- 4) **Contact another local provider-** If you are unable to get assistance from your LPHA, consider reaching out to a local Hospital system or Ambulance provider.
- 5) **Contact OHA-** If you are unable to get assistance from a hospital system or ambulance provider, contact OHA's Field Operations team by emailing CRRU-FieldOps-Requests@dhsoha.state.or.us

Please note: OHA may be able to provide COVID boosters but is unlikely to have flu vaccine.
