Each youth at the program is also assigned to a youth care-giving team that supports the youth navigating different situations. PASO uses Sanctuary tools to apply a variety of natural consequences and support the youth. Staff also practice interventions drawn from Motivational Interviewing Training, Collaborative Problem Solving Training, NCI Verbal De-escalation Training, Whole Brain Child Training, and SB710 Training</p> |
