Table with 1 row: Interview Summary. Resident C. is 19 years old and has been in the program since July 2020 and reports feeling safe and really likes the staff. The program has helped with getting school started and working towards completion. Within the last year, the program changed from a “chill” environment to adding a daily structured schedule for wake-up times, bedtimes, and group attendance and the change was hard but now it’s going ok. Outings have been fewer and are to be pre-planned. Desiree, program manager. The change to a more structured environment is based on learning daily life skills to assist the young adult clients in transitioning to adulthood, jobs, etc. for a more successful future. The schedule includes wake-up time Monday-Friday, morning meetings, individual activities to support their


goals, group therapy, free time, community dinner, house chores, free time, and quiet hours; and weekends are less structured and include outings or activities. Weekend activities are discussed ahead of time, planning for clients who are home or on leave to ensure adequate staffing.

Observations

The environment was clean, safe, and in good repair. Food was observed in the pantry, refrigerator, and freezer. The medications are stored in a locked closet within the locked staff office. Staff wore face masks as mandated due to the COVID-19 pandemic. A certified therapy dog was on-site, who comes twice a week.
