Interview Summary

I met with a resident that has been in the program for over one year. Currently program has three residents and will soon be adding two other residents. Resident reported that staff are “respectful” and that he “feels safe”. Resident reported that staff work with you at your level, and he has never been in a program that respects their needs (*before coming to Cascadia*). When asked what has been learned in this program, he reported learning how to rent and how to save money to work towards independent living. Food was reported to be good. On a scale from 0-10 (0=worst program in state, 10=best program in state) he reported Cascadia Health – Firefly to be a 10 on that scale.


Observations


I observed an empty bedroom ready for a new client with a brand-new mattress in the original plastic packaging. In my discussion with Alex Hickey Program Director, I learned that when residents leave program, they have the option of taking the furniture in their Firefly bedroom. This allows the resident to have furniture when moving out on their own. A new resident into program has a brand-new mattress for them to use and keep if they want to.

I observed program staffed with 2 staff plus Program Manager for three residents. Resident and staff interactions were observed during my unannounced site visit to be positive and with a trauma informed approach.
