Today Gov. Kate Brown [announced a one-week pause](#) on pending counties for reopening in Oregon.

She cited rising cases, including the single highest number of cases in one day since the COVID-19 pandemic started, as cause for concern.

This is a good reminder that we must remain vigilant to protect the health and safety of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and those that support them.

Remember if you do go out to do activities, take precautions such as physical distancing and wearing a mask or face covering whenever possible. Continue to frequently wash your hands and practice other safety procedures.
