The Central Oregon Employment First local team started the event as a way to recognize and honor local employers and businesses contributing to the community by hiring individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). The event honors employers from Crook, Deschutes and Jefferson counties.

Tracy Young, founder and director of employment provider Good 2 Go Oregon, served as the evening's master of ceremonies.

Multiple employers emphasized the value that employees with disabilities bring to their businesses.

"We have undergone a lot of changes over the years at Deschutes and Matt has changed with us," said Kerri Lynne of Deschutes Brewery, speaking of

the business's longtime employee who experiences a disability. "He is one of our most productive employees, and we have 550 employees now."

Peter Gunby, Abilitree's Human Resources Manager, shared his personal story about fighting his way back to employment after a ski accident left him with traumatic brain injury.

Several businesses recently hired an employee with a disability for the first time, while others had a long history of hiring people with disabilities. One employer remarked that there will no longer be a need for awards events when the workforce is truly inclusive and every business hires employees with disabilities as standard practice.
