Subject: Provider Accountability Report

Last year, the Office of Developmental Disabilities Services (ODDS) committed to creating a report for the Oregon Legislature that proposes statutory changes that would improve the state's ability to ensure provider transparency, accountability, safety and quality standards.

The report, "Oregon Department of Human Services Provider Accountability Report," is complete and can be read [online in English](#), [Russian](#), [Somali](#), [Simplified Chinese](#), [Spanish](#) and [Vietnamese](#).

In the report, ODDS makes nine key recommendations that would:

- Increase provider transparency, regardless of the corporate structure of the agency.
- Support the integrity of services provided to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families.
- Further our collective goal of supporting Oregonians with I/DD to have full lives.

We expect these recommendations will be considered during February's legislative session.
