Subject: Extension of federal public health emergency

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has [renewed the federal public health emergency \(PHE\) for COVID-19](#) through Jan. 11, 2023.

The PHE has allowed the Office of Developmental Disabilities Services (ODDS) and federal government to take actions to protect the health of those receiving services and working in Oregon's developmental disabilities system.

This extension allows us more time prepare for the transition back to our standard procedures. Examples of temporary actions and exemptions that will end when the PHE ends include:

- Video calls to conduct level of care (LOC), Oregon Needs Assessments (ONAs) and risk assessments remotely.
- Preexisting authorizations and the ability to extend service authorizations for one year without doing a new Individual Support Plan (ISP).
- Community based service programs using verbal consent for person-centered service plans.
- Parents and guardians of minors with an intellectual and developmental disability (I/DD) serving as their child's paid caregiver.

ODDS will issue communications with formal policy directives and instructions to support staff and partners through these transitions when the

PHE ends. CMS has committed to giving a 60-day notice before the PHE ends.

Thank you to all of you who have been caring for Oregonians with intellectual and developmental disabilities during the challenges of this ongoing public health emergency.
