The way serious incidents are reported will change. The new serious incident reporting pilot is scheduled to begin in October with statewide roll out soon thereafter. ODDS and the Office of Training, Information and Safety (OTIS) is amending Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs) to capture serious incidents identified as being crucial to the safety of individuals receiving I/DD services.

ODDS encourages providers and partners to learn the new incident reporting expectations by participating in the training opportunity available in iLearn. This training is applicable to all foster care homes and agencies who employ caregivers or direct support professionals, independent providers and Personal Support Workers.
