Discussion/interpretation:

All persons working within an ODDS Case Management Entity (CME) who will be accessing Serious Incidents within the Centralized Abuse Management (CAM) system are required to take a series of trainings prior to receiving a license to access the CAM system. Effective May 1, 2020, users who have not previously completed the DD Serious Incident classroom training, and are not currently a licensed CAM user, will be required to take the training on iLearn.

Implementation/transition instructions:

During the initial rollout of DD CAM Serious Incidents, users were required to take three pre-requisite trainings and enroll in an eight-hour classroom training. In an effort to make this training more accessible for new DD CAM users statewide, the classroom portion of the CAM Serious Incident training has been reproduced and made available on iLearn.

In order to receive a user license, new users must complete the course titled: "DHS – DD - CAM Serious Incident – DD User Training". This course will launch the required training segments. These include:

*Three pre-requisite trainings:

- 1. Policy
- 2. Serious Incident Types
- 3. Business Process

*Seven video training segments:

- 1. Introduction
- 2. Person/Service Provider Accounts
- 3. Serious Incident Entry
- 4. SI Details, Recommended Actions, Closing
- 5. SI Status, Sharing, Cloning
- 6. Additional Functionality
- 7. Reports

Additionally, a <u>"CAM Toolkit"</u> will be provided in iLearn. The CAM Toolkit includes the supplemental handouts listed below:

- Quick Reference Guides (QRGs)
- Defining Injury handout
- SI Definition's
- SI Click-by-Click Guide
- Reports Functionality Overview

- Additional Questions handout
- Mass SI Transfer Overview

Once the user has completed the DD CAM user training, they will be prompted to complete the verification step at the end of the module. Once verified, the user will receive a certificate of completion.

For existing DD CAM users, it is not required to complete the online training. However, for those who may be interested in a CAM user "refresher course", the segments have also been made available as individual classes within iLearn. To access the segments users will need to search using the following format: "DHS – DD – CAM SI – Segment # - Title" (e.g. DHS – DD- CAM SI – Segment 3 – Serious Incident Entry). Once licensed, users may access these segments in any order and as frequently as desired.

Local/branch action required:

In order to receive a license to access the CAM system, you <u>must</u> submit a copy of the "DHS – CAM Serious Incident – DD User Training" certificate along with DHS form 784 and the CAM Supplemental Access form to <u>CAM.Support@dhsoha.state.or.us</u>
