JACKSON COUNTY, 10/16/18 – 10/17/18
Minutes

COUNTY INTROS/UPDATES:

- Josephine Co: New female beds
- Deschutes Co: Hiring; will be asking for assistance/feedback re: some policies they're working on.
- Linn Co: Hiring; new building.
- Marion Co: Moved into new building in August
- Clatsop Co: In recruitment background process, but still another position available
- Lane Co: Interviewed 17 people; in backgrounds.
- Clackamas Co: Filled 2 Supv positions; one internal and Chris Chandler w/Washington Co. 4 POs in background process. Expanded transition center; 2 POs @ residential/job readiness; adding 1 PO to SO unit.
- Washington Co: Started Veterans' Tx Court; down POs; interviewed 26, hoping to fill 3-4 spots. Wash Co is growing.
- Mult Co: a lot of changes with management
- Coos Co: new PO for SO cases.
- Douglas Co: Open wellness center for staff and clients; cog classes and special caseloads; staff fitness center. Darren and Nick's last meeting; new SO POs here tomorrow.
- Lincoln Co: hired new director and hiring new POs
- Polk Co: Hiring, in backgrounds

UPDATES:

- DOC (Jon Hansen): Deleted old SOSN DL; now only using the list-serve. Can request to be added/removed from the list.
- OACCD: Scheduling next S99R/Stable-Acute training; workgroup re: change language with new score definitions. Will Acute still be considered part of the total supervision level (incl. w/Stable?).
 - Also need to figure out how to input age at the time released from offense OR recognize years offense free in the community.
 - Not sure if this can be done in DOC400 or how long this might take to make the changes.
 - Proposal didn't include the new risk score levels of S99R, but no intention of changing the 3 supervision levels (L,M,H).
 - Jon Hansen Would not recommend writing anything for S99R/Stable in DOC400; in process to increase OMS for more tasks/modules from DOC400. However, multiple issues with culture, understanding and practices re: use of OMS vs DOC400 – varied throughout the state. Does recommend SOSN present as a united voice to request change vs only one or two counties speaking up.
 - This has been an ongoing discussion since at least July 2017; show of hands show only a few people recall previous discussions. Does make it difficult to move forward when inconsistent attendance and/or involvement.
 - Would be very beneficial to be receiving minutes from the meetings for those who can't make it or miss a meeting. Do we know what the roles are for the chairs/e-board

- Brent Taylor (Clackamas) - There is an expectation from OACCD that if you attend, you are to participate. Clackamas expects attendees to debrief with the team after each meeting.
- Jon Hansen - This would be a good opportunity to have a discussion about what the group wants SOSN to be and how to structure it.

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1. Propose updated charter for review and/or approval by OACCD
 - a. Outlined roles/responsibilities of 1st/2nd/3rd Chairs
 - b. Outlined expectations of members: Attend and participate in sub-committee of their choice. Sub-committees provide updates to Network.
 - c. Updated meeting timelines (Quarterly, 4th Tues/Weds of that month)
 - d. Agreed that Brent Taylor will take proposal to Malcolm re: getting support from OACCD for attendance and participation; designated liaison(s) who are committed to attend and participate.

 2. Discussed various ideas for Best Practices (BP) projects:
 - a. Tx issues
 - b. Containment model (poly/PO/Tx)
 - i. It all starts with risk assessments; IRR for Stable?
 - ii. Plan for more training – coaching, training, more resources
 - c. Before next meeting, discuss what group has reviewed
 - d. Made a list of topics to consider.
 - i. POs should be bringing issues and/or ideas

 3. Do we want S99R/Stable in OMS?
 - a. Created letter for proposal to OACCD to include S99R/Stable to OMS; edited version to be forwarded to Malcolm.
 - b. Recommend members create Google/Gmail account in order to share and review documents. (Use DOC as example – Jon Hansen; created SOSN Google Drive and sent link to try)

 4. Outline purpose of training sub-committee
 - a. Lack of training for some counties
 - i. SONL
 - ii. Demographic differences
 - b. SO Supervision “101” – how to get from A to B
 - i. Specific timelines and guidelines
 - ii. Understanding human sexuality
 - iii. Understanding SOTX

- c. Next steps – build a plan for the next quarterly meeting; each member has a designated task.

VOTE 3RD CHAIR

- Mark Waites (Josephine Co) – volunteered. Nominated and voted in favor.

ROUND TABLE:

- Deschutes Co: Questions about SONL for offenders who registered pre-2014, but have new crimes. – Who does new assessment?
 - Brenda to forward most recent OAR amendments to list-serve.
- Deschutes Co: They’ve also been doing IRR work with their team – finding some mistakes and has been good learning experiences.
 - Brent: SOSN trainings have included some mini-IRR sessions.
 - Jon: Oregon is good about making IRRs; volunteers for role plays, etc.
- Marion Co: – Any agencies have a policy/practice re: homeless sex offenders?
 - Heather - Their policy is to NOT have homeless SOs.
 - Paula – recommend that go to BP committee
 - Brooke – Should it be brought back to supervising based on risk, not homelessness?
 - Jon – Perhaps a presentation re: liability (Jeff Hanson)
- Jon – Maybe make a BP “hot list”
- Any info re: bench probation SONLs?
 - Washington Co: Reached out to Courts re: process.
 - Coos Co.: Courts on hold; doesn’t want to set precedence.
- Deschutes Co: What are other counties doing/how are they interpreting the Board’s enhanced computer conditions re: smart phones? Do others have a policy?
 - Use as incentive, but not initially given access.
 - Internet/computer-specific safety plans or user agreement.
 - Please sent to Deschutes Co.
- Polk Co: Are the SONL OARS/ORS in any other language?
 - Mult Co (Paula): Spanish versions – will send out
- Polk Co: What are other counties doing with offenders who deny their crime and are going to treatment?
 - It’s a treatment issue; no violations for denial or failing to pass polygraphs.
 - “Roll with Resistance” – give it time;
 - Specific issue and/or sexual history poly
 - No incentives – no safety plans or allowing contact, etc.
 - Some treatment providers will not take deniers in – OR – others keep them in Tx the entire time of supervision vs terminating as max benefit.
 - Have plugged offenders into various Cog classes
 - Author, Tim Buckley “The New Scarlet Letter”; collaboration with Marilyn Callahan; interested in presenting information on sexual abuse. (Handout)
