Red Lodge Transitional Services Honored for Outstanding Volunteer Impact

Red Lodge Transitional Services is a grassroots nonprofit organization committed to supporting Native men and women as they transition from incarceration or treatment back into their communities. Led by a team of dedicated volunteers with extensive experience working in correctional settings, Red Lodge focuses on restoring lives and strengthening connections beyond prison walls.

Trish Jordan, Executive Director of Red Lodge Transitional Services, has been partnering with the Oregon Department of Corrections (ODOC) and working directly with Adults in Custody (AICs) since November 2000. She holds active clearance (carded access) at eight of Oregon's 14 state correctional institutions and one jail. In recognition of her longstanding service, Ms. Jordan has twice received the DOC Volunteer of the Quarter Award at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility—in both 2011 and 2018.

Most recently, in May 2025, Red Lodge Transitional Services received the ODOC Statewide Outstanding Volunteer Award for its partnership and contributions to the Department's Religious Services Unit. The nomination highlighted the organization's deep and lasting influence:
