Location: Near the head of Wilson Creek in T. 9 S., R. 34 E.

Area: Two unpatented lode claims known as Dream Claim No. 1 and Dream Claim No. 2.

The development work on Dream Claim No. 1 consists of an open cut 3 feet wide and 8 feet long which exposes a white quartz vein striking ^{17°} a northwesterly direction and varying in width from 2 to 8 inches. The wall rock in the immediate vicinity of the vein appears to be a quartz ^{diorite} diorite. The majority of the country rock is argillite. 14 sacks of quartz, with minor amounts of ore ~~rock~~ have been sacked. These are claimed to contain high grade ore. From their appearance, they appear to be waste. Assays from the sacked ore ran Nil. Cut samples ran from Nil to \$.40 in gold.

AREA & LOCATION: The property consists of 3 unpatented placer claims, the Wilson #1, Wilson #2 and Golden Arrow located at the head of Wilson Creek in sec. 24 T 9 S R 38 E and sec. 19 T 9 S R 39 E W. M. These sections are in the Auburn District, Baker County.

HISTORY: Yardage not known. Old Placers quite extensive.

EQUIPMENT: Two small sluice boxes to handle gravel, about 2 yards per day, which is mined by pick and shovel.

GEOLOGY: Deposit consists of medium sized gravel in an earthy matrix and is resting on a moderately rough argillite bedrock which dips a few degrees to the N. E. There are a few large boulders and very little clay.

MISCELLANEOUS: The water for placering, between 30 and 50 gallons per minute is obtained from springs. These may be dry in the late summer.

The claims have been burnt over and there is no timber on the claims. There is considerable snow in winter.

Mr. Kulis is the only one working on the claims and is moving with pick and shovel about 2 yards per day. He has no definite plans for the future but intends to continue his present development work. The gravel he is working runs between \$1 and \$1.35 per yard.
