When I visited the "Mountainview" claims a week or so ago I took two samples, which have been assayed as follows:

2" of sulphide gouge from roof of tunnel, just beyond the north crosscut 300 feet from the mouth.

Gold \$13.65      Silver \$7.50

Ore picked from dump, in powder box in shed:

Gold \$9.45      Silver \$8.90

It was my impression of the property, however, that the pay streaks were rather narrow and discontinuous; that is, that there would be a large amount of dead work between pay, which would eat up any profits from them.
