10-Ton Shipment Returns \$85 a Ton

Ten tons of ore from the Forest Queen mine in the Cornucopia district to the smelter at Kellogg, Idaho, recently is reported to have netted the owner \$85 per ton. The ore was taken out while doing development work. It is estimated there are about 100 tons of ore on the dump of approximately the same grade.

The Forest Queen mine is on some of the same veins as the Cornucopia mines. The owner, E. A. Gray, of Missoula, Mont., has had a small force of miners doing development work the past three years. He is in the postal service at Missoula and spends his vacations at the mine directing the work.
