## AREA:

Panter Property (60 acres) and two claims--former  
 Pebble Co. and Cold Springs Property.

## HISTORY:

The present company is consolidation of the Pebble,  
 Cold Springs and Panter properties.

## PRODUCTION:

The company is new and there has been no production.

## EQUIPMENT:

Two giants having one and half inch and three inch  
 nozzels, one hydraulic lift, one 1 yard northwest  
 shovel, sluice box two feet by thirty feet long,  
 eight inch and twelve inch pipe.

## GEOLOGY:

Elevation 4600 feet. Moderately rugged topography.  
 Bedrock was not uncovered, but overlying material is  
 composed of unsorted gravel and boulders ranging  
 from a fraction of an inch to 6 or 7 feet. Ninety  
 per cent of the boulders are less than one foot in  
 diameter and 60 per cent are less than 6 inches in  
 diameter. No clay seams were observed and only the  
 top soil which is 3 to 5 feet in thickness would  
 soil Pine Creek. Fine gold is found in the top  
 soil with coarse gold in the gravel. The gold is  
 not confined to bedrock but is fairly evenly distributed  
 throughout the gravel. The wide gold distribution in the  
 gravel and the fact that the gravel is not sorted and  
 part of the boulders are not worn seems to indicate  
 that the old auriferous gravels are mixed with glacial  
 slide.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

There is ample timber and water for operation all the  
 year around. In winter the snow would interfere with  
 placering, although the road is kept open all year by  
 the Cornucopia Gold Mines.
