Is 20 miles northwest from its shipping point, Baker, Ore., on the Union Pacific and the Old Oregon Trail. Consists of one lode unpatented claim, recorded in Baker County. Located in a hilly area. Country rock is greenstone and porphyry with hanging walls of greenstone and porphyry footwalls; vein strata bearing east and west; width 40 feet, length 1500 feet. Mineral is gold also silver and copper; assays \$1-48. Developed with open cuts and a shaft 22 feet deep. Prospecting still being carried on. Water is scarce; timber close by; power about 3 miles. Claim is on the gold-copper zone and has good showings. Owner is Guss Schermer, Keating, Oregon (Prescott--6/1/37).

### KEATING DISTRICT:

Is 20 miles from its shipping point, which is Baker, Ore., on the Old Oregon Trail and Union Pacific. The mine was located about 1936, and consists of two unpatented lode claims, recorded in Baker county. Located in a hilly area; the country rock is greenstone and quartzite; hanging walls of greenstone and quartzite footwalls; vein strata bearing east and west; width 165 feet, length 1500 feet. Minerals are gold, silver and copper; assays at \$2. Water is scarce; timber about one mile; power about 3 miles from claim. Is developed by short tunnels and open cuts. Owner is Guss Schermer, Keating, Oregon. (Prescott---6/1/37)
