History

The Eagle Creek slope of the ridge here has been extensively placered as of a very early date. The water used came from the Hoagum ditch, but it appears that much of the ground above the ditch level was worked by impounded snow water which is regarded locally by some as an indication that the placers were rich.

Discussion

Joe Jeffers, at whose request the examination was made, found a 0.47¢ nugget in the area and recovered about the same amount from a pan. From his work he thinks he might have found the source of the placer gold. In addition to panning his work has consisted of cleaning out a few old post hole pits. In one he found what he regards as a vein which he reports panned coarse gold. This "vein" is neverly a soft zone in the Clover Creek greenstone as far as I can see and a sample from his pit assayed oz./ton gold. The sample from the spot which reportedly panned best assayed oz./ton gold.

At the time of the examination Jeffers telked of reconditioning an access ditch and getting permission from the farmers to use Hoagum ditch water during the early spring to placer off the area as a means of prospecting.
