Dear Mrs. Tschudy:

Your letter, addressed to the Commissioner of Mines at Salem, Oregon, was forwarded to us for reply.

We communicated with the Corporation Commissioner, who replied as follows:

"There was a corporation by the name OLIVE CREEK
PLACER MINES COMPANY which had its principal office at Sumpter,
Baker County, Oregon. It filed articles on November 21, 1901,
but it was dissolved by proclamation of the Governor on January 20, 1906, for failure to file its annual reports and to
pay its annual license fees. In fact, it never did file an
annual report, and we do not have the names of any of its
officers of directors. The incorporators were David L. Killen,
W. C. Calder and Floyd Dennis. Two of those names are similar
to those given in the letter received by you from Mrs. Tschudy
of Smyrna, Delaware, dated November 24th. It hardly seems
likely that after so long a time this stock would have any
value whatsoever."
