~~NAME:~~ Vincent Creek ~~Placers~~ El Dorado District Grant County

~~OWNERS:~~ Numerous claims and owners not known.

~~LOCATION:~~ *in the* SW quarter of Sec. 31, T 10 S, R 35 E.

~~AREA:~~ This gulch <sup>*being*</sup> was ~~plac~~er for a distance of about 7/10 of a mile.

~~HISTORY:~~ This <sup>*area*</sup> has been worked both many years ago and also quite recently. Production is not known.

~~EQUIPMENT:~~ *A 38* The only equipment used today is a hoist for large boulders, sometimes a small lava pipe and giant and sluice boxes. The common way to work this ground is by shovelling in.

~~GEOLOGY:~~ *N It* This is a gulch placer rarely over 75 ft. in width. The gravel averages 8 ft. in depth and varying from 5 to 15 ft. Boulders are usually less than 1 ft. in diameter but very numerous. Bedrock is green stone and banded chert. Gold is said to run as high as \$.75 a yard.

~~MISCELLANEOUS:~~ Water is sufficient for 3 months in the spring and for 1 month in the fall. Timber is abundant. It is about 4 miles to the Austin-Susanville Road.

~~REMARKS:~~ As far as could be seen most of the creek has been tested or placered at some time or other. There may be a few obscure unworked spots left.

~~WORK NEAR~~ <sup>*-small-*</sup> MOUTH OF VINCENT CREEK; ~~The wider, flat ground from 1/2 to 3/4 miles up from the mouth of Vincent Creek has been tested by large bulldozer pits.~~
