Dear Mr. Bartell:

We thank you for your letter of March 2nd.

We regret that we do not have, at this time, a sufficient quantity of asbestos sample to send you the ten pounds requested.

We enclose a very small sample of amphibole fiber in a separate envelope with this letter, and have mailed you separately a small sample of chrysotile imbedded with quartz. These will give you a slight idea of the mineral.

We also enclose a copy of the geologist's report which should be read with the thought in mind that it was written by a Viennese.

Quantity is something that would have to be determined by proper exploration.

Mr. Mett, of Powhattan Mining Company, Baltimore, has been on the ground twice, and as a result we have his written offer, made before the war, of \$225.00 a ton mine run F.O.B. Durkee.

The travertine is Prescott's. He is familiar with the exact location of the asbestos deposit and could show it to you if you were in his vicinity.

We will be interested in hearing from you further, and again thank you.
