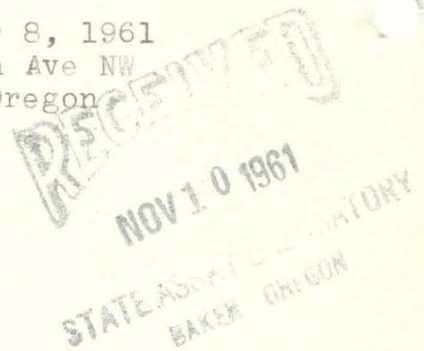

Dear Mr. Brooks:

I have received and worked over the fossil wood from the stump. Thanks for the pictures.

In this last box of wood you sent there were two species of wood. I judge that the most plentiful was from the stump in the picture. This one I believe is a Pine.

The other species is also a conifer but one without resin ducts. Since the structure of the pieces was not good enough I cannot tell you what kind. It is a type like Sequoia, Abies, Tsuga, etc.

If it is convenient for you, and of enough interest to you, perhaps you could get samples of the other two stumps. Please be certain to keep them separate. In this way we can tell if they are all the same or not.

Do you know a Mr. R.A. McCullough from Post? He has sent in inquires about wood, Cycad and Osmundities and I wonder if he is a commercial dealer, a hobby pebble polisher or what.

I hope that this has been of some use to you.
